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MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

Dear Neighbors:

Although it seemed as if spring would never arrive, the nice weather is finally here. As we are in the midst of graduation season, I would like to extend my congratulations to all of the graduates at all levels of education in town. From kindergartners to college grads, you all make your hometown proud. Many thanks to all of the parents of our graduates as we know how hard you work for your children. Best of luck to all!

We have some exciting town events approaching. Many may have noticed our Farmer's Market is back in full swing on Sunday mornings at 10 a.m. The Farmer's Market is growing every week with added vendors and an increase in resident attendance. Please continue to support this great addition to our town. This endeavor takes a lot of coordination so I would like to thank everyone who works so hard to make it possible every week. I take the opportunity to attend as often as I can walking throughout the Market talking to our residents; please feel free to say hello and introduce yourself when you see me!

Many residents took the opportunity to attend the very successful Murder Mystery Dinner Theatre. A great time was had by all. The Neighbors' Night Out Committee is hard at work

at planning the Dancing Under the Stars event, a Block Party on Station Avenue, scheduled for June 21st. This promises to be a terrific evening of entertainment. Tickets are just \$10 and can be purchased at the Library. Proceeds from Neighbor's Night Out events are directly invested in our town, such as the maintenance of our Memorial Clock, holiday decorations and other improvements to our street-scapes.

The Fourth of July Parade is a hometown favorite event. Our volunteers are working to ensure that this year's Parade is the best yet. Post Parade activities are also being coordinated. See events included in this edition of the HEIGHTS REPORT (Page 6-7). I hope to see you all there!

Your government has been hard at work for many months on the huge task of completing our 2014 municipal budget. The budget is a difficult undertaking every year; this process has only been getting more and more difficult as costs that are beyond our control i.e. health insurance premiums, etc., and other sources of revenue get tighter and tighter. Please know that it is always hard to ask for any additional tax dollars from our residents, but I am pleased to report that we have been able to minimize the rate increase this year to approximately 1.99%, which

is under the state-imposed cap. We intend to return value to you with this increase by investing in our town.

This year's capital budget includes investments in items that we need to make our town the great place that it is. Unfortunately, maintenance issues that have been deferred in the past need to be addressed. It is our responsibility to ensure that we invest in our town's departmental equipment and infrastructure. Specifically, we are investing in road resurfacing and reconstruction, storm water drainage improvements and sewer pump station maintenance. Some of these things are not "seen" by residents but are absolutely critical, benefitting everyone in the community. We are also investing in items our Police Department requires and Public Works equipment that is necessary in order to maintain public safety and the highest levels of public service. We have gone through the budget, line by line, item by line item to make sure that every dollar is spent as prudently as possible. I can assure you that you are getting good value from our municipal expenditures. I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Councilman Earl R. Miller, Jr. for taking on the arduous task of preparing this year's budget. This was a challenging endeavor to take on in Councilman Miller's first year on Council.



Finally, if you have been by the Glover Mill site recently, you can see that construction is underway on this exciting new project that will deliver new homes and new tax ratables to our community. I would like to thank everyone who made this possible. We should soon start seeing homes rising from the site.

FROM THE TAX OFFICE...

New tax bills will be sent out at the end of June. Our annual tax sale will be held on Monday July 7th at 10:00 am for all unpaid 2013 taxes and CCMUA charges. In order to avoid publication, all payments must be in our office no later than 5:00pm on Friday June 6th in the form of cash or bank check. If your property goes to tax sale, it means a lien is placed on the property. The lien holder has to wait two years before they can foreclose on the property. It is in your best interest to pay before the tax sale. If you have any questions, please contact the tax office at 547-7164.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

A few reminders about overnight parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications are available at the Police Department located at 625 Station Avenue.
- 2014 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2014.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.

St Rose Girls' Team Wins at Penn Relays

The Penn Relays, starting in 1895, are an institution in this area and in the world. Runners come from all over to compete in this 3 day "carnival". Swiftly starting races approximately every 5 minutes, the event is a site to see. This year there was more than 22,000 entries and the three-day attendance is likely to top 110,000 for the third year in a row. Saturday attendance has averaged 48,000 for the last six years, and makes the meet the best attended track event in the United States each year, and one of the best attended in the world.

Through 116 editions of the meet, more athletes have run at the Penn Relays than at any single meet in the world. More spectators have watched the meet than any in the world except the Olympics and World Championships. And the Penn Relay Carnival remains the same whirlwind of activity that has always excited fans young and old.

St. Rose teams have been competing at the Penn Relays since 1993, having boys, girls or both teams qualifying since the Camden Diocese was permitted to compete in 1992. For St. Rose, the boys' teams have won 7 times and with this year's victory, the girls' teams have won 7 times totaling 14 Penn Relay wins. In 2003, 2009 and 2011, both the boys and girls teams won.

This year's girls' team consisting of Katherine Soanes, Ava Bartholomew, Julia Bruno and Kathryn Parkinson with alternates Mary Kate Donnelly, Julia Cavallaro and Jessica MacAulay worked continuously on their handoffs at practices from when they

qualified on March 30 until the Penn Relays on April 25, 2014 and their hard work paid off for them. They won the Camden Diocese 4 x 100 meters Relay event on April 25, 2014 with a time of 56.48.

Also, the St. Rose girls' team from 2005 of Kelsey Damato, Gia Fiordaliso, Samantha Livecchi and Megan Sokolowski have the Camden Diocese Penn Relays Record of 54.13

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
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

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
