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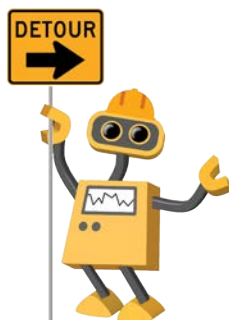

Station Avenue Pedestrian Safety Improvements Phase II

Safety improvements at the intersections of Station Avenue and East and West Atlantic will begin construction tentatively on Monday, October 9, 2023. The project will take place Monday - Friday from 7:00 AM - 4:00 PM on Station Avenue at West Atlantic and East Atlantic Aves. The projected timeline is approximately 135 Calendar Days (Weather Permitting). Please use alternate routes of travel that parallel Station Avenue such as Kings Hwy, Highland/Clements Bridge Road, Princeton Rd., E. Vassar Rd., Chestnut St., E. Pine St.



These improvements will include bump outs to shorten our pedestrian crossings, accessible ramps for pedestrians, signs and pavement markings. There will also be a connection to the LINK trail. All funded by Camden County. There are lots of questions about the traffic flow during construction and we have some information available on our website www.HaddonHts.com and will share any updates as soon as they are available. We will try to provide our residents as much notice as possible to adjust.

While we fully understand the inconvenience this project represents for our residents, please know that these pedestrian improvements have been a long time in the making and we are grateful to Camden County for the over 1 million in funds designated for pedestrian

and safety improvements. The construction is scheduled to begin mid-October and the end product will include bump-outs to shorten the pedestrian crossings, accessible ramps, new signs, and new pavement markings. This will help make pedestrians more visible and reduce the number of vehicular conflict points at the intersection. This is particularly important for our children as they are walking and commuting to and from school and throughout town. We appreciate your patience and understanding as traffic is redirected around the work site. Please keep an eye on the Borough website for any updates or changes to the traffic patterns or project details. Borough staff will post any updates as we receive from the Police Department as timely as possible.

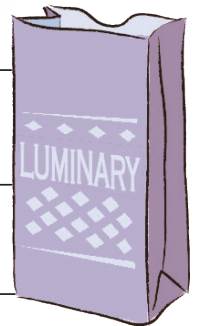

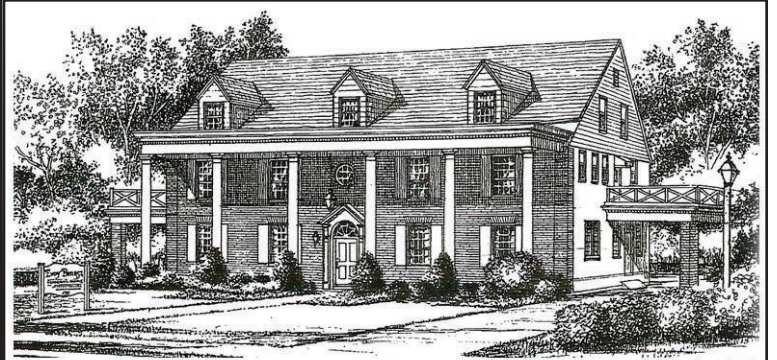

Fall Leaf Collection

As the leaves start changing that means they will soon start falling. Leaf collection will begin around Mid-October and run through mid-December. Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms. DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet. DO NOT park cars in front or on top of leaf piles, our trucks will not be able to pick up those leaves that are blocked.
- DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed.

The last day for Grass collection will be on Tuesday, October 24th.

The last day for Brush collection:

East side (10th Ave to Haddonfield) will be Wednesday, October 25th.
West side (10th Ave to Black Horse Pike) will be Thursday, October 26th.

Tax Assessor's Office

New Jersey Law requires the Tax Assessor's office to keep all property assessments current. The Assessor's inspector may visit your property if the property owner or their contractor obtained a building permit to build a new building, or update, improve, expand, remodel, redecorate, rehab and/or demolish an existing building located in Haddon Heights. Please cooperate with the Assessor's inspector who will perform an interior and exterior examination of your home or business, and request information to confirm the type of work done, or to be done, the cost of the project, and the date the job was, or is to be completed. This inspection is in addition to any inspection(s) required by the Haddon Heights Building Inspection Department.

The inspector will visit your property **unannounced** in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker, Jeffery Scott Pierson, and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.


Work on the layout has been progressing well. For those who monitor the progress on Facebook, you have seen the Anthracite breaker progress into a completed structure. We are now working on the "patch" town of Lycoming. The reconstruction of the farm module was completed in September. The module is now structurally sound with a new farmhouse and garage. The scenery was updated and improved as well. We have added weekend work sessions for the season. Progress on the rock casting and scenery work is too time-consuming for Wednesday nights. Visitors are always welcome.

