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

A large crowd gathered on Saturday, January 5, 2018 to mark the annual Reorganization of the Haddon Heights municipal government. Council President Stephanie Madden's first order of business was to install the town's two recently elected Council members. Scott Schreiber and Christopher Morgan were sworn in by Camden County Freeholder Jeffrey Nash. Councilman Schreiber who served on Council last year filling an unexpired term was elected to a three year term. Councilman Scott Schreiber and Councilman Christopher Morgan join current Council members Christopher Mrozinski, Stephanie Madden and Asiyah Kurtz.



Councilwoman Stephanie Madden was sworn in as Council President. Department directors were appointed, namely Councilman Schreiber to Parks & Recreation; Councilman Morgan to Public Works; Councilman Mrozinski to Finance and Construction & Zoning; Council President Stephanie Madden to Public Safety and Councilwoman Kurtz to Administration.



As the incoming Council President, I am happy to introduce this new feature to the "Heights Report" in order to give a fuller understanding of some of the initiatives that your Borough Council has in the works. Although there is still a chill in the air, be assured that spring will bring several exciting developments to our town.

First, within a matter of weeks, Haddon Heights will launch a brand-new, modern and mobile-friendly website. This website will allow for easy class registrations and tax payments. It will also include downloadable forms and permits. In addition, residents will be able to quickly report any public works related issues. Overall, the website will give both residents and visitors a fast and simple way to become better acquainted with this beautiful town.

The warmer weather will also bring the start of several new projects that will enrich Haddon Heights. The pedestrian and vehicular safety of Station Avenue will be vastly improved by new traffic calming measures, which will include more highly visible striping and epoxy paint bump outs. Tax Office

What to look for in 2019

PD5 FORMS - If you are receiving the \$250.00 deduction for qualified Senior Citizens, Disabled persons, or Surviving Spouse, be on alert for the PD5 form in the mail. This form must be completed and returned to the tax office by March 1st to continue receiving the \$250.00 deduction.

PROPERTY TAX REIMBURSEMENT BOOKS - a.k.a. "Senior Freeze." For residents already enrolled in the program, the State will send you the PTR-2 form directly. For those of you who are not enrolled in the Senior Freeze and who are turning 67+ in 2019, new enrollment books (PTR-1) will be available in the tax office in early April.

ONLINE TAXES - View and/or pay your property taxes online through the borough website at www.haddonhts.com. Now you can see the amount of taxes billed, due, and paid as well as viewing the assessed value of the property.

> ***Reminder: First quarter 2019 tax bills are due February 1st with a 11 day grace period***

Zoning Department

As winter arrives, just a reminder that Borough Code 400-8 states that residents are required to have snow removed from their sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight following a snowfall. Failure to comply can result in injuries to pedestrians from falls or traffic accidents as they may be forced to walk in the street. A snow covered sidewalk creates a particular hardship for seniors and school children. It is also a violation to throw snow into the street. Your cooperation is appreciated.

What's New at the Station?

The annual January train show is over and we are back at work on the new coal mine modules. The track work is complete and we are moving on to scenery and structures. If you have seen the layout and wondered what it takes to make the trains operate, the above picture shows electrical repairs in progress on one of the modules. Overnight Parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications and renewal applications are available at the Borough Offices.
- 2019 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2019.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.

Parking During Snow Emergencies

The Police Department would like to remind residents about NO PARKING regulations during snowstorms:

- When it is snowing between the hours of midnight and 5:00 am ALL motorist are not allowed to park their vehicles on Borough streets.
- Whenever there is a "Snow Emergency" declared by the Borough or a State of Emergency declared regardless of the time of day we will strictly enforce no parking regulations.
- There are several reasons for this strict enforcement, they are: 1) to reduce motor vehicle accidents 2) to keep the road clear for emergency vehicles and key personnel, 3) to keep the roads open for snow plows, allowing them to do a better job clearing the road in a timely manner



incorporation of the Borough of Haddon Heights, townspeople of this community founded its first house of worship-Haddon Heights Baptist Church. On this 121st anniversary of that event, the church would like to present a brief history of its presence here in the borough.

Still Holding Forth "Holding forth the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain." Philippians 2:16

For 121 years Haddon Heights Baptist Church has made it a goal to follow the Word of God in order to be a testimony not only in Haddon Heights but around the world. Without the theme of still holding forth, this would not have been possible. And, that is this church's legacy. Those very words are placed prominently and etched in stone on the front of the Main Auditorium as a reminder of that legacy.



