FROM THE TAX OFFICE...

The annual post tax statement and income verification forms were mailed in January to residents who are already receiving senior, disabled, or surviving spouse deductions. If you received one of these forms and would like to keep your deduction, please complete both forms and return to the Tax Office prior to March 1st. The state requires confirmation of income eligibility annually.

The senior citizen deduction is based on age, residency, and income. If you think you may qualify, applications are available at the Borough Hall and may be picked up during regular business hours. If you have any questions, call the tax collector or assessor's office at 547-7164 ext 30 or 33.

The first quarter taxes are due on February 1st with a ten day grace period. This year, since the 1st falls on a Saturday, the taxes are due on Monday, February 3rd. If you are mailing a check to pay your taxes, please be certain that you are paying the amount for the correct quarter. If you would like a receipt, please send the entire tax bill with your check and include a self-addressed, stamped envelope. Your bill will be receipted and mailed back to you. If you do not desire a receipt, then just mail the property stub and check, or place it in the drop box located in front of the Municipal building.

Tax Collection rate for 2013 was 98.56%!

OVERNIGHT PARKING

A few reminders about overnight parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications are available at the Police Department located at 625 Station Avenue.
- 2014 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2014.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.


DOG & CAT LICENSES

Renewal forms for the cat and dog licenses have been mailed and are now due. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. After May 1, 2013, a late fee of \$10.00 will be assessed. Please note that in order to obtain a license & tag you must provide the Borough with the Rabies vaccination information from your veterinarian.

FREE RABIES CLINIC

The Haddon Heights Local Board of Health and Camden County Board of Health are offering a free rabies clinic to be held on **Saturday April 26th, 8:30am – 9:30am.**

Clinic will be held at the Haddon Heights Fire Department located behind the library at 608 Station Avenue, Haddon Heights. Out of town residents are invited to bring their pets for vaccination. Licenses are required for Haddon Heights dogs and cats and will be available. Cost for the licenses are: \$9.00 for a spayed/neutered cat or dog and \$12.00 for non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog.



WHAT TO DO DURING A SNOW STORM

The Haddon Heights Public Works Department will work hard to make driving safer in snowy weather. Depending on the duration and the amount of snowfall, borough trucks may plow your streets several times. As the snow rolls off our plows, it sometimes accumulates in driveway aprons. Please understand that this is unavoidable and it is the homeowner's responsibility to clear it. Here are some helpful hints to make snow removal less frustrating:

- Vehicles may not park on any borough streets during a snow storm and should stay off the streets until the snow ends and the streets are clear.
- If possible, wait until the plows make at least three passes on your street before cleaning your driveway.
- It is a violation of borough ordinance shovel and or blow snow into the street.
- Shovel the snow to the right side of the driveway (facing the street) to minimize the snow entering your driveway.
- To ensure the safety of pedestrians, residents must remove snow from the sidewalks following a snowfall.

PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCIES

When it is snowing between the hours of midnight and 5:00 am ALL motorist are not allowed to park their vehicles on Borough streets. Additionally, Whenever there is a "Snow Emergency" declared by the Borough or a State of Emergency declared regardless of the time of day we will strictly enforce no parking regulations.

There are several reasons for this strict enforcement, they are:

- to reduce motor vehicle accidents
- to keep the road clear for emergency vehicles and key personnel
- to keep the roads open for snow plows, allowing them to clear the road in a timely manner and to do a better job.





The Vagabonds Jr Drum & Bugle Corps is planning a reunion of former on May 10, 2014 in Haddon Heights.



in 1961. During those premier years from 1961 through 1964, the Vagabonds defeated every junior drum and bugle corps in New Jersey except for the Blessed Sacrament Golden Knights of Newark, NJ. The Vagabonds were one of over 30 junior drum and bugle corps competing in eastern PA and NJ during the 1950's and 1960's.



The S.J Vagabonds Alumni Corps was formed in 2000 and continues to perform in parades throughout South Jersey.


In 2013 we introduced approximately \$65,000.00 in renovations including a scoreboard on the Memorial Field, ten (10) brand new dugouts and various fencing upgrades.

The 2014 season will be an exciting time for HHYA as we introduce approximately \$130,000.00 in renovations including the removal of approximately thirteen (13) dead trees and substantial renovations to the Majors and Minors Fields. The Majors field has a new infield, fresh sod, new pitching warm up areas and has been renovated to accommodate the traditional 46 / 60 Little League dimensions and the 50 / 70 intermediate level dimensions.

The explanation is as follows: The 46 / 60 field has a distance of 46' from the pitching rubber to home plate and 60' between the bases. The 50 / 70 field has a distance of 50' from the pitching rubber to home plate and 70' between the bases. The 50 / 70 rules introduce true baseball rules that create a more challenging environment. For more information on the 50 / 70 rules, visit www.littleleague.org.

The Minors Field has a new infield, fresh sod and new pitching warm up areas as well. Both fields have special material installed under the batter's boxes and pitching mounds to prevent the gullies that form from excessive use.

In addition to the new infields, our Majors field will now have state of the art lights for night games. HHYA also plans to upgrade field equipment and use the most effective dirt mixes to ensure all of our Baseball and Softball



fields are maintained and groomed in the finest quality.

The HHYA Board has introduced some new ideas for the 2014 season and below are just a sample:

1. Increased game schedule
2. 50 / 70 Majors Games – (Mid-Season)
3. Night Games
4. Travel Games with local towns
5. Hosting Tournaments

17th ANNUAL GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT

Counting birds is fun, free, family-friendly way to discover and help the birds in your community

Begun in 1998, the Great Backyard Bird Count was the first citizen-science program to collect and display real-time data on bird sightings online. Today, the Great Backyard Bird Count is one of the most popular annual events among bird watchers, with more than 100,000 checklists and more than 17 million birds reported from around the United States and Canada during the four-day period in February. As of 2013, the GBBC became a global project when it was integrated with the eBird online checklist program. As the data pour in and display on charts and graphs, web visitors can explore results from around the world. The Great Backyard Bird Count is a joint project of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society with Canadian partner Bird Studies Canada.



**THE 2014 GBBC TAKES PLACE
FEBRUARY 14 THROUGH FEBRUARY 17
IT'S AS EASY AS 1, 2, 3!**

1. Create a GBBC account. This applies to those who have never participated in the GBBC before or those who did not participate in 2013 when GBBC was integrated with eBird--a worldwide bird data collection program used for keeping track of your personal bird records and bird lists. You will be able to access all your observations under a single account. If you're already registered with eBird or another Cornell Lab citizen-science project, you can use the same login information.
 2. Count birds for at least 15 minutes on one or more days of the GBBC. You can count for longer than that if you wish! Count birds in as many places and on as many days as you like—one day, two days, or all four days. Submit a separate checklist for each new day, for each new location, or for the same location if you counted at a different time of day. Estimate the number of individuals of each species you saw during your count period.
 3. Enter your results on the GBBC website by clicking "Submit Your Bird Checklist" on the home page. See our downloadable instructions below for additional details on entering your checklists. If you already use eBird, please continue using eBird to submit your sightings but be sure to enter at least one checklist during the GBBC weekend!
- Join eBird Like the GBBC, eBird is an online database program – except with eBird, the counting keeps going. And eBird lets you and your family keep detailed lists of your own sightings, create an individualized menu of your favorite birding spots, and much more.


