The Department of Public Works needs your assistance in allowing us to serve you in a more efficient manner. We would greatly appreciate your cooperation with regard to both grass and brush collections. Place grass clippings in an open container no heavier than 60 pounds. Please do not mix the grass with any trash or dirt. When you place your grass container curbside please locate that container several feet away from your regular trash containers so our staff can quickly determine it is grass. This will allow for a more efficient collection process. All brush is to be cut in 4 foot lengths. Please place the brush curbside, not in the street, in either a container or tie the brush in bundles no heavier than 60 pounds. These items are placed in the back of a refuse vehicle and your cooperation with these restrictions will drastically improve our collection process. PLEASE NO PLASTIC BAGS for grass or brush.

Finally, I have to take a moment to thank all of the volunteers who contribute so much to our town. Many government functions are run by volunteers. Your Mayor and Council are volunteers as are the many members of our various boards, committees and commissions. In



addition, the countless individuals who give so much of their time to our youth sports organizations and other civic initiatives help to build a strong sense of community. This would not be possible without the volunteerism we enjoy in this town. I deeply appreciate everyone's service.

What's Up With Small Explorers Park?



Mayor and Council recently created the Small Explorers Playground Steering Committee to bring to completion the Small Explorers Playground and Kindness Garden located at Hoff's Park

Chaired by advocates Jillian Soriano and Kathy Lange, and joined by 6 other residents, committee responsibilities include, among other tasks, community planning, media outreach and communication with stakeholders.

Open for PLAY! The Small Explorers Park playground is designed for youngsters from 18 months through four years of age, with age appropriate elements including an inclusion spinner. The design concept was created to not merely plop down equipment but to blend the area into a natural setting. Thus the adjacent Kindness Garden will be created, including a huge "Kindness Rock" for climbing, a natural tunnel, pollinator plantings, a labyrinth for relaxing and a reading bench courtesy of the town Library.


Donations already received funded the purchase of "Willow Whips" from a specialty nursery. Planted by volunteers, these willows will form a natural tunnel which youngsters can enjoy. Although still in recovery from vandalism and protected by safety fencing, you can see the tunnel beginning to emerge at Hoff's Park near the swings.

While financial support will mainly come from grants and possibly an assist by the Borough, donations of any size help move the playground forward. Only \$40,000 gets the playground equipment delivered and installed; an additional \$20,000 finishes the Kindness Garden.

Municipal Recycling 50% Target of Waste Stream

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Solid Waste, has marked the 30th anniversary of the enactment of the NJ Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act by establishing a goal of recycling 50 percent of our municipal waste stream. Haddon Heights, like all other municipalities in New Jersey, was tasked to update their Recycling Programs to ensure that all residential and commercial property owners are aware of the requirement to recycle. I remind you that you must recycle all items listed in Chapter 393 of the Borough Code. The code is accessible online at www.haddonhts.com and ask that you commit your household or business to pay special attention to your waste stream and that all acceptable items are recycled weekly. Leaf collection is around the corner

Fall is just around the corner. As the leaves start changing that means run through December.

PLEASE ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- •Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms. DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those leaves that are
- •DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

The last day for Grass collection will be on October 29th, 2018.

The last day for Brush collection:

West side (10th Ave. to the Black Horse Pike) will be Thursday October 18th. **East side** (10th Ave. to Haddonfield) will be Thursday October 25th.







New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.

I suspect he would teach them that – despite what they may be observing in our society – verbal and physical aggression are not the values we embrace. Mr. Rogers would say we don't dig in our heals in the face of problems that require collaboration. He would say that we don't embrace a culture of shouting each other down.




