



Historic Preservation Commission



Tudor Home Restoring Front Entryway

The Tudor house at 101 East Atlantic Avenue will have its front door and sidelights restored with approval from the Historic Preservation Commission. The house is the last house on East Atlantic in the White Horse Pike Historic District and is owned and occupied by Youth Consultation Services as a group home for young women. The house is an outstanding example of the Tudor style, built in 1910, and features a front facade dominated by a prominent cross gable, stone wall cladding on the first floor and stucco over the wooden studs with half timbering on the bays and second floor. The house also features tall narrow windows and a steeply pitched roof. The style is loosely based on early English folk houses and late medieval palaces. YCS and contractor Rick

Volpe intend to replace the door and sidelights which have rotted beyond repair with an exact replica of the original. This is an important house which anchors the northern border of the Historic District on East Atlantic Avenue.



LGBTQ+ Inclusive Curriculum Grant Recipient

The Haddon Heights School District is one of twelve schools in the state awarded a grant to pilot a new state LGBTQ+ Inclusive Curriculum. The grant is sponsored by Garden State Equality working in collaboration with Make It Better for Youth. As a recipient of the grant, Haddon Heights School District will be one of the first schools in New Jersey to pilot this groundbreaking curriculum detailing the history and struggles of the LGBTQ+ community with the goal of promoting respect and appreciation for all people.

Haddon Heights School District will be given exclusive access to the LGBTQ+ curriculum, ongoing professional development, and support in best practices on infusing LGBTQ+ content into all areas of the curriculum. We will also be provided with free access to the state LGBTQ+ conference, and an opportunity to be afforded the recognition as a S.A.F.E. (Safe, Affirming, Fair, and Equitable) school.

On January 31, 2019 Governor Phil Murphy signed the LGBTQ+ curriculum into law, requiring school districts to teach about the contributions of LGBTQ+ people and people with disabilities for the 2020-2021 school year. This makes New Jersey the second state, along with California, to require an LGBTQ+ curriculum in all schools.

PCAST Elective Class

The PCAST elective class had the pleasure of hosting two guests in their classroom in October. The first guest was Joanne Hamza from Rutgers University and NJCAN (NJ Career Assistance Navigator). She was able to create accounts for our students so that they can access a multitude of information on careers, colleges and apprenticeships/trades. The class will continue to use this website to research and develop person centered plans. The second guest was Somerlee Monaghan from Rutgers Boggs Center. Ms. Monaghan helped facilitate a lesson in problem solving called Solution Circles. The students loved this interactive and beneficial approach of critical thinking and perspective taking.






