

### 2019 Pet Licensing

Renewal forms for the cat and dog licenses have been mailed and are now due. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is still just \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. To avoid the \$10.00 late fee, license must be issued on or before JUNE 30<sup>th</sup>.

Please note that in order to obtain a license & tag you must provide the Borough with current vaccination information from your veterinarian. Also for the borough to be able to issue the license your pet's rabies vaccination **must not expire before November 1**st. This is a state regulation, if you have questions about the regulation you can find more information about it on the State of NJ's website.

### Letter from the Tax Assessor's Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.



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### What's New at the Station?

Summer is finally here. We continue our repair work on both our 30 year old layout and our 129 year old station, but with the return of good weather it is time to get out and ride some real railroads. There are many opportunities for rail trips in the area and a quick online search will yield current information. The easiest trips are those on New Jersey Transit. The Riverline traces most of the original route of the 1830 Camden and Amboy Railroad from Camden to Bordentown. A quick walk up the hill from the Bordentown Station gets you to historic Bordentown and a number of good places to eat. With the return of service on the Atlantic City Line, you can retrace the route of the 1854 Camden and Atlantic Railroad. Jitneys get you to the boardwalk and casinos.



A trip to Strasburg, PA will get you both the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania and the Strasburg Railroad, along with lots of good places to eat or you can take a picnic lunch along to eat at the picnic grove on the railroad. Other trips include: New Hope & Ivyland, Black River & Western in Ringoes, NJ, and the Wilmington and Western in Delaware. Remember to stay off the tracks and always use caution around operating railroads.

The station will be open for the Fall Festival on October 5 and you are always welcome to stop in Wednesday nights to see the progress.

## PCAST (Person Centered Approaches in School and Transition)

Two of our very own Haddon Heights School District educators, Mr. Michael Celli and Ms. Dana Kahlbom, were selected to present at The Association of People Supporting Employment First (APSE) national conference. This conference highlights best practices in supporting people with disabilities in career planning, supported and customized employment, and transition from school to work.

Mr. Celli and Ms. Kahlbom presented about their trailblazing work in creating the PCAST (Person Centered Approaches in School and Transition) curriculum and elective class. They are the first two

educators in the New Jersey area to create such a class. During their presentation, they shared how to best support students through the use of person centered approaches in the classroom. Through these approaches, students increase meaningful contribution in the IEP process, promote informed decision making and support intentional, thoughtful, transition planning.

They had an audience of well over 40 participants ranging from Educators, Adult Service Supervisors, Employment Coaches/Developers, School Administrators and State Agency Personnel.

Feedback from students who participated in the course is outlined below: PCAST has helped me become more aware of my options that I never knew even existed for me, and it made me want to reorder my priorities as I learned what is really important in all aspects of life. It has guided me in the way that I have a more positive but realistic outlook on things, it made me more confident in things I do but also taught me how to prepare for the real world and be able to advocate for myself.

I enjoyed how it was more personal than most of my classes, I could focus on my work because it grabbed my attention. I also enjoyed the trips, it made me change my decision to not go to college. I enjoyed how since the class was so "person centered" I got to know and trust the teachers, the class became a safe place for me.

PCAST is a helpful course that has guided me to understand what is in my IEP and my modifications and accommodations. It has showed me my options for after high school. This class that helps me realizes who supports me with my education and using skills to advocate for myself for my education and future.

I can come to my teacher for anything and they make me realize how to use my IEP with my subjects and what I'm allowed to use in class.

Even though the path to a good college is hard, the teachers are willing to put in the extra effort to help and make sure we have a better chance to make it into college and live the life we want afterwards.





### **HOW MANY DIFFERENCES CAN YOU FIND?**

Take a look at the two photos below... Both are showing the 600 block of Station Avenue! The historic photo of a parade dates to c.1935. The current photo was taken on May 2, 2019. Up to 17 differences were found, but there may be more!





