

BORO BITS

Department of Public Works

Fall is in full swing and the leaves are changing and falling! Leaf collection is underway and will run until December 15th.

PLEASE ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms. DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those leaves that are blocked.
- DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

If you have any questions please feel free to contact the office and someone will be glad to assist you. 856-546-2580, Office hours are 8AM-4PM.



Overnight Parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications and renewal applications for 2018 permits must be received by December 18th.
- 2018 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2018.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.

Parking During Snow Emergencies

The Police Department would like to remind residents about NO PARKING regulations during snowstorms:

- When it is snowing between the hours of midnight and 5:00 am ALL motorist are not allowed to park their vehicles on Borough streets.
- Whenever there is a "Snow Emergency" declared by the Borough or a State of Emergency declared regardless of the time of day we will strictly enforce no parking regulations.
- There are several reasons for this strict enforcement, they are: 1) to reduce motor vehicle accidents 2) to keep the road clear for emergency vehicles and key personnel, 3) to keep the roads open for snow plows, allowing them to do a better job clearing the road in a timely manner

Background on the Heights Senior Resource Center:

Heights Senior Resource Center was created as a social network for the benefit of seniors living in Heights who do not reside in Stanfill Towers or Commons. The owner of Stanfill Towers, the Haddon Heights Senior Citizen Housing Corporation (HHSCHC), is sponsored by seven of the churches in Heights. It opened Stanfill Towers in 1977 and a few years ago purchased and restored this 1919 Colonial Revival house next door. This historic house with stone plinths and fence is a contributing building in the White Horse Pike Historic District. The first floor serves as a gathering place and retains its original fireplace and woodwork; the second floor has been repurposed for volunteer offices as a dedicated resource center for all Haddon Heights seniors. A year ago Ms. Amy Gradel, a certified social worker, was hired by the Board of Directors as Social Service Coordinator for both HSRC and Stanfill Towers and Commons. 

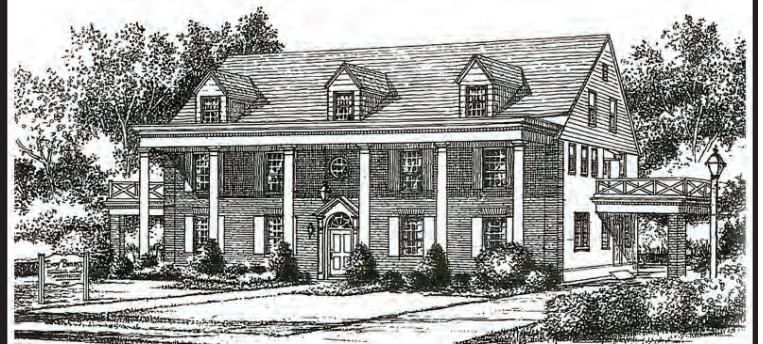

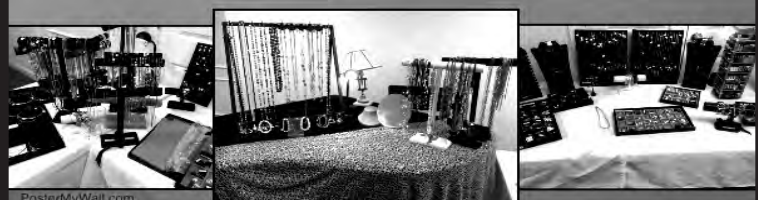

Colonel William Logan DePue

Colonel William Logan DePue grew up on Prospect Ridge, the son of Eleanor and Bill DePue. Logan graduated from Haddon Heights High school in 1989 and from the United States Naval Academy with a B. S. degree in Aerospace Engineering and was commissioned a second Lieutenant in 1993. He was assigned to the Red Dragons Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron and served as a pilot in Eritrea, Jordan, East Timor, and the Persian Gulf.

In 2001 Captain DePue joined the Night Hawks, the Marine Corps Helicopter Squadron responsible for transporting the President, Vice-President, Cabinet and other VIPs.

