Tax Office

What to look for in 2017

PD5 Forms – If you are receiving the \$250.00 deduction for qualified Senior Citizens, Disabled persons, or Surviving Spouse, be on alert around the 1st of February for the PD5 form in the mail. This form must be completed and returned to the tax office by March 1st to continue receiving the \$250.00 deduction.

Property Tax Reimbursement Books - a.k.a. "Senior Freeze." For residents already enrolled in the program, the State will send you the PTR-2 form directly. For those of you who are not enrolled in the Senior Freeze and who are turning 67+ in 2017, new enrollment books (PTR-1) will be available in the tax office in early April.

Online Taxes - View and/or pay your property taxes online through the boro website at haddonhts.com. Now you can see the amount of taxes billed, due, and paid as well as viewing the assessed value of the property.

***Reminder: First quarter 2017 tax bills are due February 1st with a 10 day grace period**

Zoning and Code Enforcement

The following is the Haddon Heights Borough Code concerning snow removal. § 400-8 Removal of snow, grass and weeds : [Amended 3-15-2011 by Ord. No. 1365] The owner or tenants of lands abutting sidewalks shall remove all snow from those sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after snowfall has ceased. All grass, weeds and other impediments shall be removed from sidewalks within three days after receiving notice. It shall be unlawful to throw or deposit snow, grass, weeds, or any other materials in the street.

§ 400-9 Removal of ice : The owner or owners, tenant or tenants of lands abutting or bordering upon the sidewalks of public streets, avenues and highways shall remove all ice from the same within 12 hours of daylight after the ice shall have formed thereon, or if it shall be impossible within that time to remove the same, the owner or owners, tenant or tenants shall spread over the ice on said sidewalks ashes, sawdust or some other similar material which shall make the said sidewalks safe for the use of pedestrians.

Overnight Parking:

A few reminders about overnight parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- 2017 Overnight Parking Renewal Letters were mailed out back in 10/2016
- 2017 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2017.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible
- snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.

Parking During Snow Emergencies



The Police Department would like to remind residents about NO PARKING regulations during snowstorms:

- When it is snowing between the hours of midnight and 5:00 am ALL motorist are not allowed to park their vehicles on Borough streets.
- Whenever there is a "Snow Emergency" declared by the Borough or a State of Emergency declared regardless of the time of day we will strictly enforce no parking regulations.
- There are several reasons for this strict enforcement, they are: 1) to reduce motor vehicle accidents 2) to keep the road clear for emergency vehicles and key personnel, 3) to keep the roads open for snow plows, allowing them to clear the road in a timely manner and to do a better job.

A Spirit of Giving at New Beginnings Learning Center



For the second year the families of New Beginnings Learning Center have been called upon to help local families in need by donating children's pajamas. In cooperation with the Scholastic Book Company, 70 pairs of new cozy, warm PJs were donated this year in sizes for premie newborn to teen and matched with books, helping local children have better nights. The giving didn't stop there. The 1st United Methodist Church of Haddon Heights puts up a Warm & Fuzzy Christmas tree each year to collect donations of winter hats, scarves, gloves and mittens. Pastor Ayn Masker gives developmentally appropriate, individual instruction on one of the church's many pianos, a floor keyboard (like in the movie "Big"), as well as beginning music theory, free of charge. In December the students performed in their first recital during a Sunday church service. The school's PreK students also performed Silent Night in sign language. New Beginnings Learning Center is very proud and excited to offer this opportunity to the preschoolers!

Certified and licensed by the state of NJ, the school proudly surpasses the requirements of the state regulations. The caring, dedicated, highly experienced staff exceeds the state requirement for continuing education, is CPR/AED and 1st Aid certified, and has received extensive emergency management training. An inspector from the NJ Division of Licensing has called NBLC "the model for what a preschool should be".





Glover Fulling Mill Park Dedication

Save the Date! Saturday March 25th

The Borough of Haddon Heights will dedicate The Glover Fulling Mill Park on Saturday, March 25 at 10 a.m. in the park, rain or shine. Refreshment will be served.

