National Train Day

May 10, 2019 marks the 150th anniversary of the link up of the Central Pacific and Union Pacific railroads in Promontory, Utah. This joined the United States from coast to coast by rail and was instrumental in making a truly united country. Railroads now served most of the country. Railroads continued to expand as both freight and passenger transportation until the early 1930s when improved roads, trucks, and automobiles brought about a significant decline in railroad business that was to continue into the 1970s.

On a local level, the 3rd oldest railroad in the United States was the Camden and Amboy, chartered in 1830, linking Camden and South Amboy. The trip between Philadelphia and New York City was shortened to a one day affair and made much more comfortable than the two day stagecoach trip previously required. This was followed in 1852 by the Camden and Atlantic Railroad which brought vacationers and prospective property owners to Atlantic City. In 1886 a second railroad, the Philadelphia and Atlantic City was chartered. This is the line passing through Haddon Heights today. The Philadelphia and Atlantic City was in and out of bankruptcy until purchased by the Philadelphia and Reading railroad in 1889. The Reading made major improvements to the line. The current passenger station was built in 1890 by the Lippincott family as an inducement to the Reading to make the developing community of Haddon Heights a station stop.

Development of railroads brought about the commuter society where workers no longer needed to live close to their employment. Railroads were the backbone of this commutation until improved roads and proliferation of passenger vehicles lessened the dependence on railroad commutation in the 1920s. Declining passenger ridership continued into the 1960s. With the end of passenger service, the station continued to serve as railroad office space until 2006. All railroad activity was transferred to Woodbury and the station was leased to the Delaware and Susquehanna Model Railroad Club by the Consolidated Rail Corporation. During the past 129 years, the station has served the Philadelphia and Atlantic City Railroad, Philadelphia and Reading, Pennsylvania Reading Seashore Lines, Penn Central, and Consolidated Rail Corporation. The station is a contributing element of the Haddon Heights Railroad Historic District. Once a year we highlight railroad history by celebrating Down by the Station Day as a reminder of the town's railroad roots. Nationally the day is marked by other railroad related events that recall the event of 150 years ago that united a new nation.

2019 Pet Licensing

Renewal forms for the cat and dog licenses have been mailed and are now due. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is still just \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. To avoid the \$10.00 late fee, license must be issued on or before JUNE 30th.

Please note that in order to obtain a license & tag you must provide the Borough with current vaccination information from your veterinarian. Also for the borough to be able to issue the license your pet's rabies vaccination **must not expire before November 1st**. This is a state regulation, if you have questions about the regulation you can find more information about it on the State of NJ's website.

If your pet(s) are in need of getting an updated rabies vaccine, we are again offering a free rabies clinic at the end of April (see information below). If you have questions about the timing of your pets rabies vaccination, we recommend calling your vet.

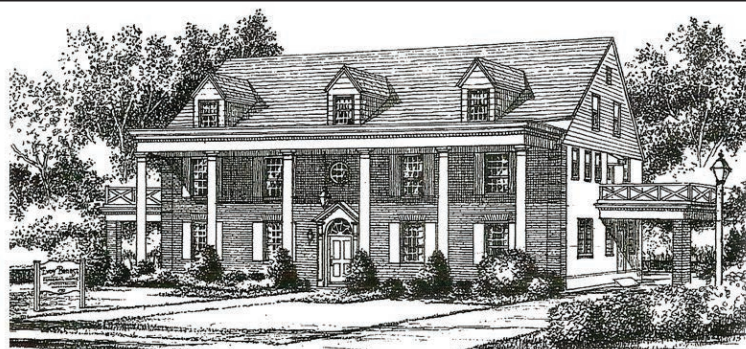

Important Changes in Plastic Recycling

Just when you thought you finally got a handle on what's recyclable and what isn't, China announced its National Sword Policy which severely restricts the import of recyclable materials. China is hoping that the change will improve their air quality, reduce pollution, and prevent illegal waste smuggling. While we can all agree that these are good things for China, it does impact us as about one-third of our recyclable waste materials were exported to China. Currently there isn't another market for that amount of waste material.

