I am also excited to announce that in a few short months we hope to have exercise equipment installed in and around Hoff's Park for the enjoyment of our community. This equipment which was funded through an Open Space Grant awarded last year is another project we owe a large thank you to Councilwoman Egbert and our professionals at Bach Associates.

Finally, I am happy to report that we are underway with a NJ LEAP grant study into our public safety services of fire and EMS. The \$75,000 NJ state funded study will explore opportunities for us to continue to enhance the quality of services we deliver and offer insight into financial savings. More to come on this great work by our Public Safety Committee chaired by Councilman Ottoson and Councilwoman Philipps.

alone. I thank all of my peers on Council and the countless volunteers here in town. There are too many to recognize, but I want to encourage anyone and everyone to let me know if you see someone going above and beyond to make Heights great serving our community. Autism/Development Disability Registration Form

A Registry to Assist Persons at Risk

The Haddon Heights Police Department has created a registry for individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder or other disabilities in an effort to give police quick access in an emergency to critical information about a person who is registered. The registry can provide police with emergency contact information, detailed physical descriptions, known routines, favorite attractions or special needs of an individual with Autism Spectrum Disorder or other disabilities such as: Alzheimer's, Dementia, Down Syndrome or any other endangered individuals.



This information will be entered into our records management system in order to assist police officers when time is essential in communicating and dealing with an emergency situation involving a person with Autism Spectrum Disorder as well as other disabilities.

The registration form asks for valuable information that police may need when helping individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder or any other disability. We ask that all questions be filled out completely and a current photograph be provided.

If you are unable to supply a photograph, we can take one for you.

The information you provide is confidential and will only be used by law enforcement. If any information on the registration changes you are encouraged to inform us as soon as possible. This program is free to the community and another example of the partnership between the Haddon Heights Police Department and our community. Construction is expected to continue on Maple Ave, Bradshaw Street (Crest to Gladstone) & 1st Avenue (Highland to High) early this spring. Construction on 11th Street (Glover to Green) that began in the fall is substantially complete.

Additionally, a consultant firm was selected from the pool of consultants from the County Local Aid Design Assistance for Safe Routes to School. They will assist Haddon Heights with the design for the Missing Sidewalk Grant that we were awarded. We look forward to these and other projects progressing from design to construction in the coming months. Please visit the borough website for additional information.

Council's Public Safety Committee met with the Borough's career firefighters and their Union representation and have come to an agreement in

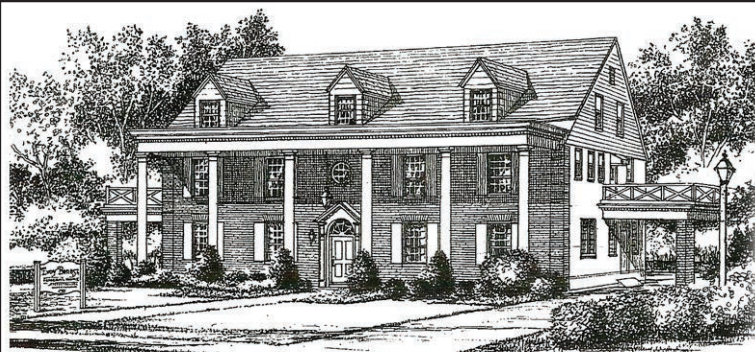

Doty, Director of the Smell and Taste Center at the University of Pennsylvania. Kindergarten Registration Now Open

It's time to register your child for our full day kindergarten program. The first step in this educational journey is to email the following required documentation to registration@gogarnets.com.

1. Your child's original birth certificate with a state seal. A student must be 5 years of age on or before October 1 in order to register for kindergarten.
2. Proof of Immunizations- Please provide your child's most current health records. Your child must also have a physical examination completed by your family doctor. You may use the district form or your physician's form if the information is the same. The physical must have been completed within the last year.
3. Proof of Residency- A valid form of identification

showing your home address along with two of the following documents:

- Current tax bill, utility bill or cell phone bill
- Mortgage settlement paperwork (showing date of occupancy) or Lease Agreement
- Transfer Card-If your child is a transfer student within the state of New Jersey, you will need to provide a Transfer Card from the previous school district and complete a Records Release form.

Once you have provided these documents, you will receive an email with directions for completing online paperwork through PowerSchool.

