#### Walking Tour of Revolutionary War Haddon Heights

The Heights Heritage League will hold a one-mile WALKING TOUR of Revolutionary War Haddon Heights on Saturday, October 13 at 3:00 beginning at the Encampment at North Park and Tenth. Rose Fitzgerald will conduct the tour past two of our pre-Revolutionary War houses and the archeological site of the Glover Mill. First stop is the Hinchman House, the oldest continuously occupied house in Camden County, shown on Thomas Sharp's map of 1710.


The remains of the Glover Fulling Mill will be pointed out. The fulling mill was the first industry in the area – used to wash, process, dye and stretch fabric that had been woven by local women. The mill and the houses are listed on the State and National Register of Historic Places. Next stop, the path of the soldiers during the Battle of Gloucester will be pointed out and finally, the John Glover House.

Other houses remaining from the early days of Haddon Heights are the Colonel Joseph Ellis House on Sycamore and the Chalkley Glover House on New Jersey Avenue. The Col. Ellis House appears on a map painted on the wall of the Constitution Center in Philadelphia, noted Mrs. Fitzgerald, a copy of a 1787 map of the area. The walk is free and should take about 60 minutes, rain or shine. All are welcome to attend. Call 547-3950 with questions. #### Leaf collection is around the corner

Fall is just around the corner. As the leaves start changing that means they will soon start falling. Leaf collection will begin on October and run through December.

#### PLEASE ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- •Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms. DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those leaves that are blocked.
- •DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

The last day for Grass collection will be on October 29th, 2018.

#### The last day for Brush collection:

West side (10th Ave. to the Black Horse Pike) will be Thursday October 18th. East side (10th Ave. to Haddonfield) will be Thursday October 25th.

#### Weekly Door-to-Door Shopping Ride Service



Robert C. Stanfill Towers, HUD Housing for Haddon Heights Seniors was established in 1978. It is sponsored by the Haddon Heights Senior Citizen Housing Corporation, which does business as Stanfill Towers, and is professionally managed by PRD Management, Inc. of Cherry Hill, New Jersey.

To celebrate the 40th Anniversary of Stanfill Towers and to help meet an ongoing need for transportation for shopping, as determined by a local survey, the Stanfill Towers Board of Directors has entered into a contract with the Senior Citizens United Community Services (SCUCS) to provide transportation for additional shopping services for all Haddon Heights Senior residents, age 60 and older.

Service is door-to-door, free and wheelchair accessible. Destinations include Wegman's, ShopRite in Lawnside and Brooklawn, Westmont Shopping Center, Center Towne Square (formerly Lion's Head Plaza), Walmart in Somerdale and the Deptford and Cherry Hill Malls. The service begins October 1, 2018.

The Bus will travel to many local shopping centers and grocery stores in the area. Check out the Monthly Calendar below for specific days and times they will be traveling to each location.

HOW TO REGISTER: This is a reservation only system for the door-to-door shopping routes. First time riders must call (856) 456-3344 to pre-register for the service. After this short phone intake, you must call each week to reserve your ride. All appointments for shopping service rides must be made by calling (856) 456 -1148 the working day before your trip between the hours of 6:00 am and 6:00 pm. Follow the instructions so you can leave a message for the shopping program. Speak slowly and clearly. Give your name, address with city, phone number and the day of the route.

HOW THIS IS FUNDED: Monday, Tuesday and Thursday rides are paid for by the Stanfill Towers Board. There is no donation requested. Wednesday and Friday rides are currently in place, courtesy of the Senior Citizens United Community Services Sen-Han program, and will continue. A \$2 donation is suggested per one way ride.



The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.






Scholarship Announcement



#### **Haddon Heights Youth Athletics**

HHYA Families:

As the 2018 Fall Softball / Baseball Season comes to an end, I am happy to report that our Fall enrollment numbers are stronger than ever. This fall we had 2 Teen teams, 3 Major teams, 4 Minor teams, 2 Rookie teams for baseball and 1 Major team and 1 Teen team for softball. I am very, very pleased with our numbers and participation this fall.

As I write this last letter for the Heights Report, I am reminded that I made it clear on Opening Day that after 13 years on the HHYA Board and the last 6 years as the President, I would be retiring from the HHYA Board at the end of my term effective October 31st. Steve Butler has been elected President and will take over on November 1st.

