

Animal Licensing Requirement

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats! It is the law and mandatory that Borough Administration Office. In dog and cat owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times.

Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog.

Animal License Renewal Letters were mailed out in January, if you



order to get your animal licensed for the 2021 calendar year the office staff will need to see your pet's proof of rabies vaccination. The vaccination will need to be good through November 2021 for a license to be issued. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a nonspayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00.

License Fees support the efforts of many local animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control.

Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State Statues pertaining to Animal Cruelty. The information can be found at the New Jersey Department of Health website (www.state.nj.us/ health) for the State Statues listed below.

- 4:22-26 Penalties for various acts constituting cruelty

Tax Assessor's Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge. 

Historic Preservation Commission

Design Guidelines for Haddon Heights' Historic Buildings and Districts

Last year, the Borough was awarded a Certified Local Government grant to produce a design guidelines book to assist owners of properties in the Borough's historic districts and its historic landmarks. The project was put out to bid and Donna Ann Harris of Heritage Consulting, Inc. was awarded the contract to produce the guide. Ms. Harris is no stranger to Haddon Heights as, in 1984 fresh out of Columbia University's Historic Preservation Program and working for the National Trust for Historic Preservation, she advised the HPC in their protest of the demolition of Six White Horse Pike. More recently she also produced the heritage tourism assessment for the Glover Fulling Mill Grant in 2012.

Using Zoom, the HPC has met monthly with Donna to review the work product. The book is currently being reviewed in the N.J. Historic Preservation Office. A public presentation of the Design Guidelines will be held in September. All will be welcome to attend, whether or not you live in a historic district. The Design Guidelines will be available to all on the Borough's website for downloading. Print copies will be available for reference at the Borough Hall and Library in the summer. Here's a sample page:

What Kind of Changes Does the HPC Review? All actions that affect the exterior of an historic landmark or an improvement within an historic district shall be reviewed by the HPC. Some require a building permit, while others do not

require a building permit, while others do not. Review shall be required for, but not limited to, the following work when visible from the public right of way:

- Demolition or relocation of any building, site, or object in an historic district or an historic landmark.
- Roofing: any change including repair or replacement of the roof, and/or installation of solar panels.
- Wall cladding: any change including repair or replacement of wall cladding and/or installing synthetic siding (vinyl, aluminum, cementitious board, etc.).
- Windows: any change including repair or

replacement of windows and/or installation of shutters if they are not original to the structure.

- Doors: any change including repair or replacement of doors.
- Gutters, downspouts, or other parts of the water conduction system: any change including repair or replacement of any part of the water conduction system.
- Porch: any change including repair or replacement of the porch.
- Signs: any change including a new installation and/or repair or replacement of signs.
- Storefronts, store entrances, and upper stories of commercial buildings: any change including repair or replacement of storefronts, store entrances, and upper stories
- Lighting: any change, including installation, and/or repair to exterior lighting, either mounted on the building and/or in the landscape.
- Landscape: any change including installation, repair, or replacement of stoop, steps, walls, ornamental or other fences, retaining walls, driveways, sidewalks, parking areas, or trees.
- Garages and other secondary buildings or structures: any change including repair or replacement of a garage or other secondary building or structure.
- Building additions, alterations, new construction, zoning variances, and/or subdivision site plans: any new work or change including installation, repair, or replacement.

Some changes do not require a building permit but still must be reviewed by the Historic Preservation Commission. If you're wondering whether your project requires review, please contact the Service Operations Facility staff at 856-546-2580.