In 2003, Major DePue was assigned as the Chief Operations Test Analyst in New River, NC where he tested the Marine Lift Helicopter replacement, the MV-22B Osprey. In 2006, Major DePue served as Assistant Operational Officer for the first operational MV-22B Osprey squadron transition. He deployed to Iraq in 2007 and aboard an amphibious ship in 2009. In 2010 Lieutenant Colonel DePue served as the Lead Osprey Operational Test Director and Chief Operational Test Director. By 2012 LtCol DePue worked on the introduction of the Osprey to Okinawa, Japan. As commanding officer of the Dragons, Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 265, he introduced the Osprey to the Pacific.

Following command, LtCol DePue was assigned to Headquarters Marine Corps Office of Legislative Affairs as a Congressional Liaison for Acquisition Programs. In June of 2016 he returned to Okinawa and assumed his current duties as both the Commanding Officer of Headquarters and Support Battalion, Marine Corps Installations Pacific and the Camp Commander for Camps Foster and Lester. Colonel DePue has logged over 3,400 mishap free flight

hours. His personal awards include Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendations Medal, and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal.

Logan is married to the former Dale Paris and they have two children, Gavin, age 13 and Patrick, age 11. They are with him in Okinawa enjoying the experience of living abroad and taking every opportunity to travel throughout Asia.

The Borough will maintain the one acre park (grass, woods and archeological site) while landscaping to beautify that area will be part of ongoing work, based on the landscape project plan shown here.

Haddon Heights Zoning Department:

Haddon Heights Borough code states that trash may not be placed at the curb before 4 pm the day before pickup, or after 6 am on the day of pickup.

Please note that this applies to residents when moving as well. If you put an excessive amount of trash (more than 5 cans or articles) the trash company may not pick it all up. If that occurs, the resident is responsible for removing whatever has not been collected and the disposal of same.

§ 393-6. Hours for placement of items at curb.

A. Trash, brush, garbage or recycling items shall not be placed at the curb earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day before collection nor later than 6:00 a.m. of the day of collection.

§ 393-7. Disposal regulations.

All trash, garbage and recycling items placed at the curb shall be subject to the following:

A. Garbage shall be drained of all liquids, wrapped in paper and placed in receptacles.

B. Trash must be placed in a suitable receptacle made of metal, plastic or other suitable material with a lid. [Amended 4-2-2002 by Ord. No. 1123]

C. All trash and recyclables shall be securely tied to prevent their blowing away. All recycling can be placed in one container, but separate from trash and garbage. [Amended 4-2-2002 by Ord. No. 1123; 5-5-2009 by Ord. No. 1308]

D. No single article, bundle or loaded container shall be heavier than 50 pounds.

E. No explosives or highly flammable materials shall be included in any trash or garbage.

F. All containers owned by any person setting out trash, garbage or recycling shall be removed from the front of the premises within 12 hours after being emptied.

G. No container shall exceed 40 gallons in capacity. Residents wishing to permanently dispose of a larger container than allowed may place the same at the curb with trash, and it shall be removed by the Borough. Said container shall be clearly marked with the words "Take Away."

H. Refrigerators, freezers or any other items that have a capacity of four cubic feet shall have the door or lid removed from the hinges, and the cover or lid shall be placed separately at the curb.

I. A receptacle used for trash and garbage disposal cannot contain any recyclables. [Added 4-2-2002 by Ord. No. 1123; amended 5-5-2009 by Ord. No. 1308]

J. Containers and materials shall not be placed in the street or on the sidewalk. Any bulk materials not in containers (fencing, branches, posts, etc.) shall be cut and bundled in lengths no longer than 48 inches. For brush or branches, all ends shall face

the same direction. [Added 5-5-2009 by Ord. No. 1308]

K. No materials, including but not limited to brush, grass, clippings, concrete, or construction materials, may be put out for disposal that were not generated from that location. [Added 5-5-2009 by Ord. No. 1308]

L. Contractors are responsible for removing all trash and debris generated from construction or repairs from the property. [Added 5-5-2009 by Ord. No. 1308]

M. Any person owning or occupying a residential property desiring his trash and/or recyclables to be removed by the Borough or the Borough's removal contractor shall comply with this chapter.

§ 393-13. Special materials.

A. The removal of materials generated by a contractor or by a resident is the responsibility of the person who generated the material, including but not limited to material from home renovations (interior and exterior). Where a permit is required, acknowledgment of this will be by the signing of said acknowledgment at the time the permit is issued. The lack of need for a permit does not preclude the responsibility of removal by the resident. Materials generated by a resident only may be placed at the curb in accordance with § 393-7.