When I joined the Board, I was very surprised about the amount of volunteer time that was required. When I became President in 2012 I quickly realized that the hours spent within the program could easily equate to a second job. Nevertheless, I had one mission in mind and that was to make the HHYA Organization proactive and to provide the kids with the opportunity to play in the best environment possible. A strict policy regarding demeanor and behavior of coaches, players, Board Members, umpires and referees was implemented and for those who know me best, I have no tolerance for unprofessional behavior exhibited on the fields or court by any coach, player or official. I never wanted any child to be subjected to negative behavior at any time or any level.

With the help of the Board Members, we promoted the sports programs (Softball, Basketball and Baseball) in a way to invite kids to participate in sports. We realized that it is very important for a child to participate in sports during their developmental years.

Our basketball program is doing great thanks the leadership first initiated by former Commissioners Jim Donnelly and Keith Reynolds and now current Commissioner Matt Campbell and Deputy Commissioner Tim Bieg. These leaders have worked extremely hard to ensure the maximum participation by implementing basketball workouts and soliciting the Philadelphia 76ers to run basketball camps and private training options at our facilities for all of our participants.

Our softball program continues to improve as initiated by former Commissioner Keith Borchers and now current Commissioner John Paul Madden and Deputy Commissioner Chris Connelly. I remember the days of which the softball program struggled to field teams and now enrollment steadily increases and we have a few champions under our belts which is a great accomplishment. The Commissioners initiated playing in multi-town leagues to ensue our program continues to prosper and provide opportunity for our kids. Over the past few years, we have fielded fall softball teams which is great sign that our program continues to progress. Our baseball program continues to get stronger each year as initiated under the command of former Commissioners Tim Daly and Phil Castellano and current Deputy Commissioner Chris Harris. The enrollment has been outstanding over the years and continues to increase annually. Our baseball program has multiple teams at every level compared to many towns within our District who struggle to field one team per level. We have increased our game schedule to twenty games at the Majors level, fifteen to eighteen at the Minors level and at least twelve at the Rookie level. Unfortunately, weather does not

always side with HHYA and has cut into our game schedule over the past few years. About six years ago, we reached out to neighboring towns with the idea of playing different teams instead of playing all Haddon Heights teams. Although this would appear to be a simple task, this was not a traditional avenue to travel within our league. This has been very successful as it has provided an opportunity for kids to play at different fields in different environments.

When assessing our field conditions at the Barr Complex six years ago, we put a plan together for improvements. With the expert help of former Vice President Joe Monteleone, we began to address some much needed improvements. Joe Monteleone was a tremendous asset to our program and the renovations at the Barr Complex. We would have never been able to get all of this work done without Joe. Thank you Joe for your hard work and expert advise and oversight of our projects. We began with Minors building. We realized that the second floor announcers area was not used since 2003. We learned this because there was a scorebook opened with the date on the windowsill that was left after the last game played. We cleaned out and painted the 1st floor renovated the the 2nd floor, installed a new roof, replaced windows, purchased new announcers equipment, repaired the old Minors scoreboard that had not been used in years and ordered new doors. We then began announcing games on the Minors field. When kids hear their names announced at games, it brings a special smile hard to describe.

A project was initiated for the purchase and the installation of a large scoreboard on Memorial Field for both the baseball and softball programs. This was a great addition to the Memorial Field especially because the field never supported a scoreboard.

Another project was the installation of new dugouts for the Memorial, Majors and Minors Fields. A total of ten (10) dugouts were built on cement slabs with roofs

The next project was the renovation of the Majors and Minors Fields and the installation of lights for the Majors Field. This was a huge project for 2012 /2013 and major upgrade to the Barr Complex. Night games for the Little Leaguers on the Majors Field was an awesome experience. This was a major improvement to each of the fields. This could not have been possible without the support of the Mayor and Council of Haddon Heights.

With the assistance of two (2) Camden County Open Space Grants, we began a project that included a new two-story announcers booth for the Majors Field, removal and installation of higher fencing and netting around the Memorial and Majors Field and the installation of two (2) new batting cages for the Majors and Minors Fields.

Once we renovated fields, we purchased a field groomer that we nicknamed "The Beast". This piece of equipment is used to drag the fields and keep them in the best playing condition. We needed to invest in a valuable piece of equipment to ensure our fields were always in the best condition.

Last year the owners of Ralph's Pizza - former HHYA Board Member Joe Fermano and Augie Martinez approached me and wanted to do something for the program. I advised them I would really like to install a new scoreboard on the Majors and move the current Majors scoreboard to the Minors Field (because the Minors scoreboard was very old and was not functional). Within a few weeks, both Joe and Augie contacted me and said they have three (3)
