## MAYOR'S MESSAGE:

Dear Neighbors:

We are just coming off of another very successful Neighbors' Night Out Committee event – the famous Spaghetti Dinner on "Via Stazione." We couldn't have asked for a nicer day and the turnout was huge! The funds raised from all Neighbor's Night Out events go toward beautification and improvement projects around town. We could not do these events without the dedicated volunteers who serve on this committee. You may have noticed the new Welcome to Haddon Heights signs at the corner of Station Avenue and the White Horse Pike. These signs were provided to the town through the hard work of our Neighbors' Night Out Committee. Great job!



This summer brought some improvements in infrastructure to town. While some may have caused some inconvenience, the long term results will prove beneficial for the town. For example, we recently completed work on the resurfacing of a large portion of West High Street, which was one of our older, rougher streets. Another project related to infrastructure is the elimination of the Kings Highway pump station; this will result in improvements to the sewer system. Sometimes these improvements are hard to spot, but rest assured they are all carefully planned to keep everything in our town in good working order.

Fall brings many exciting activities and events to our town. Our kids are back to school and participating in after school activities and sports. Please be sure to be alert and drive carefully. We take the safety of everyone – particularly our kids – extremely seriously. If something doesn't seem right from a safety perspective, please don't hesitate to contact our Police Department for

You may have also read about an increasingly recurring problem in our town and many others – abandoned properties. Unfortunately, there are times when a property goes into foreclosure, no one takes care to ensure that the property is maintained. This is an unacceptable as it leads to a whole host of problems for the town but more specifically, the neighbors of these vacant properties. Please know that both the State and your governing body have been looking closely at how these properties can be handled. While it is inevitable that we will occasionally have abandoned properties, there is no excuse for them not to be maintained. We will continue to attack this problem. We urge residents to report abandoned, vacant or properties that appear in disrepair to call our Code Enforcement Office at 546-2580.



Finally, I'd like to congratulate longtime resident Patti Sheehy on the publication of 'Stalked,' the sequel to her award winning novel, 'The Boy Who Said No.' Well done! Please stop by our Library for more information about these terrific books.

## FROM THE TAX OFFICE...

The Fourth Quarter taxes are due by 11/01/14. There is a ten-day grace period. This makes the last day to pay without penalty Monday, November 10th prior to 5:00 pm.

Don't forget, if you use the drop box and are paying on the last day, your payment must be dropped off before 5:00 pm. All payments dropped off after 5pm, will not be posted until the following day. Additionally, the tax office is not authorized to hold checks, so please do not forward date your checks. Thank you.

## SHARED COURT SERVICES

### Starting September 1st

The Haddon Heights Mayor & Council have reviewed and approved the start of shared court services with Barrington, Mt. Ephraim and Oaklyn. This alliance should help municipal spending and cutting costs. As of September 1st, 2014 court will no longer be held in Haddon Heights. ## LEAF PICK-UP

Fall is just around the corner. As the leaves start changing that means they will soon start falling. Leaf collection will begin on October 15th and run until December 15th. During November and December signs will be posted on your street advising when leaf collection will occur in your area.

### Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms.
- Please DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet.
- Please DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your

Storm water is water that is generated when precipitation from rain and snow melt. It flows over land or impervious surfaces such as paved roads and parking lots and does not seep into the ground. This run off transports pollutants such as trash, grass, and other things which gather on these surfaces. The water and debris make their way to inlets and then flooding will occur.

As a resident, business, or other member of the Haddon Heights community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

- Properly use and dispose of any hazardous products (there are hazardous waste recycling days that are normally set up each year, please contact the Public Works Department for a

- Keep pollution out of storm drains (do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a storm water system)
- Clean up after your pet. (Pet waste pollutes our waters when left on the ground, animal waste contains high concentration of nutrients as well as bacteria and disease-causing microorganisms that can cause problems)

- Don't litter
- Dispose of yard waste properly
- Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides



## Haddon Knolls Apartments on the White Horse Pike



The Warrington home was built where Haddon Knoll Apartments are today. It was designed by Mr. Warrington himself and his family lived in the property for many years. His son Marshall was born in 1914 and daughter Marguerite in 1918. His widow eventually sold the property for demolition so that the Haddon Knoll Apartments could be built. In an interview with Marshall Warrington in 2009, he stated that his mother hated the house: the rooms were small, the house was cold and drafty and it wasn't well designed! Mrs. Warrington was promised an apartment at Haddon Knoll; she lived out her life there. Mr. Warrington is 100 years old now and lives in Southampton, N.J.

Haddon Knolls has recently completed an extensive renovation project with new roofing and Colonial Revival porch entries. Although the apartments are not yet listed as "contributing" to the White Horse Pike Historic District on the State and National Register because they were built in the 1950's, the new owners worked with the Preservation Commission on this project. Haddon Knoll has contributed for many years to the ambiance of the Pike in Haddon Heights. Notice the fine improvements the next time you ride by!



## FIRE DEPARTMENT

The changing of the leaves means that summer has wound down, and fall is upon us. We hope you had a great summer. The beginning of fall in the fire service also means that Fire Prevention week (October 5th-11th) is right around the corner. The theme this year is **"Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives! Test yours monthly!"** Roughly 2 in 3 fire deaths happen in homes with no working smoke detectors. Our fire prevention office has smoke detectors available to residents at no charge, and the HHFD also has the following tips to help you maximize your smoke detectors.

1. Install smoke alarms adjacent to each bedroom and sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home, including your basement
2. Test your alarms monthly
3. Replace all smoke alarms over 10 years old.
4. A smoke detector should be on your ceiling or high on a wall. Keep your smoke detector at least 10 feet away from your stove to reduce false activations.