The fellowship began on Sunday, November 22, 1896 when a group of 39 individuals met together to form a Sunday school. After about a year of Sunday afternoon Bible school meetings, this group of believers grew interested in building a local house of worship. Ground was broken, a cornerstone was laid at a property on White Horse Pike in October of 1897, and the chapel was completed to hold its first service on January 8, 1898. A young university graduate named T. Harry Sprague was called to be its first pastor. The following month, on February 26, Haddon Heights Baptist Church was officially incorporated. To make sure the congregation held fast to the Word, the New Hampshire Declaration of Faith was immediately adopted as the church's statement of belief and doctrinal position.

The first thirty years of the church saw steady growth. After services featuring famous evangelist Gypsy Smith were held in Haddon Heights in 1914, the church saw a revival which renewed a commitment to God and His Word. Eight years later, a need for more space arose and the church building

In 1898, four years before the was completely rebuilt and practically doubled in its size. By this point, Dr. A. O. Gilmore was the seventh pastor to faithfully serve, and it was under his ministry that a missionary and evangelistic zeal was born.



In late 1927, Dr. Gilmore resigned after nine years, the longest pastorate to date, in order move on to another ministry, which opened the door to Rev. Louis C. Allen. It was said of his pastorate that "the Bible became living and powerful and its influence began to be manifested in their [the members]

Perhaps it was Pastor Allen's leadership and utter devotion to God's Word that prepared the people of the church for what was to come. At midnight on June 2, 1929 a fire broke out in the church basement and quickly spread upstairs. Over twenty area fire departments arrived to help, but after three hours the building was reduced to ashes. The congregation refused to give up on the work being done for Christ, and were determined to rebuild. Only four months later, the Stock Market would crash, sending the country into its worst economic depression. However, God in His sovereignty provided for his people through Mr. and Mrs. Lindsey, members of the church, who gave their own land on Station Avenue for a new building. Ground was broken and by October of 1930 the new building was dedicated. The first year in the new building resulted in continued growth with a period of eight weeks dedicated to prayer with the "intention to hold on in prayer until He does mighty things for His own honor and glory." Pastor Allen resigned in September of 1931 believing that his full time ministry should be that of studying the Word. Without a doubt, Haddon Heights Baptist Church was still holding forth.

A new chapter began at HHBC when the Rev. George A. Palmer became its ninth pastor. Pastor Palmer, along with his passion for reaching the lost, brought with him new, modern methods of evangelism for the church on Station Avenue. Immediately, he began to broadcast Sunday afternoon prayer services on the radio. It was CONTINUED ON PAGE 20...

If you long for the peace of spirit that can come when your body, mind, and spirit are integrated and peaceful, come try Hula! We will learn from Fave Takata, on Tuesdays from February through April. Children are welcome from 4:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m., and adults from 6:00 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.

I can hear you now: Okay, it sounds like something good, but still... WHY would a church host Hula? Isn't a church supposed to be all about spiritual stuff? Well... it isn't a just a gimmick!. We know that life can get really fractured. And when life is fractured, the human spirit gets fractured as well. And when spirits are fractured, all kinds of chaos breaks into our lives. At St. Mary's, we are concerned about chaos. We believe that the church must be engaged in the task of reconciling people to each other and to God. It's all part of helping people move from chaotic lives to peace and reconciliation.

Now Hula isn't our only musical undertaking! On Sunday, February 17th, you can leave the world behind to enjoy a late afternoon free concert of

Beyond Hula dancing and concerts, our doors are always open to those who feel drawn to enter. Now if you or your family have been part of Scouting, there is one more reason you might feel drawn to venture through our doors. It's on Sunday, February 3rd. Our worship service on Scout Sunday will celebrate the energy, the commitment, and the hope brought to us by today's young people. And, yes! There really is much to celebrate! If you have any Scouting connection, come spend some time with our Troop 67 and be reminded of your days of boundless energy and hope!

Before you know it, we will have journeyed from the December holidays to the Lenten season. Last year, for the first time, St. Mary's was part of the "Ashes to Go" program -called by some "Mobile Ashes!" If you are too busy to make it to church, we will be out in the community, distributing ashes on the foreheads of any passers by who want to mark the Lenten Season with ashes, the traditional mark of repentance. Find us on the Corner of Station Avenue & the White Horse Pike, from 7:00 a.m – 9:00 a.m. on Ash Wednesday, March 6th; and on the corner of Atlantic Avenue & Green Street from 2:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.

While many think of Lent as a time to 'give things up", we here at St. Mary's find it a time to take up with new seriousness the work of reconciling people to each other and to God. during this time that the Morning Cheer radio broadcast, one of the earliest Christian radio programs, was begun in the Palmers home on Seventh Avenue with the constant theme of "Jesus Never Fails." A heart for evangelism spread to the young people of the church as they began holding meetings in Clementon Park and elsewhere. This also extended to its support of missionaries. The church had previously only supported two missionaries, but was now adding its support to seven more, with some being sent from its own fellowship.

