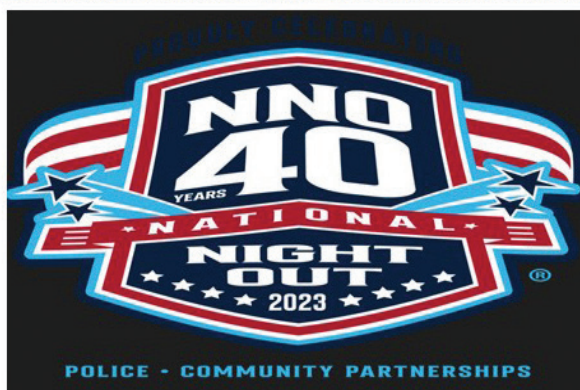

# MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Neighbors:

Wow, we have had some amazing weather this spring. It is hard to believe summer is right around the corner. With summer quickly approaching we have many events on the horizon. One of the first of which is our annual Memorial Day Celebration which will take place on Monday, May 29th. We hope you will be able to join us as we gather at 10:00 am at the WWI Memorial located at the Sons of Italy Lodge for a brief wreath laying service. Shortly thereafter, we will parade down to the Cannons War Memorial for an 11:00 am Ceremony. I hope all can come out and celebrate the sacrifices of all the brave departed souls who have served our great nation. Now before you know it our 4th of July celebration will be here. Our team once again is working incredibly hard to put together the most amazing parade, but we can't do this alone. Office at 856-547-7164, ext. 33. Our Farmers' Market season has kicked off on Sunday mornings between 9:30 am - 1:00 pm and is larger and better than ever. This is a great opportunity to shop for fresh Jersey produce, check out some amazing small businesses from the area, and meet up with friends, family, or fellow Heights residents to hang out or grab a coffee. I want to thank Heights In Progress for their continued support in hosting this weekly

event here in Heights and feel free to say hello or introduce yourself if you happen to spot me and my family while there. I think the one thing I am most excited about this summer is the return of the summer concert series at the Dell in Haddon Lake Park. Camden County Commissioners just announced the return of the Sundown Music Series here in Haddon Heights. The season kicks off on June 7th at 7:30 PM with Mutlu, a Philadelphia singer/songwriter revered for his deeply rooted retro grooves and smooth, soulful vocal style. This is a great event for the entire family so I hope to see you all there. Recently I've received a number of emails and calls about the shade trees being trimmed along our streets. Nelson Tree Service, which is contracted by PSE&G to maintain the trees in and around their power lines, will be working over the next several months to trim the shade trees back away from the power lines. Nelson Tree Service has to adhere to state-mandated guidelines for these trimmings with a distance of 10 ft cleared around high power lines and 3-4 ft around low power. Myself, Councilman Ottoson, and members of Shade Tree met with PSE&G to discuss the trimmings and how we can ensure our shade trees and the power grid can successfully co-exist. If anyone has any concerns about the trimmings please feel free to reach out to me or Councilman Ottoson on the issue and we will be happy to meet and discuss. Finally, on the redevelopment front, there

has been a ton of discussion posted to social media regarding the projects proposed at 501 Station Avenue and the overall purpose and process of redevelopment. So I wanted to take a minute and hopefully clarify some things so that everyone is fully informed about redevelopment. First, any redevelopment project or prospective project begins with a developer entering into a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Borough. This is basically a contract that says that both sides promise to negotiate fairly and in good faith with each other. This MOU also requires the developer to post an escrow account to cover any costs the Borough may incur during the process. This could come in the form of professional services like our attorney or engineer working on reviewing the projects. Because much of the area designated in need of redevelopment falls within our historic district, we ask the developers to review our historic design guidelines book and meet with HPC to get guidance. These recommendations from HPC also become a tool for Mayor and Council in our negotiations with the developers by allowing us to require specific design features in the project. Once negotiations are complete a redevelopment plan to overlay on the site can be adopted via ordinance. This follows the normal ordinance adoption process in which it is introduced at a Council meeting and requires a second reading at the next meeting along with an open public hearing before final adoption. This is the same process you would see us do if we were introducing an ordinance for a new

