Requirement of Animal Licensing

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats!


It is the law and mandatory that dog and cat owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times.

Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a

rabid cat or dog.

Animal License Renewal

com, under Forms & Permits or you can contact the Borough Administration Office. 856-547-7164 ext. 2. In order to get your animal licensed for the 2022 calendar year the office staff will need to see your pet's proof of rabies vaccination. The vaccination will need to be good through November 1, 2022 for a license to be issued. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. Please obtain your 2022 License on or before June 30th to avoid the \$10.00 late fee.

License Fees support the efforts of many local animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control.

Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State Statues pertaining to Animal Cruelty. The information can be found at the New Jersey Department of Health website (www.state.nj.us/health) for the State Statues listed below.

The Engineering Committee is headed out to bid on two exciting construction projects in the months of May/June with an anticipated late summer/fall construction season. The first is the Haddon Heights Roads Program to repave and reconstruct portions of four streets in town - 11th, Maple, Bradshaw and First Avenues. While there are many streets that are in town in need of repaving, we are excited to be able to chip away at some of those in need and look forward to being able to repave more in future years.

Additionally, we were awarded a Community Development Block Grant through the Camden County Improvement Authority to replace nearly 100 handicap ramps at intersections on Borough owned roads that are in close proximity to schools and parks. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office



Historic World War I Monument

This beautiful tribute to the men and women of our town, who volunteered during the First World War, is located at the Haddon Heights 'gateway' corner of West Atlantic Avenue and Kings Highway. It was erected by the Haddon Heights Branch of the American Red Cross. As a part of the annual Memorial Day parade and ceremonies, VFW Post 1958 and American Legion #149 participate, sometimes with the Haddon Heights High School band playing, as these groups march down W. Atlantic Ave. and then down Station Ave. Traditionally, in the morning, the Parade begins here at this memorial, where there is a small ceremony and people, usually belonging to the American



Legion, lay memorial wreaths. Then parade marches down to the cannons for a ceremony dedicated to those Haddon Heights sons and daughter who fought during WWII. The memorial reads: IN HONOR OF OUR SONS AND DAUGHTERS WHO ENTERED THE WAR TO ENSURE PEACE THROUGHOUT THE WORLD, 1917 WORLD WAR 1918.
