
Fall Leaf Collection

We are also grateful to the Police Department for its efforts with our town's fall events and working with Camden County to arrange for new flashing pedestrian signs at the intersection of Prospect and Glenview.

We are happy to announce that construction in and around S. Park Avenue, Hillside Avenue and 13th Street is largely complete. There were many small tweaks to the existing roadway network to promote safety, especially in the highly trafficked area near the Dell, an important asset to the Haddon Heights community. The inspector will visit your property **unannounced** in the day, early evening, or on a Saturday. This method of inspection is very cost effective and I greatly appreciate your help allowing the inspector to collect the data required. The inspectors who work for the Tax Assessor's office are Judith Shoemaker, Jeffery Scott Pierson, and myself. Each inspector will wear an official Haddon Heights Borough ID Badge.

What's New at the Station

Despite a rainy fall, we have been open for several successful events. We will be open for the first three weekends of December in conjunction with the Haddon Heights Library Trains at Christmas. Check with our Facebook page for dates and times. The Anthracite coal breaker is now complete, and we are working on getting the landscape around the town and breaker complete. You can track our progress on Facebook or stop by during our Saturday workdays.

Future work includes the worker housing for the town of Lycoming and completing the Lycoming Train Station. This project is a highly modified kit that is both updated and configured to fit our layout. The original station can be seen at New Freedom, Pennsylvania and is currently used by the Northern Central Railroad. Their 2024 excursion schedule should be available by the time you read this. The complete set of three new modules will represent the Anthracite industry with a breaker, worker housing in a "patch town" and the supporting timber industry that provided the shoring and mine timbers. Most of this industry has been demolished as the industry declined rapidly in the 1960s. A representative miner's village has been preserved at Eckley Miner's Village by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission. A great deal of information is available on the internet about this industry. Coal Country visits may be better in warmer weather.

Sustainable Jersey programs reduce waste, cut greenhouse gas emissions, improve public health, stimulate local economies, and increase resiliency. All while mutually working towards a more equitable society. Sustainable Jersey provides research, best practices and technical assistance needed to implement sustainable solutions. Also, registered towns have access to the Sustainable Jersey Grants Program for community-based initiatives.

Currently, 81% of NJ towns are registered as participants in the Sustainable Jersey program, with 206 certified at one level or another. Camden County has 37 municipalities registered, but only nine (9) are certified – the Borough of Brooklawn, Camden City, Cherry Hill Township, the Borough of Collingswood, Gloucester Township, the Borough of Haddon Heights, the Borough of Haddonfield, the Borough of Merchantville and the Borough of Runnemede.

Sustainable Haddon Heights (SHH) plans to apply again this year, on behalf of the Borough, to be certified by Sustainable Jersey . There are three submission rounds, allowing time for the application to be approved and completed in stages. Application deadlines are: 1st round – FEB. 25; 2nd round – MAY 10; 3rd round – JUL. 31, followed by 6-8 weeks of review after each round by Sustainable Jersey for compliance and any missing documentation.

Animal Licensing

Registration is Required for all Dogs and Cats!

It is the law and mandatory that dog and cat License Fees support the efforts of many local owners have their pets licensed. Licenses are animal shelters. Typically, the annual fee that good for one calendar year and must be renewed annually. License tags must be displayed on animals at all times.

Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and returned to you should they get out. Even indoor cats have been known to escape at times, without a license whoever finds your pet will have a harder time identifying them and they may not be returned to you. If they did escape they would be protected from Rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside. If we get all of our animals vaccinated against rabies, then no parent will have to be afraid that one of their children may be bitten by a rabid cat or dog.

Animal License Renewal Forms are available at www.haddonhts.com, under Forms & Permits or you can contact the Borough Hall at 856-547-7164 ex. 2. Office staff will need to see your pet's proof of rabies vaccination and the vaccination will need to be good through Nov. 1, 2023 for a license to be issued. If your pets vaccination expires before that time, you can always talk to your vet about adjusting the schedule. The cost for a spayed/neutered cat or dog is \$9.00. The cost for a non-spayed/non-neutered cat or dog is \$12.00. Licenses obtained after June 30th will incur a \$10.00 late fee.

you pay to license your pet helps to keep shelters running and support the work of your local animal control. Pet owners should also be aware that the State of New Jersey recently passed State statutes pertaining to Animal Cruelty.
