Get ready to kick off the holidays with the Haddon Heights Library's "All Through the House" Holiday House Tour. The library is celebrating the 35th anniversary of the tour with 4 beautiful homes. The evening portion of the tour will also feature carolers and an indoor model train display

at the Haddon Heights Library. We are excited to share these wonderful homes with you as part of the kick-off to the holidays in Haddon Heights. The tour will showcase a Gemberling Cape Cod with a beautiful new kitchen, a lovely mid-century center-hall colonial with a Pennsylvania field stone front, a classic American Foursquare with colonial revival elements and a recently modified Cape Cod that features a large kitchen and family room. This is all in addition to the Haddon Heights Library, which will present an evening model train display (6:30 – 9:30 p.m.) as well as an evening caroling performance. 

Leaf collection is underway!


Fall is here and the leaves are falling! Leaf collection has begun and will run through December.

PLEASE ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

- •Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- •Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms. DO NOT place leaves

closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those leaves that are blocked.

•DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.







Rethinking Recycling

China recently announced new standards for accepting recycled materials. It is now no longer economical for them to process our materials, since much of it is contaminated with non-recyclables. While the search goes on for a country willing to take our recycling, it's an opportunity for us to rethink recycling, using the 3 R's of the Environment: Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle.



Recycling isn't new. As early as 1690, there was a rudimentary process at The Rittenhouse Mill near Philadelphia that used fibers from linen and cotton rags to produce paper. During the Revolutionary War, recycling and reusing goods supported the war effort. Even Paul Revere had a scrap metal yard. In the nineteenth century, peddlers not only sold manufactured goods, but also bought recyclable materials, such as rags for paper and leftover beef bones for fertilizer.

During the Great Depression, manufacturers marketed products that had multiple uses—biscuit containers that could be used as lunch boxes and flour sacks that could be used as fabric for clothing, thus reducing the demand for goods and conserving resources. Collecting scrap metal, paper, and cooking waste helped the war effort in the 1940's.

The booming economy after World War II brought with it the consumer culture. The demand for disposable cans, bottles, and other single-use products grew along with the idea that you threw stuff out when you were done with it. Manufacturers produced products with built-in obsolescence rather than reusability. In 1947, the first landfill in the US, Fresh Kills, opened on Staten Island and recycling became a way to reduce the massive amounts of waste being produced rather than reclaiming valuable resources.

The first step is to reduce the amount of trash we create, by not buying things we don't need and being thoughtful about the things we do purchase. Reduce the use of single-use products and disposables, by taking our own shopping bags to the store rather than use new paper bags or new single-use plastic bags.

Next, reuse the things we buy, like plastic, metal, or glass containers. Plastic food storage bags can be washed and reused rather than tossed. Unwanted toys, furniture, and clothing can be donated for others to use. Maybe an item only needs to be repaired to be usable again. The Philly Fixers Guild (phillyfixersguild.org) offers free repair clinics and YouTube has lots of helpful videos.

The last step before putting something in the trash is to see if it can be recycled. The easiest way to do this is to use the free app, Recycle Coach, available online and downloadable to your smart phone. It not only tells you what your town recycles, it will offer suggestions for disposing of items they don't collect. The internet is another good resource.

Recycle properly. Items need to clean and free of food. Don't just put something in the recycling container hoping it can be recycled. If it isn't listed as recyclable, put it in the trash. Items destined for the trash will most likely be incinerated to generate energy, reducing the strain on landfill capacity. Recycling has now become necessary to reduce our footprint. So, reducing our desire for stuff and reusing what we have should be our priorities. And when we recycle, we need to do it right.



100 Year Old Building Saved!



Our First Church of Christ the Scientist has been purchased by Desiree Avilla, a Haddon Heights native who was raised on Crest Avenue. The sanctuary along with its curved roof old church/offices and will be remodeled into a home for Ms. Avilla and her three sons who are relocating from California.

The church was formed in 1916 and in 1925 construction began for the curved roof building. The cottage- style church looks as if it could be

sitting on a rolling hill in the English countryside. It is an example of the storybook Tudor style that was popular in the 1920's. The steeply pitched roof appears to be made of thatching. It is, in reality, constructed of wood and slate. These types of roofs are made up of steamed cedar shingles, which have the ability to be shaped in curved formations. Creative underlying construction was required to support the heavy materials. The roof has been a visual delight for passersby for almost 100 years.

The church on the left with front facing gable was completed in 1952 and dedicated in 1966. The interior has half timbering, wonderful woodwork BUT is in its original 1921 and 1952 built condition with original doors, lanterns, shutters, hinges and shutter dogs, along with old plumbing, wiring, etc. and . . . it's a church! Ms. Avilla plans on remodeling the interior into a home while keeping the front exterior.

According to Dan White of Daniel White Realtors more than 80 prospective clients toured the building. This building is not listed as a town historic site nor is it in a historic district. It could have been demolished without so much as a review. Recently the Planning Board approved Ms. Avilla site plans for new construction of a compatible garage/carriage house, pool and fence.

Thomas Wolfe said, "You can't go home again." That's not true. Ms. Avilla is moving home, rescuing one the most unique buildings in Haddon Heights and answering the unspoken prayers of hundreds of residents who love this church.