So what has changed downtown in 85 years? Starting at the left: 1.) There weren't any trees planted in front of the stores; 2.) Parking was diagonal, not parallel to the street; 3.) The Fries Building didn't have any awnings (because it's on the shady side of the street and the main purpose of awnings back then was to keep the sun out of the stores.) 4.) The tall brick building (Borough Hall) was demolished and replaced by the library; 5.) The flagpole is gone; 6.) Historically, the lamp posts only had a single light above; 7.) The third floor apartments above (what is now) C. Len Schmidt and the Haddon Piano School were destroyed by fire on January 4, 1970 -- John Schmidt has a picture of the fire on the wall of his shop! 8.) The street was full of marchers, not cars; 9.) There was no center line dividing the lanes (or honoring our fire fighters); 10.) There was no painted warning about the railroad crossing; 11.) There was no banner strung across the street; 12.) Where there was once a house with trees in its front yard at the end of the block, we now have Borough Hall; 13.) The electric power lines have changed -- they were wrapped around glass insulators at the top of the telephone poles (although you can't see the detail in the current photo, you can see that the center of the tree in front of Painted Treasure has been cut out for the power lines running above); 14.) When the current photo was taken, there were cones in the street, blocking parking spaces; 15.) There was no street furniture historically -- now we have benches and trash cans; 16.) There is no projecting sign for the BAKERY serving home made ice cream (because that storefront is now a dentist's office); 17.) There were transoms (a row of window panes at the top) on the store windows at the right. But one thing that has remained the same through all these years is the W.C. DAVIS PLUMBING, who still occupies that same corner store today, advertising with the same vertical wall sign, although the paint has faded over the years! The company has been in business since 1926. -- Margaret Westfield, HHBPA





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# SHADDON HEIGHTS

### Headed to the shore this summer? Be sure to take reusable bags!

A statewide bill is being considered to ban carry-out plastic bags, Styrofoam food containers, as well as placing a fee on paper carryout bags and require straws to be served only by request. Many shore towns, however, have already passed local ordinances.

One of the main reasons for the ordinances is the plastic pollution that is occurring in our oceans. It is estimated that by the year 2050, there will be more plastic than fish in our oceans, according to a report by the World Economic Forum and the Ellen MacArthur Foundation

Recycling rates for plastic bags vary from 2% to 12%, depending on the source, but clearly it is low. And recycling is costly. The Clean Air Council says that recycling one ton of plastic bags costs \$4,000 while the recycled product can only be sold for \$32.

Approximately 25% of the plastic bags that aren't recycled end up in our waterways and another 37% end up along our roadways as litter according to TerraCycle. The rest end up in landfill.

Many states, along with cities and even a country (Rwanda), have banned plastic bags all together. Some places have taxed plastic bags, reducing their use by as much as 90%. The results have been a cleaner environment.

Plastic bags account for 80% of the grocery bags given out. Using reusable bags is an easy way to help reduce pollution and save clean-up costs.




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### SHHH! IT'S THE LIBRARY'S SILENT ART AUCTION

Weekly Door-to-Door Shopping Ride Services for all Haddon Heights Seniors 60 years of age or certified handicapped.

Because of popular demand, we have made changes to the Haddon Heights Senior and Disabled Bus Calendar. Added were Aldi, Audubon Crossing/Acme and the Deptford Town Center (Christmas Tree Shop and Bed Bath and Beyond) to the Deptford Mall stop. We have also added "Special" Trips to both the Reading Terminal and Amish Market. Deleted were the Cherry Hill Mall and Cooper Towne Center as they were under-utilized; Monday was eliminated as a shopping day.

Shopping time frames have been shortened to 10-12 for single destinations, 10-12:30 when there is the opportunity to visit additional stores during a shopping trip and 10-12:45 to the ShopRite in Brooklawn. The Special Trips are three hours from 10-1.

HOW TO REGISTER: This is a reservation only system for the door-to-door shopping routes. First time riders must call (856) 456-3344 to pre-register for the service.

After this short phone intake, you must call each week to reserve your ride.

All appointments for shopping service rides must be made by calling (856) 456-1148 between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. the working day before your trip. Follow the instructions to leave a message for the shopping program. Speak slowly and clearly. Give your name, address with city, phone number and the day of the route.

Please note that the Special Bus Trips to the Reading Terminal and the Amish Market are limited to a maximum of 24 people with no wheelchairs and 22 people if two use wheelchairs; first come first served. These trips will have a single pickup location at Stanfill Towers. To reserve a seat, please contact the Heights Senior Resource Center at (856) 546-2490, no later than one week before the trip.

HOW THIS IS FUNDED: Tuesday, Thursday and Special Trips are paid for by the Stanfill Towers Board. There is no donation requested.

The Wednesday rides to ShopRite in Brooklawn and the Friday ride to Walmart in Somerdale remain courtesy of the Senior Citizens United Community Services Sen-Han program, and will continue. A \$2 donation is suggested per one way ride.