The Glover Fulling Mill Park is a one acre park and archaeological site that was part of the former DPW Plant. The Park runs from the cul de sac on Fulling

Mill Lane to Sylvan Drive. A four panel historical marker, mimicking fabric stretched on tenter frames, explains the fulling process, the role of the Glover Mill during the Revolutionary War and history of the Glover Family. It was designed by Westfield Architects & Preservation Consultants.

The Borough wanted to preserve, protect, and interpret the historic Glover Fulling Mill archaeological site and received a \$50,000 Historic

Site Management Grant in 2014 from New Jersey Historic Trust.

Former Councilwoman Rose Fitzgerald, who prepared, submitted and managed the application for the Borough, invites all of the public to attend.

The Glover Fulling Mill site is listed on the New Jersey and National Register of Historic Places. The Mill was built in 1775 on King's Run, the south branch of Newton Creek off the Delaware River and owned and operated by the Glover Family for a century. After being abandoned, the masonry building decayed. By 1911, the structure was no longer standing, and an eight acre portion of the Glover property was purchased by the Borough for its sewer plant. The last photo of the Glover Fulling Mill appears on the 2017 Business and & Professional Association Town Calendar.

The park will be a passive park - no playground equipment, picnic tables or bathroom facilities are planned as they are provided a block away in the County Park.

The Glover Fulling Mill Park is the only historic site owned by the Borough. The Borough's four colonialera houses and the passenger and freight stations are all privately owned. Mrs. Fitzgerald said, "I am delighted and thankful that New Jersey Historic Trust awarded Haddon Heights this grant and provided the Borough with the funds to excavate this unique historical site representing the early industry of Haddon Heights and South Jersey, as well as plan for its maintenance and present it to the public with an outstanding historical marker."

Sustainable Haddon Heights

Tips to Stay Warm, Save Money, and Help the Environment!

1. Lower your thermostat to 68 degrees. A setting of 65-68 is ideal for during the day. Set it for 58 at night or if you will be away for several hours. Not only will this lower your energy bills, but energy production from coal, oil and natural gas is one of the leading causes of greenhouse gases that contribute to global climate change. Wear a sweater to stay comfortable.

2. Keep your window drapes closed at night and close doors to seldom-used rooms.

3. Seal air leaks including those around entrances, attic stair openings, light fixtures, pipes, and wires. Attic entryways should be weather-stripped and insulated. Seal duct work as well.

4. Lower water heater to 120-125 degrees. Take shorter showers and install low-flow shower heads. Wash your clothes in cold water unless heavily stained.

5. Change furnace filters every month. This is the number one reason for furnace breakdowns.

6. Weather-strip doors and windows. If you can see daylight around a door or window frame, then the door or window needs sealing. Ask your utility company for an energy audit to find out how to increase your energy efficiency.

7. Add an insulation blanket to the water heater.

8. Turn off unused lights and computers. Install energy-efficient lights. They last longer and cost less in electricity. Choose energy-efficient appliances.

9. Avoid unnecessary idling of your car. Cars no longer need to be warmed up before driving in cold weather. It is more gasefficient to turn off most warmed-up vehicles than to idle for more than 30 seconds. Unnecessary idling increases pollution, smog, and global warming. Idling exhaust is especially hazardous to children around schools and aggravates childhood asthma.

10. Burn only dry wood in your fireplace. Wet wood burns incompletely and releases more pollutants into the air. Burn only seasoned wood that has been drying for at least six months.

11. It is especially important in the winter months to use the least-hazardous cleaning products because your home is more airtight. Toxic products can concentrate fumes in the air you breathe and harm your health. Young children are particularly vulnerable to these effects. Use products such as baking soda to scrub or vinegar and water solutions to clean.

12. Get your gas-powered lawn mower serviced now to get ready for spring. Small engines contribute large quantities of carbon dioxide and pollution to the air, even more per hour than a car. A tuned up mower not only runs better; they produce less emissions.

13. Prevent hazardous waste from chemicals by using non-toxic de-icing substances such as clean clay cat litter, sand, or fireplace ash. Chemical de-icers can be hazardous to pets, trees, and shrubs as well as the environment. Run-off pollutes local waterways.


14. Clean humidifiers regularly and refill with fresh water daily. Humidifiers can become breeding grounds for bacteria.