stop sign or changing the curfew. Also in between the introduction and adoption, the ordinance is sent to Planning Board for another public hearing and discussion on the conformity to the town's Master Plan. After the ordinance is adopted the developer can move forward with their project, filing for permits, and will ultimately bring the project before Planning Board and HPC (when required) for site review. I can assure you during our negotiations with any potential developer we are taking into consideration building use, design, quality and appearance, parking, our affordable housing requirements, senior housing, economic impacts, the Master Plan, and all of the public's feedback. Councilwoman Philipps and I, who work closely on these projects, chose to raise our families in Haddon Heights, just like you, because we love everything Haddon Heights has to offer and especially its historic charm. We are excited about redevelopment and ensuring our town continues to thrive and be a desirable place to raise a family. We know that this process may seem a bit confusing or complicated, and many of these projects can stir up a mix of emotions, ideas, and concerns. We want to assure you that we are here to answer your questions and listen to your ideas. 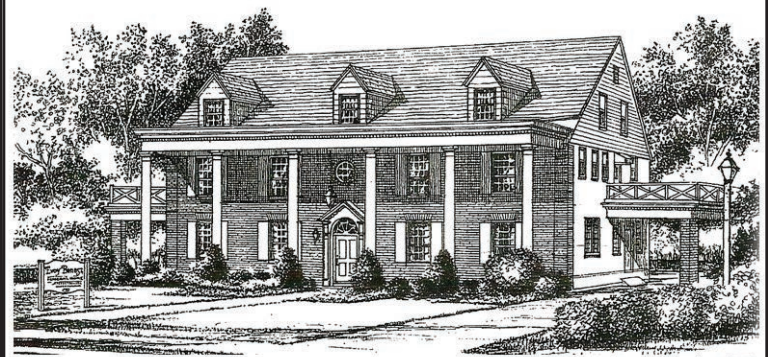

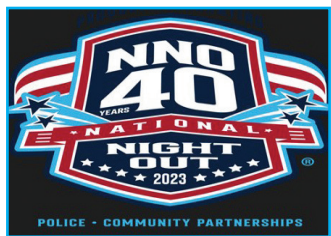

Council would like to welcome the Borough's new CFO, Mike Mansdoerfer, pursuant to a shared services agreement entered with the Borough of Riverside.

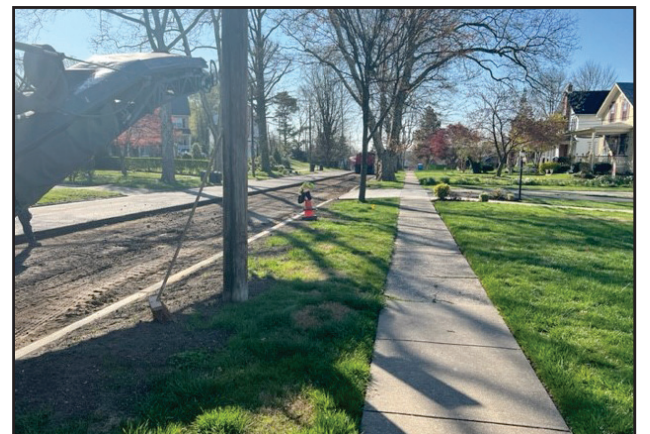
We are successfully under contract with our Borough's career firefighters until December 31, 2024. Haddon Heights Fire Department is now combined with Barrington and the paid staff provides response to calls from 6:00 AM until 4:00 PM Monday through Friday when our volunteers take over. A shoutout to the Fire Departments of both towns for their collaborative efforts to make these negotiations work. The FD combination offers cost savings and improved response times. Further, we have begun preliminary contract negotiations with our Borough police department, which is actively searching for a new officer to join their ranks.

At Hoff's Park, the necessary PO needed for the exercise equipment that will be installed was recently issued by the Borough. Installation of the new equipment is scheduled for the summer. The Devon Avenue Soccer Fields natural turf improvements had a preconstruction meeting held on January 19, 2023. Representatives from the Borough, Haddon Heights Jr./Sr. High School, Haddon Heights Soccer Club, and the contractor all agreed the optimal time for the Notice to Proceed to be issued on May 30, 2023 (day following Memorial Day). This decision was made after considering winter weather conditions and the spring field usage.

The Shade Tree Commission, Borough Staff and the Department of Public Works have coordinated a Spring Tree Planting of 100 trees concentrating on W. High Street. There is an absence of street trees on the west side of town. That will be the focus for planting until it is improved. Please water the trees you received especially in the summer during hot dry weather. Smaller trees are being used to increase the quantity and for planting in the limited space between the curb and sidewalk.

Council is happy to report that the construction on 11th Street (Glover to Green), Bradshaw Street (Crest to Gladstone) & 1st Avenue (Highland to High) is complete. Repaving on Maple Avenue is expected to be completed in the next few weeks once the sewer has been slip lined. Many of the projects that have been completed in the past throughout town have been sponsored by Camden County and NJDOT. Council is pleased to have the funds so that we can start chipping away at the many streets that need repaving throughout the Borough.