Plastics #1 and #2 are now the only plastics that can be recycled curbside along with paper, cardboard, glass, and cans. Plastics #3, #5, and #7 are no longer accepted and should be included in your trash for disposal in a landfill. The items to be recycled need to be clean. Paper cannot be contaminated with any grease (think pizza boxes) and the other items should be rinsed well to remove any food residue. Plastic grocery bags, dry cleaner bags, bubble wrap, and plastic wrap should still be deposited in the collection bins at stores.

We also need to be smarter consumers. We need to reduce our use of disposables. Use metal water bottles instead of plastic ones. Choose products in glass containers rather than plastic whenever possible. Instead of purchasing individual plastic containers of a product, buy a larger size and put it into smaller, reusable ones. Reducing our use of plastic is not only good for the planet, it's good for our pocketbook as well.

Erik Christensen began his ministry at HHBC on February 24th with a warm welcome from a fellowship happy to have a permanent pastor after a two and a half year search.

Rev. Christensen and his wife Stephanie come to Haddon Heights from Albuquerque, New Mexico, but are not strangers to this area. Pastor Erik's father David Christensen, was a member of the church while a medical college student in Philadelphia and lived in the borough with his uncle and aunt, Dr. and Mrs. Warren Bibighaus. He became a medical missionary to Africa, where he married a missionary named Elsbeth from Switzerland. Erik was born there, but the family returned to the United States to live in Wyomissing, PA, near Reading, where Erik grew up.

Erik's mother was diagnosed with leukemia and died when he was three years old. Erik says, "My family went through a difficult time after her death, but God used all these events in my life to ultimately bring me to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ when I was a freshman at Liberty University. Erik also met Stephanie Barber at Liberty, and in 1992 they were married. He graduated from Liberty in 1994. Weekly Door-to-Door Shopping Ride Service

Robert C. Stanfill Towers, HUD Housing for Haddon Heights Seniors was established in 1978. It is sponsored by the Haddon Heights Senior Citizen Housing Corporation, which does business as Stanfill Towers, and is professionally managed by PRD Management, Inc. of Cherry Hill, New Jersey.

To celebrate the 40th Anniversary of Stanfill Towers and to help meet an ongoing need for transportation for shopping, as determined by a local survey, the Stanfill Towers Board of Directors has entered into a contract with the Senior Citizens United Community Services (SCUCS) to provide transportation for additional shopping services for all Haddon Heights Senior residents, age 60 and older.

Service is door-to-door, free and wheelchair accessible. Destinations include Wegman's, ShopRite in Lawnside and Brooklawn, Westmont Shopping Center, Center Towne Square (formerly Lion's Head Plaza), Walmart in Somerdale and the Deptford and Cherry Hill Malls. The service begins October 1, 2018.

The Bus will travel to many local shopping centers and grocery stores in the area. Check out the Monthly Calendar below for specific days and times they will be traveling to each location.

HOW TO REGISTER: This is a reservation only system for the door-to-door shopping routes. First time riders must call (856) 456-3344 to pre-register for the service. After this short phone intake, you must call each week to reserve your ride. All appointments for shopping service rides must be made by calling (856) 456 -1148 the working day before your trip between the hours of 6:00 am and 6:00 pm. Follow the instructions so you can leave a message for the shopping program. Speak slowly and clearly. Give

your name, address with city, phone number and the day of the route.

HOW THIS IS FUNDED: Monday, Tuesday and Thursday rides are paid for by the Stanfill Towers Board. There is no donation requested. Wednesday and Friday rides are currently in place, courtesy of the Senior Citizens United Community Services Sen-Han program, and will continue. A \$2 donation is suggested per one way ride.

