

Annual National Night Out - Tuesday, August 6th

The Borough of Haddon Heights will again participate in the 29th Annual National Night Out on Tuesday evening, August 7, Councilwoman Rose Fitzgerald and Chief Richard Kinkler announced. National Night Out is sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch to increase neighborhood unity, awareness, safety and police-community partnerships. National Night Out 2012 involved 37 million people in 15,449 communities from all 50 states and U.S. territories.

National Night Out is designed to: (1) Heighten crime prevention awareness; (2) Generate support for local anticrime programs; (3) Strengthen neighborhood spirit; and (4) Send a message to criminals letting them know that neighbors are watching. Residents are encouraged to plan porch parties, block parties, cookouts, ice cream socials, watermelon parties, lemonade stands, flashlight walks and stargazing events in honor of National Night Out.

Mrs. Fitzgerald noted that Haddon Heights is one of only 20 Classic Towns of Greater Philadelphia because of its small town feel. National Night Out would be a good time for neighbors to touch base with one other so that they are aware of a neighbors who might be away vacationing and ascertain beforehand what provisions are being made for the lawn care and security of the house. Chief Kinkler urges residents not to hesitate reporting any suspicious activity which might lead to vandalism immediately to the Police Department.

Three New Bus Shelters in Haddon Heights

When I was growing up in Runnemede in the 1950's, children were taken by bus on shopping trips to Philadelphia and Camden. I'm sure it was the same in Heights. Some children in St. Teresa's, in grades one to four, took the Public Service from Bellmawr - alone with little coupon books! Back then, most children were able to go into the cities alone by age 12 and the Friday evening bus to Korvette Shopping Center without your parents was a rite of passage.

New Jersey Transit Corporation has provided for the purchase and installation of three additional bus shelters in Heights to promote energy conservation, traffic safety, and for the public convenience. New shelters are located on Kings Highway at the White Horse Pike, on the WHP in front of TD Bank and on the Black Horse Pike at Prospect Ridge. Haddon Heights is served by Routes 400, 403, 455 and 457, along both Pikes and Kings Highway. More than replacement windows, energy efficient appliances and a Prius, reducing your driving by walking, biking and taking public transportation is the "GREENEST" THING YOU CAN DO!

Why not take your children on a ride this summer to Haddonfield, Voorhees Town Center, Atlantic City or the many other places that NJ Transit travels - see njtransit.com. If you are a senior, I challenge you to become reacquainted with New Jersey Transit. Teach your children and grandchildren how to ride the bus and your teenagers how to get places on their own. It's the green was to go and Haddon Heights already has the bus service to do it! Bus schedules are also available at the Library.

Shade Tree Commission - Now Taking Requests for FREE Trees

The Shade Tree Commission welcomes requests for free trees. All residents of Haddon Heights interested in having a shade tree planted curbside in front of (or alongside) their property should contact either Michelle Fareri or Marian Hauser of the Public Works Department at 547-7164 weekdays between 9:00 and 4:00. Requests for fall plantings will be taken through September 21.

Tree requests are subject to site clearance by Public Works and are met on a first-come, first-serve basis. Since trees are currently planted in both spring and fall, requests usually can be filled within six months. Also, the Shade Tree Commission is looking for new recruits. If you have an interest in joining a group dedicated to maintaining the leafy character of Haddon Heights, please contact Tom Cella, Director of Public Works (546-2580), Fred Missimer, Shade Tree Commission chairman (546-0873), or Steve Dorsey, borough arborist (546-4867).



Monthly meetings take place in the spring and fall.

Finally, please help the commission with its new plantings by watering the newly planted shade trees during dry spells, which can occur any time of year. This simple act often makes the difference between life and death for young trees. Also, please take care that lawnmowers or weed-whackers do not nick the bark of young trees. Such damage to the bark can result in girdling, which kills young trees.
