Dear Neighbors:

mild winter and seem to be welcoming springtime a little earlier than usual. With that, many of you may have already taken advantage of the change to our brush schedules. Our partnership with our neighbors in Audubon as the new Audubon Haddon Heights DPW has allowed us to begin to collect brush every week instead of every other. Brush collections for the East Side (10th Ave to Haddonfield) will be Wednesdays and brush collection for the West Side (10th Ave to the Black Horse Pike — including 10th) will be Thursdays. You may have also noticed that many of the longstanding stumps on our curb lines are being ground finally. If you happen to see in the coming weeks that we missed any, please feel free to reach out to the DPW, and they will schedule it at the earliest convenience.

You may also notice that this time of year, we experience an increase in road and utility work. We are happy to report that Haddon Heights continues to complete a number of projects through local and federal grant funding. The Devon Avenue resurfacing project is one slated to begin very shortly. We will do our best to minimize daily disruptions and keep everyone informed.

With the weather breaking a little sooner

than average, you can expect to see an increase in pedestrian traffic, especially around our schools, parks, athletic fields, and downtown. Please drive responsibly through our neighborhoods, obeying all posted speed limits and motor vehicle laws. Don't forget to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalks and remember it is against the law to cross over a double solid line into oncoming traffic to pass a vehicle parking on the street.



2020 Pet Licensing

Cat and Dog pet licenses are now due. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is still just \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. To avoid the \$10.00 late fee, license must be issued on or before JUNE 30, 2020. Due to current events the Borough offices are closed, but we can still process your pet licenses. Please mail a copy of your rabies vaccination information and your Renewal form to the office and we will mail back your license and tag.

Also for the borough to be able to issue the license your pet's rabies vaccination must not expire before November 1st, 2020. This is a state regulation, if you have questions about the regulation you can find more information about it on the State of NJ's website.


Town Wide Food Drive

Bike Rack Project is About to Happen!

Several years ago, while preparing for two bike-related Sustainable Jersey actions, it was discovered that Haddon Heights had no real bike racks in our historic business district, just ornamental fencing at the Library and John's Market. Further research confirmed that the only other bike racks in town were a wave-style rack at the Community Center, a wave-style rack tucked behind the concession stand at the W Atlantic Ave ballfields, and grid-style bike racks at our three elementary schools. Sustainable Haddon Heights decided that instead of sourcing the cheapest possible bike racks, we would seek high quality racks with three points of contact to insure stability and security while controlling the bike footprint with wheel troughs. We also chose a rail mounting system as a significant added upfront expense, reducing the time and cost of installation, and the least intrusive option for the brick pavers in our historic business district. Conversations with many actual bike riders confirmed we were on the right track. The only negative feedback came from a few citizens more interested in racks with an artistic look, regardless of functionality. ShopRite of Lawnside and Zallie's Fresh Kitchen have continued their support of Haddon Heights by agreeing to co-sponsor the cost of 20 racks, holding 40 bikes for residents and visitors. Racks are planned to arrive by late April or early May. Actual implementation dates are planned to be posted on the Borough website.





How Energy Aggregation Can Reduce Your Electric Bill

New Jersey is one of only eight states that permit Community Choice Aggregation (CCA). CCAs allow local governments to purchase electricity in bulk from a single source for their residents, businesses, and municipal accounts. Buying in bulk can result in lower rates for participants and many towns see it as an opportunity to also support renewable energy.

Here's how a CCA works. After a bidding process, the local government enters into a purchasing agreement with a single energy supplier to provide electricity for the entire community. Typically, residents are automatically enrolled, but may opt out if they wish. Utility bills would still be handled by PSE&G. PSE&G would continue to be responsible for maintaining the delivery infrastructure and restoring power when necessary. The only thing that would change is the supplier. It would no longer be PSE&G (or another third-party) but would be the one chosen by the local government. Low income assistance would still be available to those who qualify. The goal is to reduce energy costs, typically by 2% to 20% for the supply charges. Delivery charges would continue to be set by PSE&G.

Haddon Heights is considering joining several nearby towns in exploring energy aggregation options for its residents. The goal is to reduce resident energy bills and at the same time reduce the town's carbon footprint by purchasing renewable energy generated by solar and wind. More information will be forthcoming and residents will have an opportunity to express their opinions before any decisions are made.







The story of the railroad and the community of Haddon Heights began in 1877 with the construction of the Philadelphia and Atlantic City Railroad through the area, which was then part of Center and Haddon Townships. The first tracks were narrow gauge, replaced with standard gauge in 1884.

In 1890, Benjamin A. Lippincott was given permission by the railroad to construct a passenger station here on his land, and construction of a freight storage station followed in 1906. While the area was farmland prior to this time, the establishment of commuter railroad lines to Philadelphia and the construction of the passenger station contributed to the development of the area as a suburban town. Lippincott and other property owners around the railroad station began to subdivide and sell their land, leading to the growth of the community and the incorporation of the Borough of Haddon Heights in 1904.

Rail passenger service continued until 1965. The railroad tracks are still in service for freight trains. Haddon Heights is one of very few New Jersey communities that still has its original passenger and freight stations.

The conservators possess the educational background that allows them to make sound preservation decisions based on an understanding of a building's history and materials while balancing the financial needs. Their experience preserving historic structures ranges from National Historic Landmarks to barns.

Mr. Tschoepe is the Director of Conservation for the Fairmont Park Historic Conservancy and adjunct faculty member of the historic preservation program of Bucks County Community College, where he teaches a core course in building conservation. He graduated from the School of Fine Arts masters' program in Historic Preservation, and is a contributing editor of Old

House Journal. Mr. McPoyle leads a team of architectural conservators and conservation technicians and oversees the work of the Conservancy's hands-on team. He has a background sculpture earned a Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the University of Delaware. He enjoys working on his mid-19th century farmhouse.