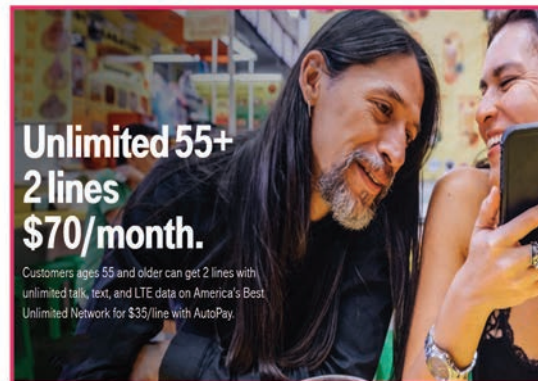

Shade Tree Commission

Spring has finally arrived and it's time to think TREES! The Shade Tree Commission is happy to announce that we will have 30 shade trees for planting this spring. The trees will be planted on the curb strip between the sidewalk and the street. If you have a spot in front of your residence in which you would like a tree planted, please contact the Department of Public Works or the Shade Tree Commission at 856.952.2185 to arrange for a site review.

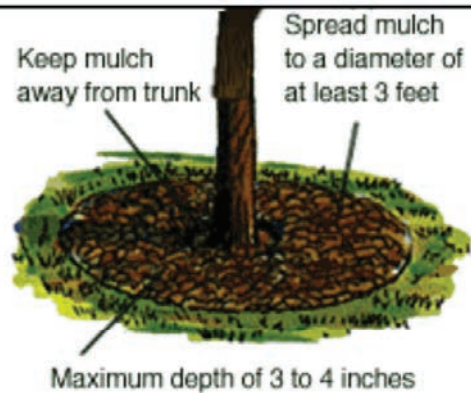
Residents ARE PERMITTED to plant their own trees, provided that they notify the Shade Tree Commission through the Department of Public Works PRIOR to planting. The Commission will review the site and the tree selection to confirm that it is made in accordance with the authorized tree list posted on the Borough website. The right tree planted in the correct location will avoid conflicts with the surrounding utilities as it grows. If you are planting a tree on the curb strip or on your personal property, you MUST call 811 for a utility company mark-out before digging.

In conjunction with the New Jersey Recovery Tree Program, the Shade Tree and Environmental Commissions will be conducting a tree sapling give-a-way at the Haddon Heights Farmers Market on Sunday, May 19. We will have a variety of native hardwoods, flowering trees and evergreens. Each resident may select 5 trees.

Remember to mulch into a donut. No mulch mountains! Deep mulch can lead to excess moisture in the root zone, which can stress the plant and cause root rot. Piling mulch against the trunk or stems of plants can stress stem tissues and may lead to the development of insect and disease problems or stem girdling roots.

The Community Center is located at 321 Seventh Ave. It offers a spacious main room with french doors leading to a fenced in yard. It is equipped with a full kitchen & sound system. Round tables & padded chairs are supplied and set up for you by the borough for each event. The Community Center accommodates up to 100 guests.



The Cabin is located at 600 Lippincott Lane. The Cabin offers a charming space which includes a gas fireplace, a small warming kitchen area with a full size refrigerator and audio visual equipment. Tables and chairs are supplied and set up for every event. The Cabin accommodates up to 40 guests.



Stormwater Pollution

Stormwater pollution is caused by runoff water when it rains that travels into the creeks, streams, or rivers that get polluted. When it rains, some of the rainwater soaks into the ground and part of the water flows over the ground and directly into the creeks, streams, or rivers. This water that runs off into the river is called runoff, and this stormwater gets polluted. Pollution is anything



that harms natural resources, which in this case, is water. Sometimes the pollution is something you can see. Like trash floating on the top of the water. Other times, you can't see the pollution at all, like when motor oil from a car washes into a nearby creek and pollutes the water in which we drink and swim in.