We previously mentioned the new Haddon Heights History page developed jointly by the West Jersey Chapter-National Railway Historical Society and the Club. This is now on the West Jersey Website: www.westjersey-nrhs.org. There are both historical and current photographs of the railroad as well as text. The project is not complete, and we continue to look for more historical photographs. If anyone has old photographs of the stations, coal dock, or team track we would appreciate a copy. We also need interior photographs of the passenger station for historical documentation. The exterior of the passenger station remains largely unaltered from 1890, but the interior has been changed extensively. The Chapter and Club will be working on a new project documenting the railroad from Camden to Winslow Junction in 2024.



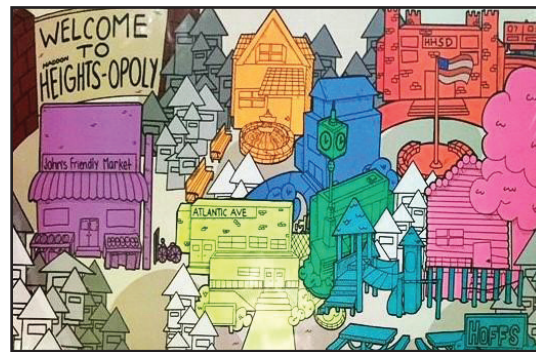

PROJECT CHILD FIND

Do you have a preschool age child, ages 3 to 5, experiencing developmental difficulties with communication, learning, socialization, or motor skills? If so, your child may be eligible for free services through the school district. The district will evaluate children, when warranted, beginning at age 2 years 9 months old. The district provides special education services for eligible preschoolers.

If you suspect your preschool age child is developing differently or demonstrating problems learning contact Jocqueline Renner, Director of Special Education, at 547-1322, Ext. 2000 for more information. Information is also available on the Special Education, Project CHILD FIND weblink located on the school district's website at hhsd.k12.nj.us.

Animal Licensing

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats!

It is the law and mandatory that dog and cat owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times.

Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog.

Animal License Renewal Forms are available at www.haddonhts.com, under Forms & Permits or you can contact the Borough Hall at 856-547-7164 ex. 2. Office staff will need to see your pet's proof of rabies vaccination and the **vaccination will need to be good through Nov. 1, 2023 for a license to be issued.** If your pet's vaccination expires before that time, you can always talk to

your vet about adjusting the schedule. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. **Licenses obtained after June 30th will incur a \$10.00 late fee.**

License Fees support the efforts of many local animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control. Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State statutes pertaining to Animal Cruelty. The information can be found at the New Jersey Department of Health website (www.state.nj.us/health) for State Statutes: 4:22-17 Cruelty; certain acts, crime; degrees, 4:22-26 Penalties for various acts constituting cruelty, and Guide to Prevention of Animal Cruelty Laws 2018

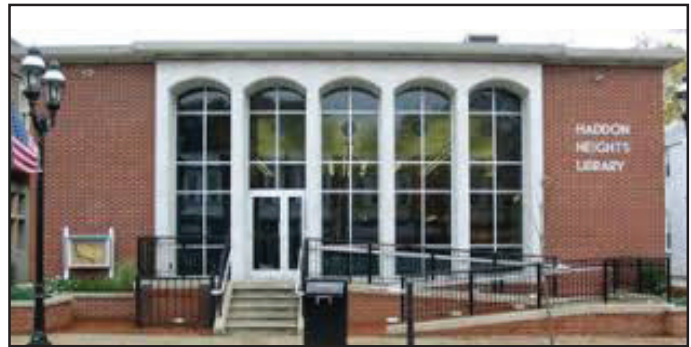
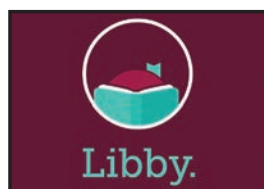

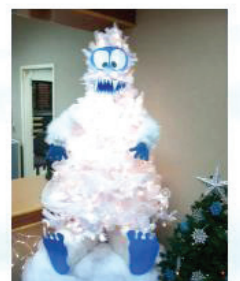

The Village Playbox

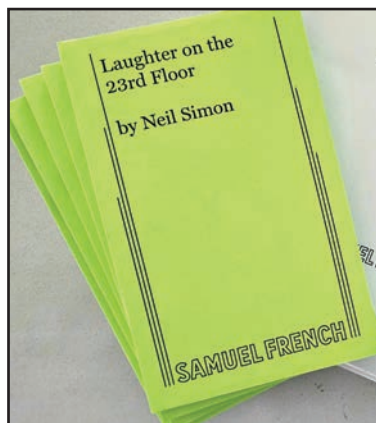

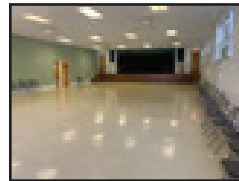
