

Hello neighbors! This is the final Council Corner article of 2022 so the Mayor and Council would like to acknowledge the time and years of dedication to our community by Councilman Scott Schrieber. Thank you, Councilman Schrieber - you will be missed.

The Haddon Heights Fire Department and the Barrington Fire Department are working on a shared services agreement that will result in more comprehensive and efficient services for the town.

The Engineering Committee is pleased to report progress on several construction projects throughout the borough. Currently, construction is underway on several projects throughout town. The Haddon Heights Roads Program is starting construction with repaying a portion of 11th Street (Glover to Green), Maple Ave, Bradshaw Street (Crest to Gladstone) & First Avenue (Highland to High). Construction is anticipated to be complete by the end of the calendar year.

Phase III of the Devon Avenue project is also anticipated to start construction in the next few weeks. This project is funded through the NJDOT Municipal Aid Funding. Further, the County's Pedestrian Improvements Project is projected to start in the spring. Please visit the borough website for additional information. We look forward to these projects being constructed and additional projects progressing from design to construction in the coming months – stay tuned!

As part of a Tri-Party Agreement between Haddon Heights Mayor and Council, the Haddon Heights Board of Education, and the Haddon Heights Soccer Club, improvements are coming to the varsity and junior varsity soccer fields at Devon Avenue. Improvements will consist of remedial grading to eliminate low spots and improve drainage and the complete sodding of these two fields. The members of the Tri-Party Agreement are working towards having these improvements installed as soon as possible with the intention that the new sod will be ready for play in the Spring of 2023!

The Borough will begin pickleball striping on two existing tennis courts at Devon Avenue this fall. The new red pickleball strips will be added to the two tennis courts closest to the basketball court. In addition to the new overlay stripping, two new net anchors (one at each end of exiting net) will be provided at each of the pickleball courts to allow the nets to be set level for pickleball play.

Finally, we look forward to seeing the community at the annual Haddon Heights Holiday Parade on Friday, November 25th at 6pm along Station Avenue.

This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker (Judi), Jeffery Scott Pierson (Scott), and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge. 

Julia is so excited to continue this work as the new caretaker of My Fair Trade Lady! After many years of teaching, she felt connected to Donna's academic background and her passion for affecting change. In addition to teaching, Julia has also spent years as a labor doula, working with pregnant people to create a safe, positive birthing experience both locally and abroad. She has been privileged to work at birth centers in Uganda and Guatemala, experiences



that simultaneously broadened her understanding of how the global trade industry looks in developing countries.

Julia has a lab/dachshund mix named Jedi and 3 children (Violet 6, Liam 8, and Ryan 16). Her husband Patrick Mooney is a history teacher at Moorestown High School. Julia and her family are thrilled to be a part of My Fair Trade Lady!




