Christopher Walter, Library Director, comments that





office in the recent election but were not successful; we appreciate your willingness to dedicate your time and energy to your community.



ZONING: SIGNS

Borough Code 450-135

There appears to be an increasing number of illegal signs being placed on borough property within the residential zones.

Below is a portion of the Haddon Heights ordinance for signage. For a complete copy of the ordinance, go to the Borough web site at www.haddonhts.com. Click on Borough Code.

Signs may be located on a lot so that they shall not be in or within the public right-of-way nor interfere with sight distances at street intersections or ingress or egress points to a lot, development or subdivision.

All principal buildings in all districts shall be clearly identified as to house number and street number and shall be clearly visible and legible from the main and abutting street.[2]

Signs of mechanics and artisans are permitted, but such signs shall be erected only on the premises where such persons are working and only during the period of time that such persons are performing work on the premises. The area on one side of any such sign shall not exceed six square feet.

Residential districts.

(1) The following types of signs and no others shall be permitted in residential districts:

(a) Official highway route number signs, street name signs, direction signs and other official traffic signs.

(b) Signs advertising the sale or rental of premises, and signs bearing the word "sold" or

the word "rented" with the name and address of the persons effecting the sale or rental, provided that such signs may be erected only on the premises to which they relate and that the area on one side of any such sign shall not exceed nine square feet. Signs bearing the word "sold" or the word "rented" shall be removed within 30 days after being posted on the premises involved.

(c) Signs of schools, churches or other similar institutions, provided that the area of one side on any such sign shall not exceed 12 square feet and that not more than one such sign shall be placed on any lot or in contiguous lots owned by the same institution.

(d) Signs designating entrances or exits to or from parking areas for institutional or public uses, limited to one sign with a maximum area of two square feet for each such exit or entrance.

(e) Any sign erected by the Borough, county, state or federal government.

(f) Signs used for the protection of the public during construction or repairs.

(2) Illuminated facade signs are prohibited.

Political signs must be removed within five days of any election and are not to be placed on Borough property.

[Added 12-21-2004 by Ord. No. 1184]

Note: Borough property includes the right-of-way between the curb and the sidewalk.



Recent Scam... Please Be Aware

PSE&G Warns Customers About Nationwide Payment Scam

We have had two recent reports of on-going scams related to PSE&G payments. Business Owners have reported receiving phone calls from a person(s) portraying themselves as a PSE&G bill collection agent. They advise you of an outstanding balance, and if you don't pay your bill your electric will get turned off. Of course the owners are concerned that they will lose business. The "fraudster" will then ask the customer to purchase green dot payment cards, load them with money, then send an electronic transfer to the PSE&G collection center when the fraudster transfers the funds to a prepaid card and cashes it in at an ATM. Out of concern two businesses paid these fraudulent bills losing thousand of dollars.

Never respond to questionable solicitations by the phone number or website provided by the suspicious solicitor. The fraudsters will give you what appears to be a legitimate phone number or website so that you can contact them. Be especially cautious of website links. We have been told that PSE&G fraud has what appears to be a real looking PSE&G website, when you click on the fraudulent link, they also have what sounds to be a legitimate bill collection center when you call the phone number they provide.

Keep in mind PSE&G will not call you for bill payment. Nor will they send emails or try to connect with you through social networking sites for bill payments.

When in doubt, Haddon Heights residents or business owners should call the police at (856) 547-2222.

Old Bank Gets New Paint Job

Along White Horse Pike's Historic District

In 1986, the Haddon Heights Planning Board rejected Crestmont Bank's proposal to raze two turn-of-the-century houses and build a one and a half story Cape Cod style stucco bank. The bank claimed people would not put their money in wooden structures. The two houses were part of the borough's local White Horse Pike Historic District, the "grand avenue" of the Borough representing the 30-year period when the Borough was developed as a planned town. Fifty residents attended the meeting to object to the bank's proposal, as did the Historic Preservation Commission. Following



the rejection, Crestmont decided "in keeping with the historic tradition of Haddon Heights," to use the two American Foursquare houses, joining them with a passageway and celebrating their historic character. Crestmont was later bought by Jefferson Bank, which was bought by Commerce Bank, which in turn was bought by TD Bank, which closed the bank. Recently the property was sold and the original clapboard exterior and windows were painted. Nowadays banks come and go, but our architectural heritage has remained for the past 100 years and is now listed on the State and National Register of Historic Places. It's the one mile gem on the 60 mile White Horse Pike.



Glover Fulling Mill Park

In 2013 the Borough of Haddon Heights received a \$50,000 Historic Site Management Grant from New Jersey Historic Trust to create Glover Fulling Mill Park, an archaeological site and one acre park that will lie at the end of Fulling Mill Road in the new Glover Mill Village, a 27-home development by Bob Meyer Communities. This is part of the former Department of Public Works Plant and runs to Sylvan Drive.

As you can see, the earthmovers are busy laying the infrastructure for this new development and Bob Meyer has opened an office at 200 White Horse Pike. Work on the grant has also commenced. The Glover Fulling Mill site is listed on the New Jersey and National Register of Historic Places. Glover Fulling Mill was built in 1775 on King's Run, the south branch of Newton Creek off the Delaware River. The mill was owned and operated by the Glover Family for nearly a century. After the mill was abandoned, the masonry building was allowed to decay. Early in the 20th century the structure was no longer standing, and an eight acre portion of the Glover property was purchased by the Borough. There was no disturbance to the structural remains of the mill during the Borough's stewardship.

