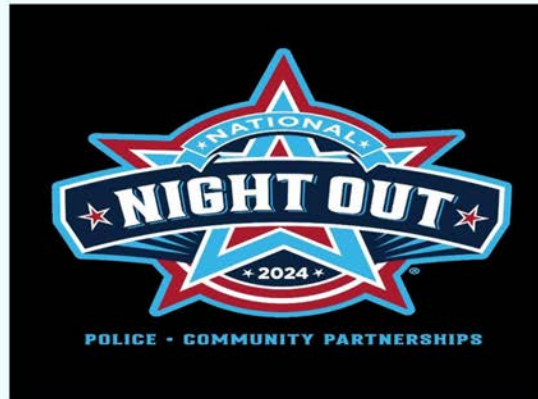


Please join the Haddon Heights Library for its fifth annual outdoor family movie night on Station Avenue.

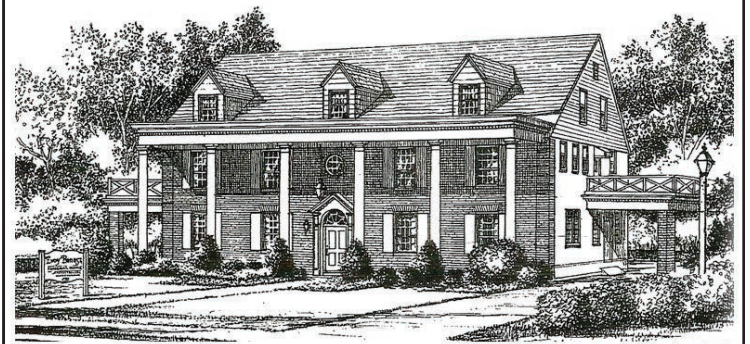

Stormwater Management

Haddon Heights is a watershed. What does this mean? A watershed is an area of land that water flows through or over and then drains into a body of water. It may drain into a small stream, lake, river, or even the ocean. Remember even though the water leaves Haddon Heights it is our responsibility to keep it clean and healthy. Stormwater ends up in our streams, lakes, and potentially our drinking water. Here are some examples of how to keep our waterways clean.

Stormwater flows over our streets and lawns, and pretty much every area at a lower elevation. It picks up debris from the roads such as trash, oil, pesticides, animal waste, sediment, and anything else on the road it can carry. To help limit the impact here are several examples you can follow. Limit the amount of fertilizer you put on your lawn. Do not fertilize right before it rains and pick up after your pet as pet waste contains harmful bacteria and parasites. Always place trash in the proper receptacle and never throw cigarette butts in the

street. One cigarette butt can take up to 25 years to fully break down. Any and all trash not properly disposed of can kill or harm our wildlife. We have an abundance of wildlife in our area such as ducks, eagles, hawks, turkeys, and let's not forget about the many species of fish and turtles.

This time of year is especially important. Do not blow your grass clippings into the street and please put your leaves on the curb, not in the street. Natural and organic debris flows into our streams and lakes. It will spike nitrogen and phosphorus levels in the water and cause algae blooms. This lowers the oxygen level in the water killing aquatic life and growing toxic bacteria.


All it takes is a little effort to make a big difference. Help protect our waterways and our wildlife for years to come.

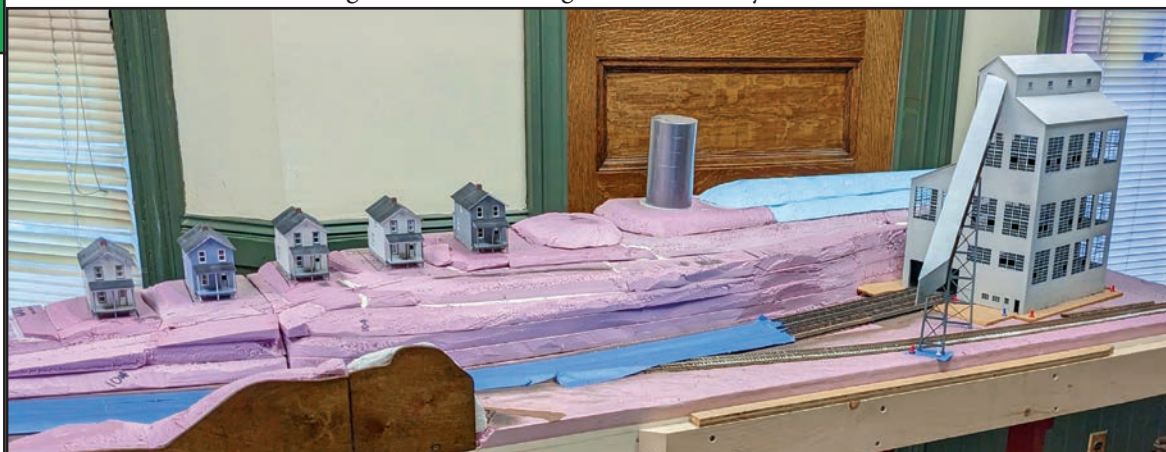
- Safe Routes to School – walking school buses for elementary students.

