MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Neighbors:

Where has summer gone once again? I can't believe we are into August already. However, don't fret; we still have several great events from now through September. To start, if you haven't caught a concert at the McLaughlin Norcross Memorial Dell, I encourage you to check out the Camden County Sundown Music Series. On August 3rd, we will be featuring Jukebox the Ghost & Carly Moffa, August 24th features Kathleen Edwards and Shannen Moser, and we close out the series on September 7th with Richard Thompson and Jonah Tolchin. Camden County has also introduced local craft brewers and food trucks to the event this year. I hope to see you and your family there. Also kicking off August, the Municipal Alliance, in conjunction with our Haddon Heights Police Department, will be hosting National Night Out on Tuesday, August 2nd at the McLaughlin Norcross Memorial Dell. This event is from 6 - 9 PM and is a great night of family fun. Finally, keep your eye on the Borough website and our social media for other events in September like the annual Spaghetti Dinner and Sippin' on Station.

Thank you to Councilwoman Egbert for her hard work on our 4th of July parade and the Municipal Alliance hosting the Firecracker

5K. Once again, both were incredible. I also want to thank all of our volunteers, especially Joe Magee, Bob Hunter, Trish Shields, Andrea and Matt Pagan, the DPW, the Police Department, and our Borough office staff, for their hard work in supporting Councilwoman Egbert and making these events possible. Just about every event in town runs on the support of volunteers; without you, Heights would not be Heights.

I am also excited to announce that Heights received the third largest award through the NJ DOT Safe Routes to School program. We received \$1.2 million to add and repair sidewalks throughout town. A ton of hard work goes into writing and executing these grants, and I want to thank Councilwoman Kate Russo, who chairs our Engineering Committee, along with Steve Bach, our Borough Engineer, for their work on this project. This grant and our 2021 Community Development Block grant for \$250,000 will help complete several pedestrian improvements around town.

I am also excited to announce that Haddon Heights and our neighbors of Barrington and Haddonfield were the recipients of a \$75,000 Local Efficiency Achievement Plan (LEAP) Challenge grant to conduct

an emergency services study and creation of an implementation plan. The study will focus on fire and EMS services and look at call volume data, response times, finances, operations, and more to drive better decision-making and increase public safety. I cannot thank Mayor Colleen Bianco Bezich of Haddonfield enough for taking the lead and writing this grant for our three towns.

Two congratulations are in order. The first and most notable around town is the Haddon Heights High School Girls Softball Team, who not only won the Group 2 State Championship but also defeated some of the most highly ranked teams in the state to win the Tournament of Champions for the first time. They closed out their season ranked #1 in the state. On behalf of Haddon Heights, congratulations girls, we loved following your success and cheering you on, and we look forward to next season.

Finally, I want to take this opportunity to congratulate Chief Michael Scardino on finishing his Haddon Heights Police Department career. Chief Scardino will work his final shift on August 26th. Chief Scardino has been an incredible leader for our department and shaped the careers of



many of our future leaders at the Haddon Heights PD. On a personal note, Chief Scardino was one of the first people I worked with during my time as Mayor, and I have learned a lot from him. I would say that much of my success over the last two years is due to his guidance and wisdom. I hope you can join us at our September 6th meeting, where we will honor the Chief.

As always, please look for more frequent updates from us at Mayor on Council by following along on social media, our website, and ultimately joining us for a Council Meeting on the First and Third Tuesdays of the month. We are in person once again, so come out and join us. I am also always happy to meet with anyone in person to discuss concerns or answer questions. 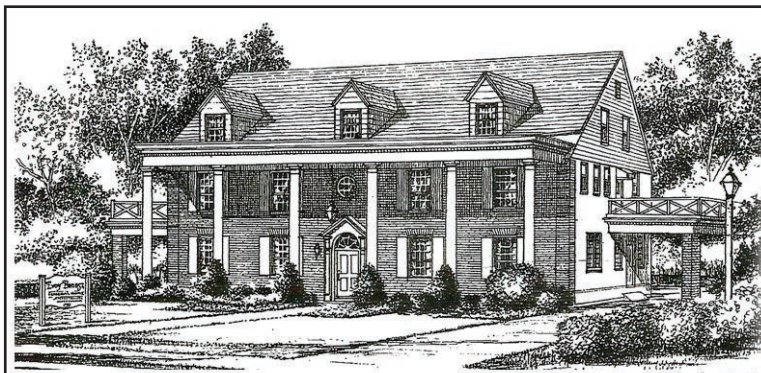
HHGN is NOT to be confused with the Haddon Heights Neighbors (Night Out) organization whose mission is different than ours although BOTH benefit our town. Another way to help HHGN financially is through the AmazonSmile program. If you are not familiar with AmazonSmile, it's a 501(c)(3) private foundation created by Amazon. When first visiting AmazonSmile, you will be prompted to select a charitable organization from almost one million eligible organizations. In order to browse or shop at AmazonSmile, customers must first select a charitable organization. Please select Haddon Heights Good Neighbors. For eligible purchases at AmazonSmile, the AmazonSmile Foundation will donate 0.5% of the purchase price to the customer's selected charitable organization. Tax Assessor's Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property unannounced in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker, Jeffery Scott Pierson, Michael Colavecchio and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.

What's New at the Station



Summer is just about over and the Fall model train season will be upon us. We are planning on opening the station several times over the coming months to show the progress on the various new

modules but have not set the dates yet. You can follow our slow but steady progress on track work and scenery as well as open house dates on our Facebook page. We have met some new junior model railroaders during our Wednesday night meetings as they enjoy ice cream in the park. You may have also noticed that the old and decayed telephone pole is gone from the walk. Thanks to Conrail for the safety improvement.

