





Fall Leaf Pick-Up

Fall is just around the corner. As the leaves start changing that means they will soon start falling. Leaf collection will begin on October 15th and run until December 15th. During November and December • 2016 permits must be displayed by 1/1/2016. the crews will being doing east side and west side every other week.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during
- Please DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet.
- Please DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.



Parking Information **Overnight Parking Reminders:**

A few reminders about overnight parking:

- Parking is prohibited on Borough streets from midnight to 5:00am.
- Parking Permit applications and renewal applications for 2016 permits must be received by Friday December 18th.
- The overnight parking number 856-784-9161. This number is also located on the Borough website several times in case you forget.
- Whenever there is a warning or prediction of possible snow or ice, ALL on-street parking is denied.



Parking During Snow **Emergencies:**

The Police Department would like to remind residents about the No Parking Regulations during snowstorms:



When it is snowing between the hours of midnight and 5:00 am ALL motorist **are not** allowed to park their vehicles on Borough streets. Additionally, whenever there is a "Snow Emergency" declared by the Borough or a State of Emergency declared regardless of the time of day we will strictly enforce no parking regulations.

There are several reasons for this strict enforcement, they

- To reduce motor vehicle accidents
- To keep the road clear for emergency vehicles and key personnel
- To keep the roads open for snow plows, allowing them to clear the road in a timely manner and to do a better



Zoning and Code Enforcement

The following is the Haddon Heights Borough Code concerning snow removal.

400-8 Removal of snow, grass and weeds: [Amended 3-15-2011 by Ord. No. 1365]

The owner or tenants of lands abutting sidewalks shall remove all snow from those sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after snowfall has ceased. All grass, weeds and other impediments shall be removed from sidewalks within three days after receiving notice. It shall be unlawful to throw or deposit snow, grass, weeds, or any other materials in the street.

§ 400-9. Removal of ice: The owner or owners, tenant or tenants of lands abutting or bordering upon the sidewalks of public streets, avenues and highways shall remove all ice from the same within 12 hours of daylight after the ice shall have formed thereon, or if it shall be impossible within that time to remove the same, the owner or owners, tenant or tenants shall spread over the ice on said sidewalks ashes. sawdust or some other similar material which shall make the said sidewalks safe for the use of pedestrians.







How to have a Sustainable Holiday

- Did You Know... •Between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day, Americans throw away a million extra

- products? •The 2.65 billion Christmas cards sold each year in this country could fill a football

Here's how to reduce, reuse, recycle, and re-purpose:

Decorations

field ten stories high?

Instead of buying new decorations, modify the decorations you already have to create something new and different.

Collect pine cones, evergreen branches, etc. to make decorations rather than purchase plastic ones. The most inexpensive plastic decorations come from China and the petroleum used in making them, as well as the petroleum to ship them to the U.S., increases our carbon footprint.

Use LED or CFL lighting to decrease energy usage. While the initial cost may be more, they last longer than the older style lights and use less electricity, so they are actually less expensive in the long run.

Christmas Trees

If a reusable tree is not your idea of Christmas, consider a live tree that you can plant after the holidays. Dig the proper hole before the ground freezes

so your tree can be planted later after the holidays. The hole should be as deep as the original container but about twice as wide to allow room for the roots to spread.

If you prefer a cut tree, put it in your yard after the holidays and decorate it with treats for the backyard birds, such as pinecones covered in peanut butter and birdseed, or string cranberries and popcorn. You can also cut off the branches and use them for mulch and cover for wildlife during the winter months.

Gifts

Give homemade gifts. Consider giving experiences, such as museum memberships or tickets to a special

Take your reusable bags with you when you shop. They aren't just for groceries!

Buy local and support the local merchants. The money you spend will re-circulate in your own community.

Local merchants often have better quality items and offer excellent service because you're their neighbor.

Look for gifts with the least plastic packaging. Not only are they easier to open, they reduce trash. This is another reason to shop local, as their items generally have less packaging. If you have to order online, look for sellers like Amazon, who offers frustration-free shipping, by eliminating unnecessary packaging.

Recycle or reuse the cardboard boxes that gifts may come in. Recycle wrapping papers that are not waxcoated or made of foil. Save the larger pieces of wrapping paper to reuse.

Buy wrapping paper made of recycled paper. Use paper or cloth gift bags that can be reused by the recipient.

Holiday Cards

Consider e-cards. With their animation and sound, they are fun to receive. Post something special on

your Facebook page for your friends to enjoy instead of sending a card.

Make a charity donation in lieu of sending cards. Suggest your friends do the same.

If you buy cards, look for ones made with a high percentage of recycled paper. Avoid foil and wax-coating so the cards can be recycled.



We would like for all the residents of Haddon Heights to be aware of something truly unique that Joe Smargisso's Art class at Haddon Heights High School is doing for one of our students, whose family lost their home in Barrington to a fire.

The Art II class at Haddon Heights High School, which is taught by Mr. Joseph Smargisso, is more than just learning about art processes and procedures. Mr. Smargisso taught a lesson focused on "What is a home?" Students were asked to:



compare and contrast a home in the city vs a home in the suburbs, review Robert Frost's poem "Good Hours" which explores the idea of a journey home, and analyze a painting by Henry Tanner "The Banjo Lesson," which depicts a grandfather with a grandson on his lap, teaching him the banjo in a rustic kitchen. The idea of this painting is a multi-generational home where the family reflect upon recipes, stories and lessons, defining what a home is to you.



