Note from your Haddon Heights' Tax Assessor

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights.

Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department. The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.

Kids Can Cook is a program designed to teach kids, ages 5-12 about making healthy food choices. The children learn how to create nutritional snacks, meals and desserts using seasonal, fresh, local fruits and vegetables as well as alternatives to popular favorites. Skills taught in this class include: kitchen safety (using knives properly for slicing and dicing), using tools such as a spiralizer, bullet/blender/

food processor and even a sushi mat for rolling out sushi. They also learn how to measure and follow a recipe. Upon completion of the course the kids will receive a recipe book of all recipes prepared and a Junior Chefs Award/Certificate. During the Summer the borough provides a "Kids Can Cook Camp" where children attend 4 consecutive days in a week,

while during the Fall/Winter/Spring programs we offer an after school program that runs once a week for 4 consecutive weeks.

In a society where fast and convenient spill into our mainstream food industry, my goal is to expose the kids to discovering that whole foods can be delicious and easy to prepare. This, I hope, will encourage more hands-on family cooking at home.

BORO BITS

Overnight Parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications and renewal applications for 2016 permits must be received by Friday December 18th.
- 2016 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2016.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.

Zoning and Code Enforcement

SIGNS - All homeowners should be aware that leaving contractor's signs on your lawn after a project is completed is a violation of the Borough's sign code. Please ask your contractor to remove their sign when the job is completed. **This includes landscapers that like to leave their signs up for the entire season.**

450-135 (I.) Signs of mechanics and artisans are permitted, but such signs shall be erected only on the premises where such persons are working and only during the period of time that such persons are performing work on the premises. The area on one side of any such sign shall not exceed six square feet.

BRUSH / LEAVES - Brush pickup is every other week as designated by the Borough calendar. Leaf pickup will not begin until November. Until then, leaves must be placed in bags or open containers and put out for scheduled brush collection.

When doing yard cleanup, please note when brush collection is scheduled to avoid placing leaves and brush at the curb the weekend following your pickup. It is prohibited to place leaves, brush, and trash cans in the street.

Department of Public Works

Fall is just around the corner. As the leaves start changing that means they will soon start falling. Leaf collection will begin on October 10th and run until December 16th. During November and December signs will be posted on your street advising when leaf collection will occur in your area.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf
 piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms. DO
 NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park
 cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those
 leaves that are blocked.
- DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.



Atlantic Avenue Elementary School Garden





Sustainable Summer Yard Care



Many people long for a lush green lawn, from spring through fall. As the rains of late spring and early summer decrease, it is perfectly normal for lawns to turn brown as the temperature rises since most of our lawns are cool weather grasses. Many homeowners think it means that the lawn has

died when, in reality, it is simply dormant. Don't fertilize or reseed in an attempt to revitalize the lawn.

Water lawns and garden beds once a week, early in the morning. Provide 1 to 1½ inches of water at one time if possible. Frequent watering for short periods of time makes the problem worse since it prevents the lawn from forming deep, healthy roots. Watering mid-day is wasteful since most of the water evaporates. Watering in the evening increases the chance of fungus and other diseases since the lawn and plant foliage stays wet all night. When that happens, homeowners frequently reach for chemicals to fix the problem and put more contaminants in the soil. Invest in an inexpensive rain gauge or simply re-purpose

a clean, standardsize tuna can or cat food can which is 1 inch high. Be sure to put the rain gauge



in an open area where no plantings to obstruct collection. Use this as a guide and only water if the weekly total is less than 1 inch.

Don't mow the lawn during a dry spell as it stresses the lawn. Keep the mower at its highest setting. After mowing, the lawn should be 3 inches high. High grass holds more moisture, fights weed growth, and helps develop deeper roots. Do not bag the grass clippings, but leave them on the lawn to provide free fertilizer. It saves time and effort as well as decreases yard waste for the town to collect. Over-watering and over-fertilizing create thatch, not leaving clippings on the lawn. Do not fertilize during the hot, dry summer since

it can damage the lawn. Lawn services often do things routinely, so be sure to tell them how you want your lawn cared for when it is hot and dry.



Lawns are not sustainable due to their water and fertilizer needs as well as the pollution caused by mowers and edgers. While we have not suffered the severe droughts affecting other areas of our country, it is likely we will feel its affects at some point in time. Now is the time to change your lawn routine to a more sustainable one. Next year consider decreasing the amount of lawn in your yard by planting drought-resistant ground covers or increasing the size of garden beds with native plantings, which generally are drought-resistant once established.






LIBRARY CORNER
