MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Neighbors:

Here we are in August, on the back half of summer, wondering where summer has gone. It seems to be flying by once again. I want to thank Councilwoman Egbert for her hard work on our annual 4th of July parade. After the pandemic canceled last year's events, it proved quite the feat to organize this year. And I know she could not have done it alone. I want to thank all of our volunteers, Joe Magee, Bob Hunter, Trish Shields, the DPW, the Police Department, our office staff, Kelly Santosusso, Marian Hauser, and Julie Yuhaze. This year we also saw the return of our annual Firecracker 5k hosted by the Haddon Heights Municipal Alliance. Great job to all of our volunteers on organizing this once again. Speaking of the Municipal Alliance, just a friendly reminder that they will be once again hosting the annual National Night Out on August 3rd from 6 - 9 pm at the McLaughlin-Norcross Memorial Dell. Please come out for some great family-friendly fun.

With August upon us, there is still time to catch one or two of the remaining concerts at the Dell. Camden County's summer concert series will be hosting Sammy Rae & the Friends on August 4th with special guest Hotsy Totsy. And the series comes to a close on August 18th with Katie Pruitt and special guest Andrea Nardello. These are excellent opportunities to get out and enjoy some of the last days of summer with friends and family. I hope to see you there. The concerts start at 7 pm.

Now I know the hot topic in town has been recycling and trash pick-up. Like many of you, I am just as frustrated about the current failure by our private hauler, Seaside-SJ Sanitation, to make collections in a timely fashion. Let me assure Mayor and Council have been working tirelessly to rectify the issue. To date, we have been fining them every late or missed pickup. In addition, on two occasions where we utilized our neighboring communities of Audubon and

Haddonfield to complete the pickups, we deducted their costs from the hauler's monthly contracted fee. We have since met with the owner of the company, his outside counsel, and their performance bond carrier to lay out our expectations in the future and how they will be further penalized when they fail to perform. Our expectations include securing a secondary hauler to collect in Heights as needed. Please continue working with us and report collection issues to our DPW or myself via email at mayor@haddonhts.com. On one final note, I want to clarify that our trash and recycling collection is entirely separate from the merger of our Height's DPW with Audubon in 2020. A private company has collected the trash in Haddon Heights since the late 80s and recycling sometime in the late 90s early 2000s. Our shared DPW continues to do a fantastic job and has been crucial to ensuring pickups when Seaside-SJ Sanitation misses them. And we thank them for that.



As always, please look for more frequent updates from us at Mayor on Council by following along on social media, our website, and ultimately joining us for a Council Meeting on the First and Third Tuesdays of the month. They are currently conducted by zoom with the link found on the Borough website, and we hope to return in person very soon.

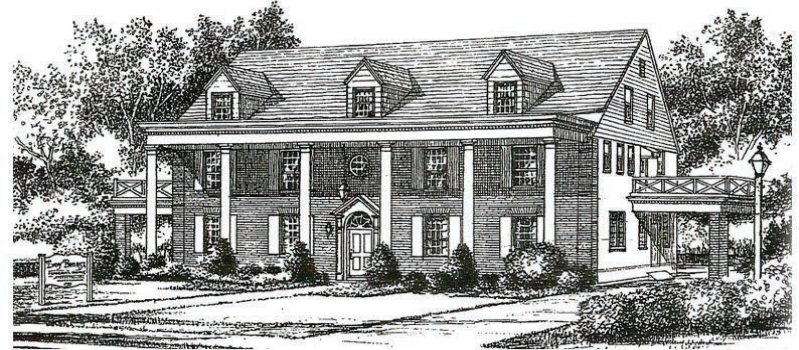

What's New at the Station

What's New at the Station: If you were downtown during June or July you may have seen the ladders and other equipment at the station. The contractors have repaired the slate roof and chimney. Age and storm damage are once again catching up with our 131 year old building. As you may guess, finding contractors to repair a slate roof or correctly repair such an old chimney is difficult. We are fortunate to have found contractors specializing in historic preservation work. All work is done in compliance with the Secretary of the Interior Historic Preservation Standards and so maintains the integrity of the station. The adjacent picture shows the roofers at work. Preservation work continues into the Fall with foundation and sill repair scheduled.