The railroad was the primary way to move the coal to the consumer and provided significant mobility for the residents prior to the common use of the automobile. We will replicate both a typical combination passenger and freight station and the lumber yard supplying the mine on the adjacent new modules.

The Station will be open on September 28th in support of “Sippin’ on Station”. We will also be open on some Sunday afternoons in the fall as work progresses. Registration is Required for all Dogs & Cats

Please note that the State of New Jersey requires that all Dogs and Cats are licensed each calendar year. **Animal Licenses fee for Spayed/Neutered Animals are \$10.00 & Non-Spayed/Non-Neutered Animals are \$13.00.** Animal registration forms can be found on www.haddonhts.com, under Forms & Permits. In order to get your animal licensed the office staff will need to see your pet's proof of current rabies vaccination. **The vaccination will need to be good through November 1, 2024 for a license to be issued.** Any license issued after June 30th will also be charged a \$10.00 late fee.

License Fees support the efforts of local shelters and support the work of your local animal control. Benefits of having your animal licensed and vaccinated include making it easier for your pet to be identified and then returned to you should they get out. Also if they did escape they would be protected from rabies should they be bitten by a wild animal living outside.

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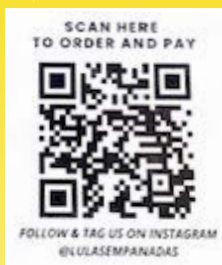

Project Medicine Drop

The Environmental Commission and the Borough of Haddon Heights are in support of Project Medicine Drop. One of the goals of this program is to ensure that prescription medications are kept out of the water system and disposed of properly. Drugs that are flushed down the toilet ultimately end up in our drinking water and have been known to affect fish and other wildlife. Samples taken from 50 large-sized water treatment plants nationwide tested for 56 drugs including oxycodone, high blood pressure medication and over-the-counter medications like Tylenol and ibuprofen. Medications are collected at Borough Hall for proper disposal.

You can anonymously drop off old expired medications, medications that you no longer use, and other drugs. Whenever Borough Hall is open to the public, you can dispose of unwanted medications. The mailbox style dropbox is located by the Police Dept. courtesy window on the ground floor. You do not need to check-in with the police department; just deposit the items as you would in a mailbox. Medications need to be secured in bags or their original containers. The medicine drop box is not for the use of doctor's offices or pharmaceutical businesses that need to dispose of medication.

When dropping off medications:

- Minimize containers by combining medications into as few plastic zip-loc bags as possible (and recycle the other containers and boxes)
- Do not drop off vitamins or non-prescription OTC medications. Vitamins and non-prescription OTC medications can be disposed of in your regular trash.
- Liquids and topical ointments are not permitted for disposal in the box. Place them in the trash.
- Needles and hypodermic syringes are not permitted.
- It is recommended that the patient name be removed from the container.
- Do not drop off empty containers.

On weekends and after closing hours, you can arrange for a police officer to let you into the building to use the drop box. Please contact the police department at 856-547-0614, extension 12. 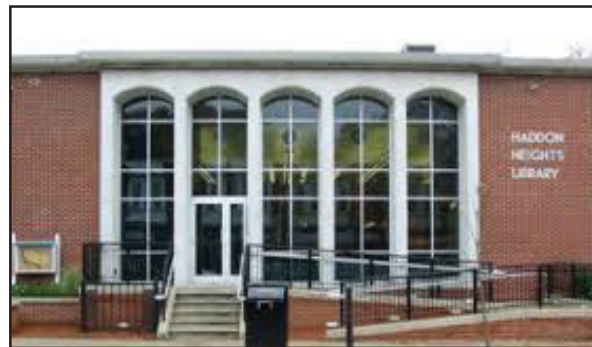
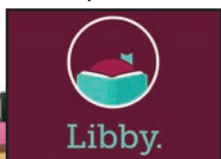
Please join the Haddon Heights Library for its fifth annual outdoor family movie night on Station Avenue.