Council would like to thank our residents for your patience while construction is underway on Station Avenue. We are so excited that Camden County is working on vital roads in town. At Station Avenue and North Park Avenue by the Canons, work will have begun to modify the curb, install ADA ramps



and install better crosswalks. Improvements will be made to the connections to the memorial and many trees will be planted throughout the project. At the Dell, along Lake Drive, Glover Avenue and along 13th Street, there will also be repaving and modifications to the roadways. Lastly, on Station Avenue from the White Horse Pike to the Atlantics, Station Avenue will be repaved to continue the bicycle

# Requirement of Animal Licensing

## Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats!

It is the law and mandatory that dog and cat owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times.

Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog.

Animal License Renewal Letters were mailed out in January for the 2023 renewals. If you did not receive your letter or need a new one, please visit [www.haddonhts.com](http://www.haddonhts.com), under Forms & Permits or you can contact the Borough Administration Office. 856-547-7164 ext. 2. In order to get your animal licensed for the 2023 calendar year the office staff will need to see your pet's proof of rabies vaccination. **The vaccination will need to be good through November 1, 2023 for a license to be issued.** If your pets vaccination expires before that

time, you can talk to your vet about adjusting the schedule. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. **Please obtain your 2023 License on or before June 30<sup>th</sup> to avoid the \$10.00 late fee.**

License Fees support the efforts of many local animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control.

Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State Statues pertaining to Animal Cruelty. The information can be found at the New Jersey Department of Health website ([www.state.nj.us/health](http://www.state.nj.us/health)) for the State Statues listed below.

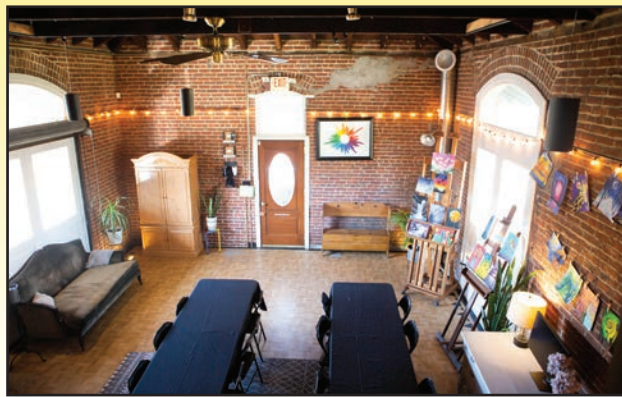

## A Family's Haddon Heights Graduation Story

My Name is Joan Hatch Sandell and we have a really neat story to share with you this month. It is a beautiful story of the world "coming around again!"



My mother, Jane Dorothy Bigley, was born in Philadelphia on May 11, 1907. She and her family moved to Magnolia when she was 10 years old. She skipped a grade when she was tested for Magnolia Public School. Mother was barely 13 when she graduated from 8th grade and entered Haddon Heights High School.

The High School then was a small building. She told us the story of taking the trolley up from Magnolia along the railroad and walking to the High School on Kings Highway. That building was on the front portion of the property that now holds the Atlantic Avenue Grammar school. That was the High School in 1920. She graduated from that building in June of 1924. In September of '24 the "new High School" was opened on Second Avenue that still stands today.

We have her diploma from 1924. It even shows how many credits she received for her specific classes. I, especially love the fact that she got 12 ½ credits in French and 5 in "Commercial Arithmetic". Our youngsters today have no idea what arithmetic is!!

But now to the real reason for sharing my story! This June, my mother's GREAT GRANDSON, Edward Joseph Sandell, Jr. He will be graduating from Haddon Heights High School this June, 99 years after his Great Grandmother graduated!

Eddie is one of her 85 descendants. My mother and dad had 7 children, they had 31 grandchildren, who have given her 47 great grandchildren. Eddie is the only one to have attended her school so far.

The challenges and changes that the parish family are working through now will result in our ability to gather again in new ways and in a newly designed and renovated sacred space. In the meantime...worship continues!

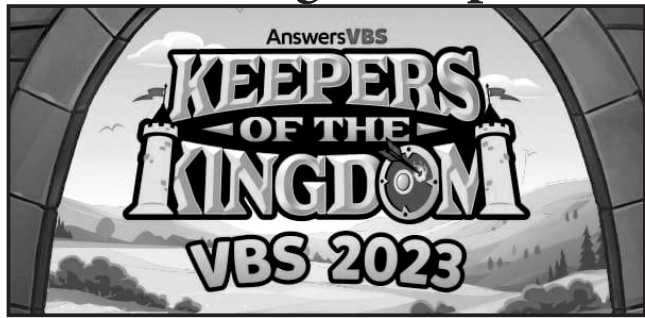