Pastor Palmer resigned in July 1940 so that he could wholly dedicate himself to the works he had begun. Only a few months later a young and dynamic new pastor would assume the role of shepherd of the church. Kenneth W. Masteller arrived in September 1940 with continued devotion to prayer, evangelism and God's Word. Pastor Masteller stressed the importance of the local church and its ministry to the believer. 1941 saw the first Daily Vacation Bible School, a ministry continued annually 78 years later, which has faithfully reached countless children and women with the Gospel. . By 1942, HHBC officially joined the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches as a restatement of the historic Baptist position.



Numerical growth, as well as spiritual, carried on through World War II, but really began to pick up at the war's end which resulted in the need for a new building. In 1951 the auditorium building was erected. Junior Church was started in 1954 and new Sunday school classes were formed. The Christian Service Volunteers program started then to aid young people who wanted to dedicate their lives to serving Christ. Ground was broken in June of 1959 for a new educational building, which was dedicated to the Lord in October, 1960 with Dr. Charles Ryrie addressing the congregation. James Cairns, the Sunday School Superintendent at the time, remarked, "May God give to each one of us and increasing faithfulness and zeal in holding forth the Word of Life."

In 1962, Irma Sheppard and Helen Abel felt a burden to minister to special needs students and the Shepherds Department was born. A new emphasis on church planting began when the church assisted in starting Berean Baptist in Magnolia in 1961, and started Bethel Baptist in Cherry Hill in 1964. From Bethel came Shawnee Baptist in Shamong in 1976 and from Shawnee came Fellowship Baptist (now Community) of Mt. Laurel in 1981. In 1973, Winslow Baptist Church was started.

1971 and 1972 were active years in the history of our church, as AWANA began. The church helped to found New Life Island, a Christian summer camp, which has ministered to countless children and teens since its opening. Also during this time, Pastor Masteller and a planning committee came together to create a Christian high school. Baptist High School held its first classes in September 1972. Today, children from pre-school up to twelfth grade can get an education consistent with the worldview from the Word of Life. 1972 was also a hard year for the church. In November, after serving faithfully for 32 years, Pastor Masteller resigned after having lead Haddon Heights Baptist in great numerical and spiritual growth.

Under the ministry of Dr. Jack Jacobs, sending out the Gospel through homegrown missionaries continued. In 1974, a 40-foot houseboat called "The Ambassador," built by men from the church, was dedicated to the Lord to be used by Dan and Judy Smith and

family to serve on the Amazon River in Peru.

Pastor Terry Smith's ministry came next, as well as another church plant in Voorhees in 1991. Even today we've seen renewed growth in our young adult and young married couple's ministries as they seek to grow in God's Word.

If God could be so good to the church in the past, why should anyone ever doubt that He wouldn't be in the future? For 121 years, Haddon Heights Baptist Church has been richly blessed by God. As stated in the conclusion of the 80th anniversary booklet, "The faithful hand of a loving and kind God has reached out to His little flock in times of indecision, need and sickness. May this rich heritage continue, and may the inscription over the door forever inspire this congregation to hold forth the Word of Life."

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



Tax-Aide at the Library



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

101 White Horse Pike To Be Rebuilt

Written By Rose Fitzgerald, Historic Preservation Commission On February 25, 2013, an explosion rocked and destroyed the Tudor Revival house at 101 White Horse Pike. Fortunately, no one was killed. The triplex was built as a prestigious single home about 1915 and featured half timbering and a stone foundation. The carriage house was not destroyed in the explosion. The property was eventually sold to Andrew J. Dietz, D.D.S. who has started the new construction and will move his dental office from across the street at 17 White Horse Pike.

Dr. Dietz came before the Historic Preservation Commission for both an informal and formal review before presenting to the Planning Board in the summer of 2017. Since the property is in the White Horse Pike Historic District, the application had to be reviewed even though it was new construction. While new construction is not required to imitate the rest of the buildings in a historic district and can be modern in design and materials. It is a requirement, however, that the new construction be COMPATIBLE in terms of height, setback, materials, proportions, property placement and architectural details. The HPC used the National Trust's guidelines for new construction infill in their debate. The design Dr. Dietz submitted showed a good effort to mimic the Tudor design of the original house by use of fieldstone, stucco, gables and half timbering. The carriage house will be painted to match the new building, the windows restored



and the building will be used for storage. The carriage stop stone along the curb will be reinstalled.

It will be exciting to watch this impressive building come to life and we appreciate Dr. Dietz's determination and efforts to build his own dental office for "Cosmetic & Family Dentistry" in the White Horse Pike Historic District.






