# Reorganization Meeting



Haddon Heights has a new mayor! The annual reorganization of the Borough of Haddon government Heights took place on Saturday, January 4th and saw Zachary Houck being

sworn in as Mayor by Assemblywoman Patricia Egan Jones. Assemblywoman Jones also swore in Councilman Tom Ottoson. Councilwoman Asiyah Kurtz was elected after serving on Council in 2019 filling a one year unexpired term; she was sworn in by Camden County Freeholder, Jonathan Young. The newly elected officials join the already sitting Councilmembers which include Council President Stephanie Madden, Councilman Scott Schreiber, Councilman Christopher Mrozinski and Councilman Christopher Morgan.

During the meeting, Council members were appointed as Directors of borough departments as follows: Councilwoman Kurtz for Administration; Councilman Mrozinski for Finance; Councilman Ottoson for Planning and Zoning; Council President Madden for Public Safety; and Councilmen Morgan and Schreiber as co-directors of both Public Works and Parks & Recreation. The Council also reappointed Howard C. Long, Esquire of Wade, Long, Wood & Long as borough solicitor. Bach & Associates was reappointed as borough engineer.

During the meeting, dozens of Haddon Heights' residents were sworn in as members of the various town commissions, committees and groups. These helpful residents will lend their time and skills to assist the Planning & Zoning Board, Environmental Commission, Shade Tree Commission and the Municipal Alliance on Drug and Alcoholism, just to name a few. Haddon Heights Mayor and Council appreciate all of your community support and involvement. Here's to a successful and productive 2020!!

# **Animal Licenses**

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats. It's the Law.

In order to get your animal licensed, proof of rabies vaccination will be necessary, good through

In order to get your animal licensed, proof of rabies vaccination will be necessary, good through November 2020. For your convenience Haddon Heights always provides a Free Rabies Clinic in

April. Where you would be able to get all your animals a free rabies shot and get their 2020 license.

If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog. Nor will your animal be subjected to quarantine for 10 days in the county shelter.

Having a license also makes it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. Another benefit of having your animal licensed and vaccinated means if they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside.

### What to look for in 2020

<u>PD5 Forms</u> - If you are receiving the \$250.00 deduction for qualified Senior Citizens, Disabled persons, or Surviving Spouse, be on alert around the 1st of February for the PD5 form in the mail. This form must be completed and returned to the tax office by March 1st to continue receiving the \$250.00 deduction.

<u>Property Tax Reimbursement Books – a.k.a. "Senior Freeze"</u> - For residents already enrolled in the program, the State will send you the PTR-2 form directly. For those who are not enrolled in the Senior Freeze and who are turning 67+ in 2020, new enrollment books (PTR-1) will be available in the tax office in early April.

<u>Online Taxes</u> - View and/or pay your property taxes online through the boro website at haddonhts.com. You can see the amount of taxes billed, due, and paid as well as viewing the assessed value of the property.

\*\*Reminder: First quarter 2020 tax bills are due February 1st with a 10 day grace period\*\*

# Overnight Parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications and renewal applications are available at the Borough Offices.
- 2020 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2020.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL onstreet parking is denied.

### **2020 Pet Licensing**

Renewal forms for the cat and dog licenses have been mailed and are now due. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is still just \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. To avoid the \$10.00 late fee, license must be issued on or before JUNE 30, 2020.

Please note that in order to obtain a license & tag you must provide the Borough with current vaccination information from your veterinarian. Also for the borough to be able to issue the license your pet's rabies vaccination <u>must not expire before November 1st, 2020.</u> This is a state regulation, if you have questions about the regulation you can find more information about it on the State of NJ's website.

If your pet(s) are in need of getting an updated rabies vaccine, we are again offering a free rabies clinic on Saturday April 25th. If you have questions about the adjusting the timing of your pets rabies vacation, we recommend calling your vet.



### **Black History Month in Haddon Heights**

"Most townspeople know about our Quaker settlement and Revolutionary War houses," said Rose Fitzgerald, member of the Haddon Heights Historical Society, "but a lesser known part of our past is that black men and women were enslaved within the confines of present day Haddon Heights for 100 years. Indeed the names of some Newton Township slaveholders – Hinchman, Cooper, Kaighn, Albertson, and Clement - are familiar to most of us and enslaved men, women and children walked this same land and roads for a century."

According to a 1929 address by William Cooper, The Attitudes of the Society of Friends Towards Slavery, the first local protest against slavery was made on February 18, 1688 by German members of the Germantown Meeting. The seeds had been planted and agitation started; but slaves were still publicly sold in Camden as late at 1762. For the next 100 years Quakers worked within their Meeting to free enslaved men and women.

Cooper reports that "in the Women's Meeting records of Haddonfield Meeting, under date of eighth month of 1777 . . . 28 slaves in the compass of Haddonfield Meeting freed" but "John Hinchman held a "mail and femail (sic) not disposed to free them." Cooper continues, "in 1780 the Quakers at Haddonfield Meeting disowned two members who refused to release their slaves and in 1788, Haddonfield Meeting made a minute "No negroes held in bondage amongst us."

To commemorate Black History Month, books and reprints of articles about local slavery will be available at the Haddon Heights Library.

# **Haddon Heights Business Association**



# **Historic District**



This cornerstone property was originally Klein's Bakery which was built at the turn of the last century, and was the only bakery in town. Bread was a nickel a loaf and came with a sugar cookie to the children who were sent to buy the family's bread. The bakery burned down in a spectacular fire in 1906 that was remembered by all because the delivery horse was killed in the fire. The building was rebuilt as a Second Empire Victorian and featured a mansard roof and corner turret. The bakery and turret are long gone but the building and its essential shape remains and anchors the beginning of the Station Avenue Historic District.

With approval from the Historic Preservation Commission, owner Michael Carmody, CPA, has recently rebuilt the mansard roof and repainted the building.

A few of the HBCU's to which seniors received admissions include: Bethune Cookman College, Bowie State University, Bennet College, Delaware State University, Norfolk State University, North Carolina A&T University, Morgan State University, Tuskegee University, and Virginia State University. In addition to on the spot college admissions, students who were accepted into the NJ Rising Scholars Program were also recognized. This year, I am very proud to announce that Haddon Heights had seven seniors who were accepted into the NJ Rising Scholars Program. This is a significant increase from the two seniors who were NJ Rising Scholars last year.