Winter Gardens

In spring, gardens are a delight to the eyes, as plants come alive, send out stems and leaves, and some even bear beautiful flowers. Birds, butterflies, and all sorts of insects visit. Who doesn't like the sounds of birds singing or seeing a beautiful butterfly take flight? While some of the insects can be annoying, they provide food for many of the garden He Fart of the Solution, visitors.

All too soon, fall arrives, and plants begin to turn brown, the leaves shrivel, and the petals drop. Our first impulse is to remove all this ugliness. The bare ground seems more appealing. But Mother Nature doesn't see it that way. Before you cut everything down, take a moment to remember the pleasure the garden gave you when it was in bloom. By leaving the seed pods adorning the brown stalks and leaves, you ensure more flowers in the spring. The birds that don't migrate will appreciate the source of food. Seeing a bright yellow goldfinch feasting on purple coneflower seeds, the stalk swaying from the added weight, should make you smile. The debris provides shelter for the smaller birds and animals that are hunted by the larger predatory ones and helps them stay warm. Mother Nature has it all figured out.

Church Organist not only plays, he repairs.

Robert E. Gladden, who has played Innocenzo, 73, of Westmont, a St. Rose "I had a 1966 Oldsmobile 442 with keyboards, and 120 stops, he notes. the organ at St. Rose of Lima Church in Haddon Heights since 1965, is a low-key fellow with a quiet voice. But the mighty instrument he custom-built - and fluently commands - can speak volumes in pretty much any musical language.

"It's a big sound," Gladden, 63, says from the console in the choir loft, where he makes music for Saturday and Sunday Masses, as well as weddings, funerals, and other occasions.

"This organ has the quietest things like chimes, harp, celesta, a little glockenspiel ... to the biggest sounds, like the 32foot pipes you can feel in your chest," the Merchantville resident says, giving me a dazzling demonstration.

The St. Rose community has been listening as well; a reception in Gladden's honor is set to follow the 11 a.m. Mass on Sunday.

"Bob is a great church musician," says the Rev. Joseph Byerley, pastor of the 4,400-family Catholic parish. "He makes everything as beautiful as it can

"That's because I've had lots of time to practice," says Gladden, a Haddonfield native who grew up attending Mass at St. Rose and listening to the organ.

"The sound was kind of like a magnet," he recalls. "As soon as I heard it, it was what I wanted to do. I can't say why. I

At 9 years old, he began organ lessons at the Richard L. Moore Music Center in Collingswood. "I took to it right away," he says. By age 12, Gladden was regularly playing at St. Rose, which at the time had several other part-time organists - all of them adults - as well. He's been the only organist at St. Rose since 1996.

"At my first Mass by myself, I was petrified," Gladden says. "I thought I had played all the right notes. But the cantor who sang the Mass said, 'You could have played faster."

Turns out Gladden also loved speed, but in a different context: Drag-racing "Bob is an artist," says cantor Pat muscle cars along Philly's Front Street.

graduate says. "I built engines. I was always mechanically inclined."

These inclinations also came in handy after Gladden earned a church music degree from Westminster Choir College in Princeton in 1974.

"I started going around with some of the older guys in Philly who were in the business of repairing and tuning pipe organs," he says.

"Organ repair involves carpentry, electronics, metalwork, wiring, computers . . . and then there's the musical end of it," adds Gladden, who travels the country repairing and tuning pipe organs.

Beginning in the late 1970s, he also put his expertise to work as he began to expand and customize the St. Rose

"When I started, it had about 700 pipes and two keyboards," Gladden says.

The organ now has nearly 3,000 pipes - the tallest are 32 feet and the tiniest are "the size of a small pencil" - four

"I'm most proud of the fact that I took pipes from all over the place, including churches in Philadelphia that were being closed," he says. "I was able to make them sound like they all belong together."

A love of harmony also is evident in his careful selection of traditional and modern hymns for the four weekend Masses at which he plays.

"It's an eclectic mix of stuff," he says. "I try to keep everybody happy as much as possible."

Spiritual, as well as musical, satisfaction helps keep him happy after playing for more than half a century.

"I still feel the same way about the sound of the organ that I felt in the beginning," says Gladden, who has no plans to retire.

"I still feel that magnetism."



Stanfill Manor, located at 109 East Atlantic Avenue, will be the community stop on the Library House Tour, Friday, December 4. The Board and residents of adjacent Stanfill Towers will be hosts and will display a Christmas collection.

Offices on the second floor house the a newly created senior connection service, a community outreach project of the Haddon Heights Senior Citizens Corporation (HHSCC), owner and operator of Stanfill Towers, Stanfill Commons and Stanfill Manor. HHSCC is sponsored by seven of the churches in Haddon Heights.

HHSCC has dedicated funding for this program, which is similar to an ongoing service program offered exclusively to the residents of Stanfill Towers. The mission of this new service is to connect all senior citizens in the greater Haddon Heights community to local resources, support personnel and activities as an aid to independent
