





Renewal forms for the cat and dog licenses have been mailed and are now due. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is still just \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. To avoid the \$10.00 late fee, license must be issued on or before JUNE 30, 2018.

Please note that in order to obtain a license & tag you must provide the Borough with current vaccination information from your veterinarian. Also for the borough to be able to issue the license your pet's rabies vaccination must not expire before November 1st, 2018. This is a state regulation, if you have questions about the regulation you can find more information about it on the State of NI's website.

You can see this information and more on the borough's website. You can also find a link to print a new renewal form on the website, if you are in need of a new form.



#### Tax Assessor Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.


you have not received your information packet, please contact the borough hall office so we can get one to you right away.

## "Protect Your Borders"

In the mid-1970's Mayor Joe McCullough visited the new Walt Disney World in Orlando. When he walked down Main Street, he said, "Why we have this in Haddon Heights!" He returned and asked Borough Clerk Bob Fannen to research how the Borough could preserve Station Avenue from the demolition that was damaging many main streets in South Jersey, e.g. Clementon. The answer was historic districting. While not all buildings in a historic district may be individually historic or architecturally significant, combined they give a "sense of time and place." In Haddon Heights that time and place was the 1895-1930 period when the town was founded and built up.

Borough Council established a historic district in 1976 along the White Horse Pike and Station Avenue. A Borough-wide architectural survey in 1986 confirmed that the entire "original village' First to Tenth was eligible for historic districting, but in the least the Borough should "protect the borders" of the White Horse Pike Historic District by expanding the White Horse Pike Historic District to include Fourth Avenue and East Atlantic in the White Horse Pike Historic District. This is because oftentimes the buildings nearest the business district in any town or city fall prey to rentals, dilapidated housing, parking lots, etc.

So the Borough expanded the WHP HD to include Fourth and East Atlantic Avenues. East Atlantic had already been at risk by a development plan in the 1970's. (See display in Library basement.)

Since 1986 this ruling has protected the St. Rose Rose Garden from paving and has brought about the renovation of many of the Tudor, Queen Anne, Bungalow and Colonial Revival houses on Fourth and East Atlantic. Protecting our borders has enhanced the property values on both those streets. The Planning Board considers the residential setting of those streets when approving parking lots, drainage, and lighting for businesses on the Pike.

The Ordinance also gives the Borough Historic Preservation Commission the right to review any application within 500 feet of the historic districts.

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## **Stanfill Towers 40th Anniversary**

"Concert for the Community", Sunday, June 10

Forty years ago, Haddon Towers opened its doors as the first affordable senior housing community in a neighborhood rich with old-fashioned charm, Haddon Heights.

The new older adult community evolved under the watchful guidance of a Board of Directors comprised of representatives from seven local church communities.

Residents settled into one-bedroom and studio apartments and enjoyed an array of amenities including a sitting area/lobby, a computer learning center, a community room with kitchen and a library. It was the same year that the Phillies Phanatic settled into his new home at Veterans' Stadium and the cartoon character "Garfield" moved into the funny pages of newspapers around the country...and the Phanatic and Garfield weren't the only ones moving and having fun! Towers' residents enjoyed planned activities including weekly games, group discussions and special dinners and celebrations. The Towers' ideal location, near the intersection of E. Atlantic and Station Avenues, just footsteps from convenient shopping on "Main Street" and the iconic Haddon Heights train station, invited residents to step out of the Towers and into the neighborhood


In 1977 Haddon Towers was re-named Stanfill Towers in honor of former Board Chairman, Robert C. Stanfill who worked tirelessly to organize the community to accept the Towers. In the same year, PRD Management was hired to oversee the Towers. PRD President James McGrath envisioned Stanfill Towers not only as a residence, but also as resource for local seniors and their families. His vision became reality with the procurement of a residential property adjacent to the Stanfill Towers in 2006. After meticulously renovating the property to meet historic code, The Manor, a new community space and senior services resource center was christened in 2008. Today, The Manor is staffed by a part-time service coordinator who links residents of the Towers and the Haddon Heights community to services that can help individuals successfully age in place.

Stanfill Towers has won numerous awards for excellence in property management. It is considered a premier apartment community and is nationally recognized as a Community of Quality by the National Affordable Housing Management Association (NAHMA).

Judy Kohlmyer, property manager, has been at the helm of Stanfill since 1980. She is aided by administrative assistant Sandee Vogel and Social Services coordinator, Amy Jo Gradel, MSW.

As its 40th Anniversary approached, Anne McAdams, President of the Stanfill Towers Board of

Directors, suggested a free community concert featuring fabulous music and refreshments to mark the milestone occasion -- and so on Sunday, June 10th, the 60-piece Blawenburg Band will roll into town to regale young and old alike with a rousing concert featuring the works of John Philip Sousa and other great composers on the lawn of the Towers.



Beginning at 12:30 p.m., Haddon Heights neighbors are invited to set a beach blanket or comfortable lawn chair on the lawn of Stanfill Towers to enjoy the show. There will be activities for kids and families to enjoy before the Concert begins at 1:45 p.m. A brief intermission is planned and light refreshments will be served. 

## **Children's Summer Movie Series**






