Historic Preservation Commission

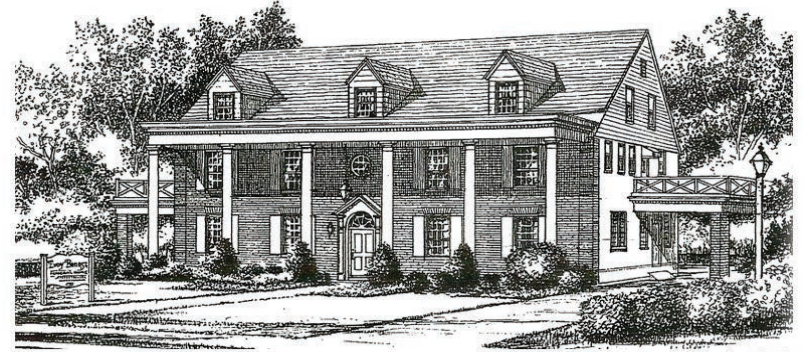

Overnight Parking:

DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those leaves that are blocked.
- DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed.

West side (10th Avenue to Black Horse Pike) will be Thursday, October 28th.

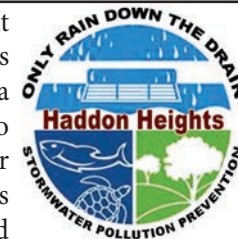

Stormwater Management

We would like to take a few moments and talk to you about the importance of stormwater management. Haddon Heights is a watershed. What does this mean? A watershed is an area of land that water flows through or over and then drains into a body of water. It may drain into a small stream, lake, river or even the ocean. Remember even though the water leaves Haddon Heights it is our responsibility to keep it clean and healthy. Stormwater ends up in our streams, lakes, and potentially our drinking water. Here are some examples on how to keep our waterways clean.



Stormwater flows over our streets, lawns and pretty much every area at a lower elevation. It picks up debris from the roads such as trash, oil, pesticides, animal waste, sediment and anything else on the road it can carry. To help limit the impact here are several examples you can follow. Limit the amount of fertilizer you put on your lawn. Do not fertilize right before it rains and pick up after your pet as pet waste contains harmful bacteria and parasites. Always place trash in the proper receptacle and never throw cigarette butts in the street. One cigarette butt can take up to 25 years to fully break down. Any and all trash not properly disposed of can kill or harm our wildlife. We have an abundance of wildlife in our area such as ducks, eagles, hawks, turkeys, deer and let's not forget about the many species of fish and turtles.

This time of year is it especially important. Do not blow your grass clippings into the street and please put your leaves on the curb, not in the street. Natural and organic debris flows into our streams and lakes. It will spike nitrogen and phosphorus levels in the water and cause algae blooms. This lowers the oxygen level in the water killing aquatic life and growing toxic bacteria.

All it takes is a little effort to make a big difference. Help protect our waterways and our wildlife for years to come.

The Council Corner

The Haddon Heights Council is hard at work on various projects and initiatives to help maintain and enhance our wonderful community. The 'Council Corner' shares an abbreviated summary of some of the ongoing initiatives members of Council are working on.

We know that Haddon Heights is a great place to live and work; however, the time is now to revive some of the existing real estate in order to promote growth and development, as we have seen many surrounding towns accomplish in recent years. Mayor and Council recognize the importance of maintaining the historic nature of the Borough while bringing new life to its commercial areas. The intention is to strike the right balance to ensure the town thrives. In early April, the Borough entered into a shared services agreement with the Camden County Improvement Authority. This decision was made for the management of the Borough's planned redevelopment and rehabilitation in various areas of town, including Station Avenue, the White Horse Pike and the Black Horse Pike. Initial meetings occurred this summer and in August, Pennoni Associates Inc., which is very experienced with these types of projects, was retained. The redevelopment and rehabilitation studies will begin this fall and the resulting reports are expected to be presented at public meetings in early spring, 2022.

The Finance and Engineering Committees have been working to establish a plan to make much needed improvements to our roads and sewer system. Council just passed a bond ordinance that will allow this process to begin in the very near future with the paving of some of the roads in town that are most in need of improvements. Furthermore, in collaboration with the Planning Board, Council is working on finalizing a new sign ordinance.

In other news, Council is carefully determining if, where, and to what extent marijuana businesses should be allowed in town. There will be further discussion on this matter in the coming weeks and months.