Benefits of Trees

The benefits that trees provide from social, communal, environmental, and economic perspectives. Most trees and shrubs in cities or communities are planted to provide beauty or shade. While these are excellent benefits, woody plants serve many other purposes. The benefits of trees can be grouped into social, communal, environmental, and economic categories.

SOCIAL BENEFITS

Human response to trees goes well beyond simply observing their beauty. We feel serene, peaceful, restful, and tranquil in a grove of trees. We are "at home" there. The calming effect of nearby trees and urban greening can significantly reduce workplace stress levels and fatigue, calm traffic, and even decrease the recovery time needed after surgery. Trees can also reduce crime. Apartment buildings with high levels of greenspace have lower crime rates than nearby apartments without trees. The stature, strength, and endurance of trees give them a cathedral-like quality. Because of their potential for long life, trees are frequently planted as living memorials. We often become personally attached to trees that we, or those we love, have planted. The strong tie between people and trees is often evident when community residents speak out against the removal of trees to widen streets or rally to save a particularly large or historic tree.

Even when located on a private lot, the benefits provided by trees can reach well out into the surrounding community. Likewise, large growing trees can come in conflict with utilities, views, and structures that are beyond the bounds of the owner's property. With proper selection and maintenance, trees can enhance and function on one property without infringing on the rights and privileges of neighbors. City trees often serve several architectural and engineering functions. They provide privacy, emphasize views, or screen out objectionable views. They reduce glare and reflection. They direct pedestrian traffic. Trees also provide a background to soften, complement, or enhance architecture. Trees bring natural elements and wildlife habitats into urban surroundings, all of which increase the quality of life for residents of the community.

ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS

Trees alter the environment in which we live by moderating climate, improving air quality, reducing stormwater runoff, and harboring wildlife. Local climates are moderated from extreme sun, wind, and rain. Radiant energy from the sun is absorbed or deflected by leaves on deciduous trees in the summer and is only filtered by branches of deciduous trees in winter. The larger the tree, the greater the cooling effect. By using trees in the cities, we can moderate the heat-island effect caused by pavement and buildings in commercial areas. Wind speed and direction are affected by trees. The more compact the foliage on the tree or group of trees, the more effective the windbreak. Rainfall, sleet, and hail are absorbed or slowed by trees, providing some protection for people, pets, and buildings. Trees intercept

water, store some of it, and reduce stormwater runoff. Air quality is improved through the use of trees, shrubs, and turf. Leaves filter the air we breathe by removing dust and other particulates. Rain then washes the pollutants to the ground. Leaves absorb the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide during photosynthesis and store carbon as growth. Leaves also absorb other air pollutants - such as ozone, carbon monoxide, and sulfur dioxide - and release oxygen. By planting trees and shrubs, we return developed areas to a more natural environment that is attractive to birds and wildlife. Ecological cycles of plant growth, reproduction, and decomposition are again present, both above and below ground. Natural harmony is restored to the urban environment.

ECONOMIC BENEFITS

Property values of landscaped homes are 5 to 20 percent higher than those of non-landscaped homes. Individual trees and shrubs have value, but the variability of species, size, condition, and function makes determining their economic value difficult. The economic benefits of trees are both direct and indirect. Direct economic benefits are usually associated with energy costs. Air-conditioning costs are lower in a tree-shaded home. Heating costs are reduced when a home has a windbreak. Trees increase in value as they grow. Trees, as part of a well maintained landscape, can add value to your home. The indirect economic benefits of trees within a community are even greater. Customers pay lower electricity bills when power companies build fewer new facilities to meet peak demands, use reduced amounts of fossil fuel in their furnaces, and use fewer measures to control air pollution. Communities can also save money if fewer facilities must be built to control stormwater in the region. To the individual, these savings may seem small, but to the community as a whole, reductions in these expenses are often substantial.

TREES REQUIRE AN INVESTMENT

Trees provide numerous aesthetic and economic benefits, but also incur some costs. Investing in a tree's maintenance will help to return the benefits you desire. The costs associated with large tree removal and replacement can be significant. In addition, the economic and environmental benefits produced by a young replacement tree are minimal when compared to those of a mature specimen. Extending the functional lifespan of large, mature trees with routine maintenance can delay these expenses and maximize returns. An informed home owner can be responsible for many tree maintenance practices. Corrective pruning and mulching gives young trees a good start. Shade trees, however, quickly grow to a size that may require the services of a professional arborist. Arborists have the knowledge and equipment needed to prune, treat, fertilize, and otherwise maintain a large tree. Your garden center owner, university extension agent, community forester, or consulting arborist can answer questions about tree maintenance, suggest treatments, or recommend qualified arborists.