We are requesting that you make every effort to register your kindergartener as soon as possible. You will be notified in June of your child's school placement. Our kindergarten programs are offered at

Atlantic Avenue School and Glenview Avenue School.

In preparation for the first day of school, we will host a few opportunities for you and your child to get acclimated to school. Kindergarten readiness assessments will be scheduled for July. This provides us with the opportunity to meet your child and get to know their strengths and areas for improvement. In addition, we will hold a Kindergarten Open House in late August where your family will have the opportunity to meet your child's teacher and the principal, visit the classroom, and learn about the school.

Please feel free to reach out at any time if you have questions during this process. We look forward to welcoming your family to the district and working together to provide a positive learning experience for your child.

PROJECT CHILD FIND

Do you have a preschool age child, ages 3 to 5, experiencing developmental difficulties with communication, learning, socialization, or motor skills? If so, your child may be eligible for free services through the school district. The district will evaluate children, when warranted, beginning at age 2 years 9 months old. The district provides special education services for eligible preschoolers.

If you suspect your preschool age child is developing differently or demonstrating problems learning contact Jocqueline Renner, Director of Special Education, at 547-1322, Ext. 2000 for more information. Information is also available on the Special Education, Project CHILD FIND weblink located on the school district's website at hhsd.k12.nj.us.

Employment Opportunity: Teen Counselors

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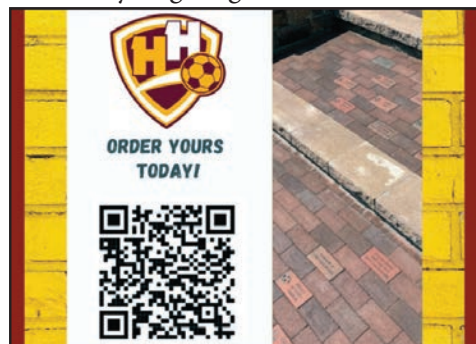
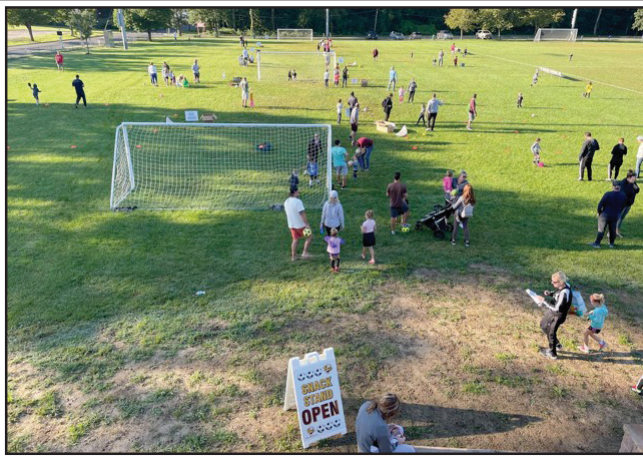
Haddon Heights Soccer Club

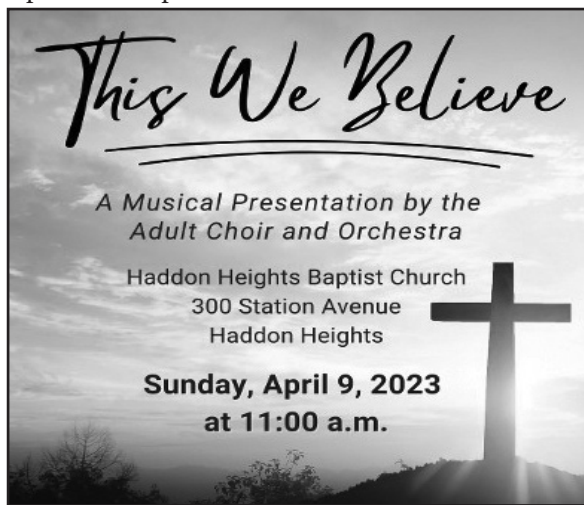

Registration is Required for all Dogs & Cats

It is the law and mandatory that dog and cat owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times. Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog.

License Fees support the efforts of many local animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control. Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State Statues pertaining to Animal Cruelty. The information can be found at the New Jersey Department of Health website (www.state.nj.us/health) for the State Statues listed below.

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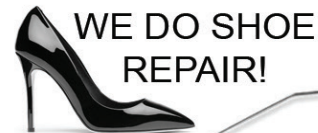