Council is very excited to announce that we expect the tradition of the Holiday Parade along Station Avenue to commence again this year! Decorated firetrucks, vehicles, and even Santa himself, will light up the holiday season in Haddon Heights once again. We all hope to see you there!

What's New at the Station

The summer has been a busy construction season at the station. As some of you have noted, ladders and a HyLyft have been seen working on our chimney and roof. All of the storm damage from last March has been repaired and a new top to the chimney and cap have been installed. A very busy and expensive process, but the leaks are gone, and the chimney is safe for the heating season.

As I write this in late August, there are three events planned for October and November. With all of the Covid uncertainty, I will list them as proposed and we will see if they actually take place. The station will be open on October 2nd as part of the planned Fall Festival. We will also be open on Saturday, October 30 as part of a rescheduled 130th birthday party for the station. This should have happened on Down by the Station Day in 2020 but that was canceled. The event is sponsored by the Heights Heritage League as part of Camden County History Month. The station will open in the morning at 9:30. Rose Fitzgerald will be officiating as Mrs. Lippincott for a cake cutting and brief history of the station and railroad will take place at the station at 10. The West Jersey Chapter-National Railway Historical Society will present South Jersey Railroad Structures From A to Z at the library starting at 11. The trains will be running until 3 pm. On November 20 the station will be open from noon to 5 pm as part of the annual November Model Railroad Open House layout tours. Hopefully the events will take place as scheduled and we can catch up with all of you in the Fall. You can keep up with both layout progress and events on our Facebook page.

When you read this quote, you start to understand how the Haddon Heights Good Neighbors Program operates. 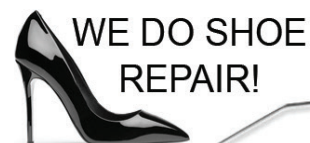

4. WHAT IF I ALWAYS VOTE BY MAIL, BUT NOW WANT TO VOTE EARLY, IN PERSON, INSTEAD?

- Check whether or not you are an active vote-by-mail voter at Vote.NJ.Gov, under "Track My Ballot"
- If you are registered to vote by mail in the 2021 General Election, you must opt out, in order to cast a ballot in person on a machine at an early voting location. To opt out, contact your County Clerk by August 31.

Main Street Planters provides seasonal planters for downtown businesses and local homeowners. From 'greening up' the local eatery's outdoor seating to enhancing the curb appeal of neighborhood homes, the owner, Cyndy Mullineaux sees the value in how seasonal planters can make a community a more livable, beautiful place where everyone will want to spend time.

Main Street Planters was launched in the spring of 2020. The pandemic, then new, proved a challenge at first, but as we all know many of us were spending a whole lot more time around the house. In that first year Heights locals were so supportive of this new business as they considered how to make the most of time spent at home. This year Cyndy is seeing an increase in downtown business customers in Heights, Haddonfield, Collingswood, and Haddon Township.

Main Street's seasonal planter services have optional subscription and maintenance plans. They also offer garden consultations for homeowners looking to do their own DIY (Do-It-Yourself) garden projects, but don't know where to start. The service comes complete with sourcing and delivery of plants. Cyndy enjoys sharing her horticultural knowledge

After years of working in wholesale nurseries in Cumberland, Salem, Burlington counties Cyndy is grateful Main Street Planters affords her the opportunity to work out of her home and use her horticultural knowledge volunteering in the community.



Appeal for Emergency Roof Repairs for Peter Mott House



This is our history too. The land that became Haddon Heights was settled by Quakers about 1700. The original plantation owners held slaves for a few years but the Society of Friends in Germantown (the Quakers) had already moved to ban slavery in 1688. In 1788, Haddonfield Meeting banned slaveholders from its membership made a minute "No negroes held in bondage amongst us." The enslaved people were freed, one by one, either by their masters or by the Quakers buying their freedom and were settled on land in nearby areas such as Lawnside and Saddlertown. No man, woman or child was held in

bondage in (later) Haddon Heights but the abolition work continued for another 65 years.

The Lawnside Historical Society, Inc. completed restoration work on the Peter Mott House Underground Railroad Museum 19 years ago and opened the historic site to the public. It is listed on the New Jersey and National Register of Historic Places.

They are asking for contributions to install a new cedar shingle roof on the Mott House, which has started to leak. A conservative estimate for this work is more than \$35,000. While the site is closed to the public because of the pandemic, this is the perfect time to have this work done to reopen the house soon. Thank you.

Tax Assessor's Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.