A resident may not place more than five containers at the curb for removal pursuant to this section.

B. The removal of special materials generated from a place of business such as water heaters, plumbing fixtures, aluminum siding and electrical fixtures, etc., is the responsibility of the person or business which generates the material.

C. Residents only who generate toxic and hazardous materials may dispose of these materials at the Public Works garage between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Definition: SPECIAL MATERIALS

Materials or other solid waste, such as broken concrete, sod, dirt, shrub stumps, tree stumps, tree roots, automobile parts, including tires with rims, building materials, fencing materials, toxic chemicals, asphalt, wood (other than brush), etc., that cannot be collected by standard collection vehicles (trash packers) or cannot be disposed of in a customary way (landfills or incineration). This will include porcelain and plastic plumbing fixtures.

NOTE: The trash company will not pick up any pressure treated wood or wood with nails.

As outlined in borough code, failure to comply with this ordinance may result in a summons being issued.

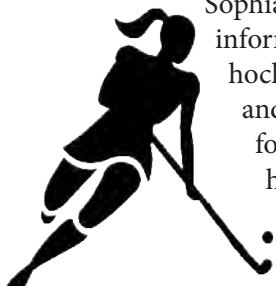

Plastic Bottle Caps – Wid' or Wid' out?

This question may or may not be at the forefront of the many issues we deal with day by day. Whether it is or isn't, here is some information that may help guide your answer and your actions going forward.



Many if not most of us know that the type of plastic used for a bottle or container cap/lid is different from that used for the bottle/container itself. And, as most caps/lids do not have any recycling icon with a number, the assumption is that it should not be recycled.

Here are some facts in the form of FAQ's from the Association of Plastic Recyclers (APR) that should help us make a better, or at least a more informed decision. Their promotional effort is called: CAPS ON.

I've always heard that plastic caps should be taken off before recycling. Why the change?

Recycling collection and processing technology has improved, demand for the recyclable material has increased allowing the current CAPS ON recycling message.

Are recycled caps marketable?

Generally, caps are made from high density polyethylene (HDPE) and polypropylene (PP) – both have high demand from applications in both domestic and export markets.

Caps are usually made of a different type of plastic than bottles. Do they have to be recycled separately?

Although the caps may be of a different material than the bottle, bottles are ground into flakes before being vigorously washed in the recycling process. The washed cap material is then separated from the bottle material during a water bath float/sink process. PET (bottles) will sink, PP and HDPE will float. See it in action at www.vimeo.com/148915676 or scan the QR code to the right:



Should bottles and containers be flattened before replacing the cap?"

According to a recent Material Recovery Facility (MRF) Material Flow Study, flattening bottles can lead to improper sortation, and they may end up in the paper stream.

Are metal caps really a problem?

Steel caps damage machinery and aluminum caps slow down production and are too contaminated to recycle. Metal caps may also cause plastic bottles and containers to be separated from the plastics stream during the sortation process at the Material Recovery Facility.

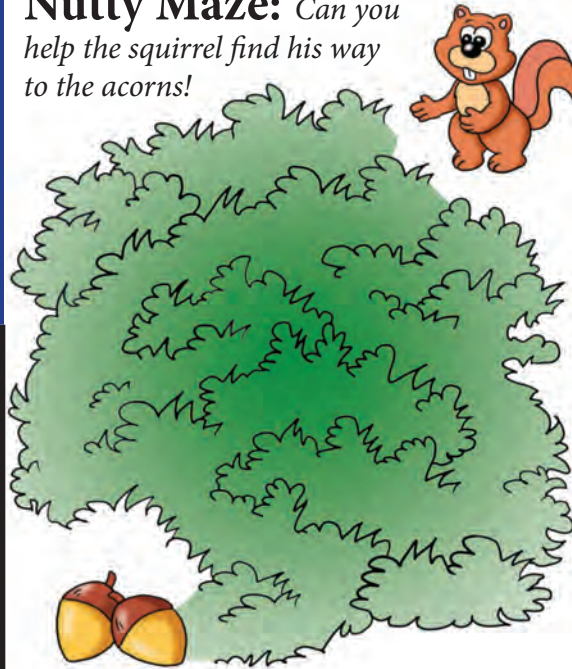