We have received numerous inquiries about opening the station to see our layout. Writing this article in June, we hope to be open for the October 2 Fall Festival. In conjunction with the Fall Festival will be a birthday party for the station that was planned for Down by the Station Day in May 2020 but had to be postponed due to Covid. The event will be coordinated with both the West Jersey Chapter-National Railway Historical Society and Heights Historic League. Hopefully things will take place as planned. Current information can be found on our Facebook page as well as pictures of the ongoing layout work. We plan to be open in November and January as part of Model Railroad Open House tours as well.

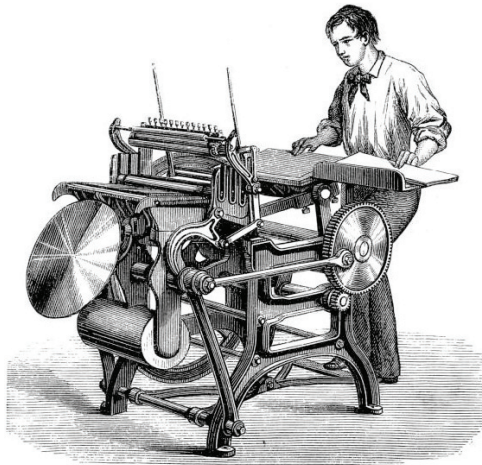

Historic Preservation Commission

FRESH OFF THE PRESS!!

On Thursday, September 23 at 7:00 p.m. in the Borough Hall, the Historic Preservation Commission will present the newly published DESIGN GUIDELINES for All Historic Properties. The Design Guidelines have been created by Donna Ann Harris of Heritage Consulting who is a preservation planner with 35 years of experience with downtowns and historic sites. Donna produced this high-quality book specifically for historic properties and historic districts in Haddon Heights with consultation with the HPC. Donna will give the presentation.



The Design Guidelines have been created using the Borough's Historic Preservation Ordinance which directed the HPC to draw up design guidelines and the U.S. Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. The document was entirely financed by a grant from the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office, DEP.

Dozens of buildings have already been restored in Haddon Heights using these guidelines but this book should make the job easier for anyone who wants to restore their old property, whether or not they live in a historic district. The Design Guidelines features many of the restored stores and homes in Haddon Heights. The Design Guidelines will be available in paper for reference at the Borough Hall and Library and online at the Borough website after September 24. All are welcome to attend the presentation.

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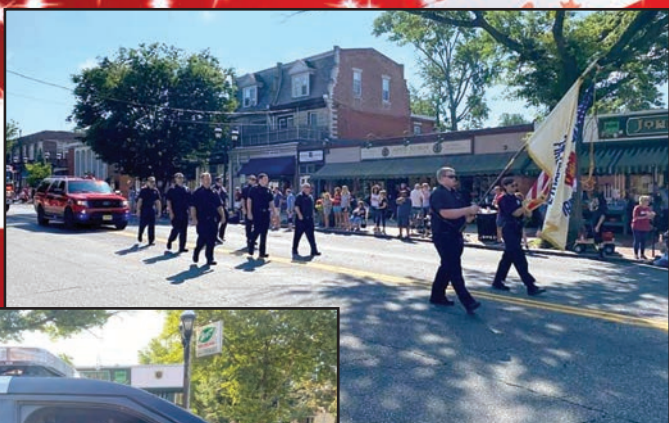

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Tax Assessor's Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday.

This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge. A NEW ANCHOR TO THE WHITE HORSE PIKE HISTORIC DISTRICT
Jared Willmann, the new owner of 617 White Horse Pike, has purchased this important 1920's bungalow as the new home of Byron Home. Byron Home, which had been located in Barrington, provides a service "Helping Seniors Downsize and Move." His company has been busy rehabbing the property and received HPC permission to replace the 100 old shingles which were too deteriorated to fix. They replaced the shingles in kind. They plan to keep the well-shrubbed parking lot.

This building, as the last home on the White Horse Pike, is an important anchor for the Historic District and exemplifies the last building style on the Pike. It welcomes you to Haddon Heights. Houses on the Pike started with the first block, #2, in late Victorian style, continued with Italianate, shingle, American Foursquare, colonial revival, then finished off with the bungalows that were built before The Great Depression stopped the building until 1950.