We are currently working on two projects in cooperation with the West Jersey Chapter-National Railway Historical Society. The first is a historical review of the freight station and associated tracks. Historically the freight station had a team track for local service and a spur that crossed West Atlantic Avenue to serve a coal dock and Haddon Heights Lumber Company at various times. The second is documenting the triple track arrangement from Haddon Heights to Magnolia that provided a center main track for express passenger service to Atlantic City and Cape May. Tracks on either side of the main provided local service that did not interfere with the express service. Vestiges of this track work can be found in the wide right of way through the area. Summer passenger service to the shore was big business in the early decades of the twentieth century. We will post details on these projects as progress is made and hopefully will result in a presentation at the Library.

Mayor and Council are pleased to announce

that the Borough of Haddon Heights has been notified that we were awarded a grant in the amount of \$1,200,000 for the installation of missing sidewalks throughout the borough. The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) announced \$19.6 million for 31 grants under the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Program. The grant awarded to the Borough of Haddon Heights was the largest of the seven grants that were awarded in the DVRPC region, which includes Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, and Mercer counties in New Jersey and was the third largest of the 31 grants awarded overall.

“The Safe Routes to School program is a great example of how NJDOT, working with the state’s three regional planning authorities, helps our communities access federal funding for local transportation projects,” NJDOT Commissioner Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti said. “These grants will provide resources to improve sidewalks and bike paths to encourage children to stay active by walking and biking to school.”

SRTS is a federally-funded program to help local governments to make pedestrian safety improvements near K-8 schools. The program was created to encourage children, including those with disabilities, to walk and bike to school. The goal is to make bicycling and walking to school a safer and more appealing transportation alternative, encouraging a healthy and active lifestyle from an early age.

The Borough of Haddon Heights established our Safe Routes to School Committee in summer of 2017 and has been awarded Gold Status based on the number and quality of programs in Haddon Heights. The SRTS Committee has organized regular activities in coordination with Cross County Connections Transportation Management Association (TMA) such as the National Walk & Bike to School Days, the Bicycle Rodeo and the Golden Sneaker Challenge. In addition, we published the Haddon Heights School Travel Plan (June 2018).

A School Travel Plan is a document that helps to identify student walking and bicycling travel corridors (through student locations, crash data analysis, and existing pedestrian and bicycling infrastructure) and recommends infrastructure improvements to make the travel corridors safer for students. For example, this summer, ADA accessible pedestrian ramps will be upgraded at approximately 100 locations as part of the Community Development Block Grant (a separate funding source) to make them compliant with state and local requirements. The Haddon Heights School Travel Plan also identifies locations where sidewalks are missing that are in close proximity to our elementary schools. This inventory in addition to the student travel tallies was used to support the grant application. A copy of the Travel Plan is available at the Haddon Heights Library as well as on our website <https://HaddonHts.com>

The Mayor and Council are excited that the Borough of Haddon Heights has been selected as a recipient of this grant funding to construct missing sidewalks throughout our borough to improve the accessibility of our community. We want to recognize the hard work of our SRTS Committee, who is supported by many local organizations and volunteers including the Haddon Heights Police Department, the Haddon Heights School District, the Haddon Heights Parent Teacher Group (PTG), Cross County Connections TMA, Safe Kids of Southern New Jersey and Heights in Progress (HIP). We also want to give huge thanks to the Haddon Heights Engineering Committee, Borough staff and Councilwoman Kate Russo for their assistance in submitting the grant.

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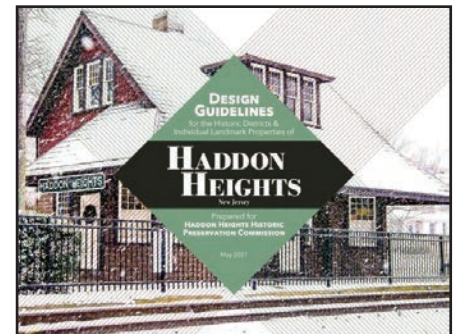

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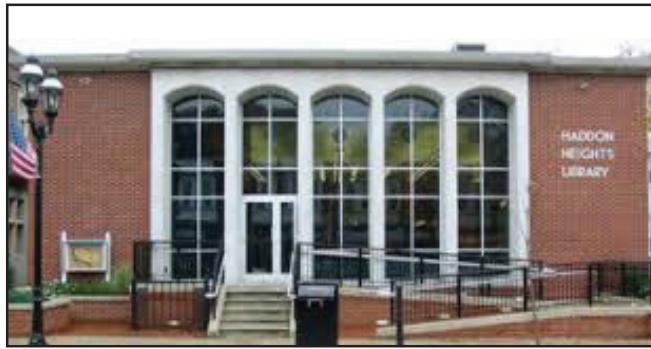

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Requirement of Animal Licensing

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats!

It is the law and mandatory that dog and cat owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times.

Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog.

Animal License Renewal Letters were mailed

out for 2022 renewals. If you did not receive your letter or need a new one, please visit www.haddonhts.com, under Forms & Permits or you can contact the Borough Administration Office. 856-547-7164 ext. 2. In order to get your animal licensed for the 2022 calendar year the office staff will need to see your pet's proof of rabies vaccination. **The vaccination will need to be good through November 1, 2022 for a license to be issued.** The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. Please obtain your 2022 License on or before June 30th to avoid the \$10.00 late fee.

License Fees support the efforts of many local animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control.

Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State Statues pertaining to Animal Cruelty. The information can be found at the New Jersey Department of Health website (www.state.nj.us/health) for the State Statues listed below.

- 4:22-26 Penalties for various acts constituting cruelty
