Project Medicine Drop

For too many New Jerseyans, addiction begins in the medicine cabinet.

The New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs has developed Project Medicine Drop as an important component of its effort to halt the abuse and diversion of prescription drugs. It allows consumers to dispose of unused and expired medications anonymously, seven days a week, 365 days a year, at "prescription drug drop boxes" located within the headquarters of participating police departments.


Each Project Medicine Drop box is installed indoors, affixed to the floor or wall in a secure area within police department headquarters, within view of law enforcement officers, in an area to which members of the public may be admitted to dispose of their unused medications. Their prominent "Project Medicine Drop" logos make the boxes highly visible and recognizable.

This initiative builds on the success of the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration's National Take Back Initiative, and the American Medicine Chest Challenge, which is sponsored in New Jersey by the DEA, Partnership for a Drug Free New Jersey, and Sheriffs' Association of New Jersey. Both programs provide single-day opportunities to drop off unused medications at pre-identified, secure locations.

Project Medicine Drop provides the opportunity to discard unused prescription medications every day throughout the year. The participating police agencies maintain custody of the deposited drugs, and dispose of them according to their normal procedures for the custody and destruction of controlled dangerous substances. They report the quantity of discarded drugs to the Division of Consumer Affairs on a quarterly basis.

You can find a Prescription Drug Drop Box at the Haddon Heights Borough Hall downstairs by the Police Department.

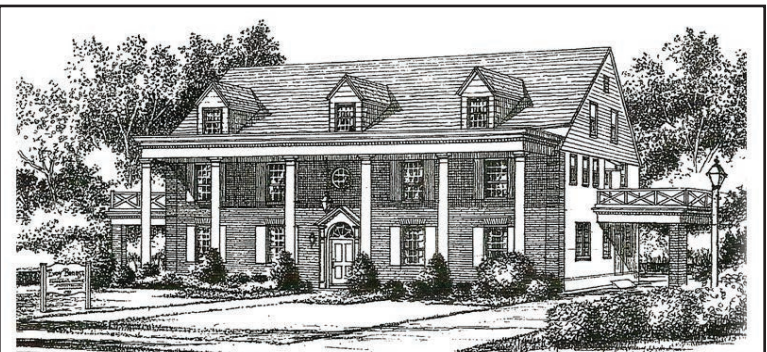
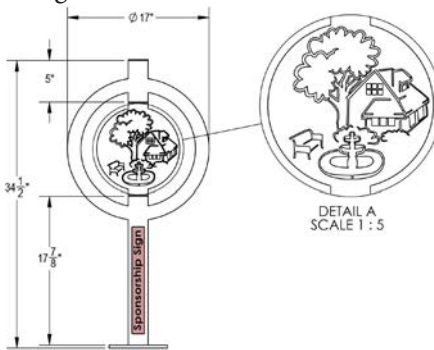

No Smoking or Vaping on Borough Property

Haddon Heights passed ORDINANCE 2021:1503 on April 20, 2021. ORDINANCE 2021:1503 prohibits Smoking or Vaping on Borough owned or controlled property was ordained by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Haddon Heights in accordance with N.J.S.A 40:48-2 to preserve public health, safety and welfare.

As such, Smoking or Vaping Activity is prohibited in the following areas:

- No person shall engage in Smoking or Vaping on any property owned or controlled by the Borough of Haddon Heights.
- No person shall engage in Smoking or Vaping in any public park, ballfield, playground, courts, trails, or grounds, including sidewalks immediately adjacent to said property.
- No person shall engage in Smoking or Vaping on or in any public, elementary school or school property, regardless of whether the area is an indoor public place or outdoor public place, including sidewalks immediately adjacent to said property.
- No person shall engage in Smoking or Vaping in any public building or facility in the Borough of Haddon Heights.

There will be posting signs which clearly, sufficiently and conspicuously posted where smoking and vaping is prohibited and the signs shall state "100% Smoke Free Public Property" or substantially similar language. Enforcement of this ordinance will be carried out by the Police Department and any municipal officer charged with code enforcement. Penalties will apply to any offender which violates any provision of this chapter and the violator will be subject to fines as follows:

- A fine of no less than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the first offense.
- A fine of no less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the second offense;
- A fine of no less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the third offense and all subsequent offenses.



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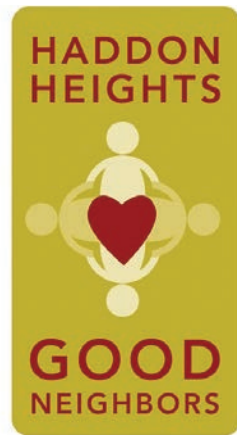
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What's New at the Station

By the time you read this we will have had our first open houses in two years. The Club had the doors open and trains running as part of the annual Fall Festival celebration. We were again open as part of Camden County History Month on October 30. This event focused on celebrating the 130th birthday of the station. The building was constructed in 1890 by the Lippincott family as an inducement for the Atlantic City Railroad to make the town a station stop on the railroad. This was an important factor in the town's development. The festivities included a cake cutting, a brief history of the railroad, and a presentation by the West Jersey Chapter-National Railway Historical Society on South Jersey Railroad Structures at the library. Cooperation with historic societies is an important part of our activities. The West Jersey Chapter has published award winning books on railroad activities in South Jersey. The various historical societies, focused on specific railroads, are prime sources of information for accurate model railroading. Sources of wintertime reading on railroads can be easily found on the various society websites. 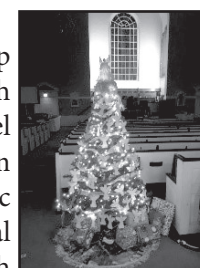

The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge. 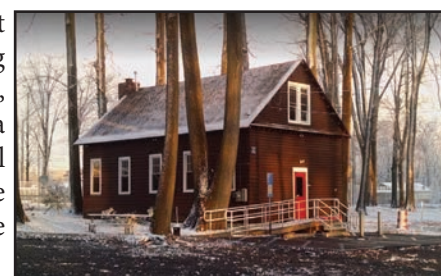

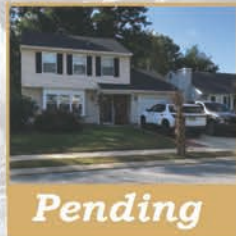