A cul de sac will end at the one acre Glover Fulling Mill Park which will contain the mill remains, signage, park benches and a walking path to Sylvan Drive. It will be a passive park - no playground equipment, picnic tables or bathroom facilities are planned as they are provided a block away in the existing County Park. Below is just a sample of one of the design suggestions for the actual mill remains by landscape architects, Menke & Menke. Their work will also include identifying native and invasive trees and plants. Much of the grant work will be done in the Spring, 2015.



The Delaware & Susquehanna Model Railroad Club has been recently working to restore a side door on the historic Philadelphia and Atlantic City Railroad Passenger Station in Haddon Heights, so the station now looks as it did sometime after 1910 on this side. Haddon Heights Field Hockey Club 10 Seasons Strong!

In 2005, Shannon Parkinson had a vision...a vision for a field hockey recreational program for girls in grades 3-8 in the town of Haddon Heights. She asked two friends and fellow field hockey players, Wendy VanFossen and Jackie Valvardi, to join her in making this vision come to fruition. The three worked hard applying for grants and asking local organizations for donations, and in the fall of 2005 the first season started with 58 girls wanting to learn to the sport of field hockey.

With each year, the program grew and the interest in field hockey blossomed. A summer camp was added to our program to improve the skills of field hockey players. Each summer we offer this camp and it has fully impacted the level of play during the regular season as the girls have at least 8 weeks of skill building sessions. Another benefit of our camp is that we have high school players who volunteer and share in the love of the sport by assisting at our camp and they serve as mentors for our younger girls.

In 2010, only five short years after we started this program, we were extremely excited to be able to offer our first scholarship. Each year since, we have been able to offer at least one and sometimes two scholarships, to colleg-bound seniors who have played and/or volunteered in our program.

It is interesting to reflect that our program has impacted many area high school field hockey programs. Our first group of 3rd graders who started in 2005 will be graduating from

area high schools in June. Haddon Heights High School, Audubon High School, Paul VI High School, Camden Catholic and Bishop Eustace have all had players who started with us and then played in their high school field hockey programs. It's a great accomplishment and we're proud to have been a part of their success.

Flash forward to 2014 and we have just completed our 10th season of recreational field hockey! We've been able to expand our program to include: a travel team, an indoor league, an indoor recreational clinic, a women's team and we continue to explore possibilities to play other recreation programs in the surrounding areas. It may not seem like a big accomplishment to others, but to those involved, it's a HUGE accomplishment! Ten years may not seem long but starting with 1 person's vision, 3 people's hard work for numerous years and now a current working board of 9 members and over 100 girls playing the sport of field hockey, we are beyond proud, beyond excited, beyond thrilled to be playing hockey and keeping the love of this sport alive in our youth. We're 10 years strong...and growing!

Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays from the Haddon Heights Fire Department. The holiday season is fast approaching and that means Santa is coming town. We're proud to announce that once again we will be escorting Santa through Haddon Heights again. Mark your calendars for December 20th at around 5 PM.

One of the other great traditions of the holiday season is decorating our houses. The fire service responds to an average of 210 structure fire calls annually that are caused by Christmas trees. When picking a tree make sure you are picking a tree with fresh green needles that do not fall off when touched. And when putting up your tree be sure to cut a few inches off the bottom of the trunk. This will allow the tree to hydrate and stay fresher longer. Just remember to check your tree daily for water, you would be surprised how much that tree will drink up! Make sure the tree is placed at least 3 feet from any heat source, like fireplaces, candles, radiators, portable heaters and heat vents. Don't block any exits with the tree and use lights that are designated for indoor use. Make sure that they are in good working order, with no torn or broken cords, and always makes sure to turn the lights off before leaving home or going to bed. If you choose an artificial one, check to see if it certified and labeled by the manufacturer as fire retardant. These steps will ensure that everyone has a safe and happy holiday season.

The Shofar is a Jewish instrument most often made from the horn of a sheep or a goat. It makes a trumpet like sound and was generally used to announce the start of holidays, in processions and even to mark the beginning of wars.

Following the blowing of the Shofar, tenor Matthew will lead the choir procession in the role of John the Baptist signing, "Prepare Ye The Way of The Lord" from the musical Godspell.

As has become tradition at St. Mary's, the children of the Sunday school will make "flameless Advent wreaths" during their Sunday school lesson. They will take these wreaths home along, with an Advent service booklet that their families can use each week to mark the progression of the Advent season with prayers and Bible readings.

The culmination of weeks of preparation will be joyfully celebrated on Christmas Eve at St. Mary's with a time honored traditional Festival Eucharist. The service will begin at 7 pm with an extended prelude including excerpts from Christmas Oratorios by Bach and Saint-Saens along with many familiar seasonal selections.

Children will be invited to process with the choir carrying figurines of the nativity to the creche. This will be a family service in which those of every generation will have the opportunity to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Father William Noble, Priest In Charge, will be offering a homily geared to the children and their understanding of the events which took place on that Christmas Eve so long ago.

Following the Eucharist, the service will end with the choir and congregation singing Silent Night by candlelight.