Many things we do and that happen around us every day can cause polluted runoff. Here are a few examples: Washing the car - when you wash the car, all of the soap, scum. And oily grit run down into the storm drain. A storm drain on your street and in your neighborhood carries rainwater away from your area and directly into streams and rivers near you. If you live in the country, water from your yard may go into a ditch and then flow to streams and rivers. If you live along the coast, it may go straight into the ocean. The runoff water is not cleaned or treated along the way, and anything that goes into the storm drain or ditch goes into the water. Litter - when people throw trash on the ground, it ends up into the creeks, rivers, and lakes. This litter harms water quality and wildlife. An example of a cigarette butt can take 25 years to break down. Lawn Care - fertilizer is used on lawns to help them grow. When people use more fertilizer than their lawns need, or if they fertilize just before it rains, a lot of the chemical ends up in the runoff and not their lawn. When this happens, it runs down the storm drain and into the river. Fertilizer helps things grow, but when it gets into the water, it helps algae grow. Algae blooms can cause major problems in waterways because they use up oxygen needed by other river critters. Poop - really, let's talk about poop. Example, does your family own a dog? Dog waste that is not picked up and left behind also makes its way into the water. Dog waste contains bacteria that can harm people. These bacteria end up in the water that we drink when people don't pick up after their dogs. So, you can see many causes of stormwater pollution are activities that people do every day. Many people do not even know that what they do is polluting the water.

What can you do to help? A pollution

permit or a treatment plant can't solve stormwater pollution. Stormwater runoff comes from small, individual sources in all parts of the watershed. It is a problem that could be changed by stopping small individual activities that cause pollution and result in large scale pollution. Here are some examples of minimizing stormwater problems: 1) maintain your car or truck never dump anything down a storm drain. Always recycle used oil, antifreeze and other fluids. Fix oil leaks in your vehicle. 2) Wash your car at a commercial car wash than in the street or driveway. 3) Cut down on fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides. If you use chemicals, follow directions and use them sparingly. Don't fertilize before a rain storm. Consider using organic fertilizer. Compost or mulch lawn clippings and preserve existing trees or plant new ones- trees hold rainfall and help manage stormwater. 4) If you are on a septic system, maintain the system. Septic systems require regular inspections, maintenance and pumping, or they will fail, cost a lot of money to fix and could pollute nearby lakes and streams. Have a professional inspector check your system regularly and have it pumped out when needed. 5) Pick up after your pets and keep animals out of streams. Scoop your dog's poop and properly dispose of it. Also, make sure fences and other structures are keeping cows, horses, and other animals out of the streams. Compost manure in a designated area so that it doesn't wash off into nearby waterways.

Support your local storm or surface water program. Programs to maintain a community's stormwater system, prevent flooding and protect natural resources may cost money in the short run but save money for damages to public and private property in the long term. Take advantages of opportunities to educate yourself and your family about your local watershed. You can search the internet for more information on stormwater, runoff, rain gardens, low impact development, etc. You can also visit U.S. Environmental Protection Agency: cfpub1.epa.gov/npdes/home.cfm?program_id=6

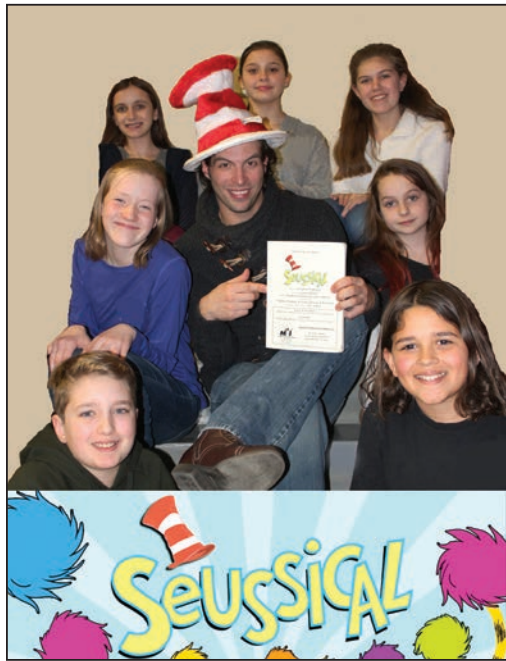

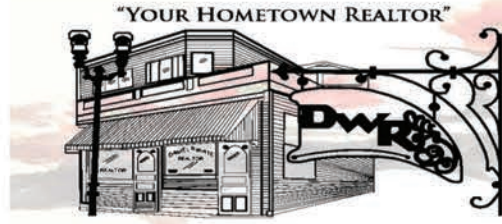

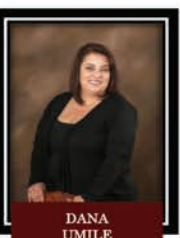
