From the Tax Office:

Tax Relief Programs

Homestead Benefit: A credit is issued towards your taxes if you meet the following requirements

- Your Haddon Heights home is your principal residence and you have owned your home since October 1, 2013; and
- Your 2013 property taxes were paid on said home; and
- You met the 2013 income requirements (2013 limits are currently not set, 2012 shown below)
 - \$150,000 for homeowners 65 or older or blind or disabled
 - \$75,000 for homeowners under 65 and not blind or disabled

*The 2012 Homestead Credit was issued on the May 2015 taxes

You can apply for the 2013 Homestead Credit by calling 1-877-658-2972

Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze):

This program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for property tax increases on their principal residence if you meet the following requirements

- You were 65 or older or receiving Federal Social Security disability benefits as of December 31, 2013; and
- You have lived in New Jersey continuously for at least 10 years, as a homeowner or renter; and
- You owned and lived in your current home for at least the last 3 years; and
- Property taxes were paid in full on your home; and
- Your total household income was
 - For 2013: \$84,289 or less; and
 - For 2014: \$85,553
- You can pick up the forms to file for the Senior Freeze at the Borough Hall and they must be submitted to the state by June 1, 2015.

Haddon Heights Post Office

Rose Fitzgerald and Joan Rossler attended 2015 National Lobby Day on March 3 during National Historic Preservation Advocacy Week to urge New Jersey legislators to support the Historic Preservation Fund in Fiscal Year 2016. They also visited the offices of Congressman Donald Norcross and Senator Cory Booker to urge them to protect the Haddon Heights Post Office from future closing. Haddon Heights' residents are also encouraged to write and support our local post office. Comments can also be posted on <https://postalexperience.com/Pos>.

A few years ago the National Trust National Trust for Historic Preservation named U. S. Offices as one of its "Eleven Most Endangered Historic Places," as the U.S. Postal Service identified nearly 4,400 post offices – large and small – that it plans to study for closure. For the time being our post office is safe. It is an integral part of our Main Street,

bringing residents and business people to Station Avenue daily.

The Haddon Heights Post Office contains a bas-relief sculpture, "The Letter," by Isamu Noguchi, one of the most significant American sculptors of the 20th century. It is one of the most important federal commissions by a world-renowned artist to grace a suburban post office. Installed in March 1939, the sculpture is a broad-faced full-figured woman who can be admired as a lyrical abstraction of gentle curves. "The Letter" remains in its original place in the Haddon Heights Post Office above the postmaster's door. Make sure to take notice of it the next time you visit.

Tree Survey Results and Request for Citizen Scientists



On Saturday, April 18 the Environmental Commission along with 20 volunteers from the Bonner Institute for Civic and Community Engagement at The College of New Jersey (TCNJ), surveyed 565 trees in about 40% of the Borough blocks. Trees were geo-located,

circumferences measured and heights estimated using smart phone apps and quick math. Many of the tree species still need to be confirmed, as the leaves were not out at the time of the survey.

Our plan is to complete the survey for the street trees from roughly 10th Avenue to the Black Horse Pike. JUNE and JULY will be focused on Blocks 66-127, including 10th Avenue, Bellmawr Avenue, Birch Street, Cedar Avenue, Chestnut Avenue, Chestnut Place, Eleventh Avenue, Guyer Avenue, High Street, Lake Street, Maple Avenue, Oak Avenue, Prospect Ridge Boulevard, South Park Avenue, Sycamore Street, Twelfth Avenue, and Walnut Avenue.

It's a great way to get some exercise as a family activity as well as meet some of your neighbors! 

Stanfill Manor

Seniors Social Service Coordinator

The owner of Stanfill Towers, the Haddon Heights Senior Citizen Housing Corporation (HHSCHC), is sponsored by seven of the churches in Haddon Heights, and opened Stanfill Towers in 1977. In 2006 HHSCHC purchased 26 units on the White Horse Pike (the DeMartini properties) and these buildings are called Stanfill Commons. Soon after, HHSCHC purchased the house at 109 East Atlantic, adjacent to Stanfill Towers. The rear portion of this property has been dedicated to additional needed parking. This Colonial Revival house with stone plinths and fence is a contributing building in the White Horse Pike Historic District and has been renovated to historic standards. It is now known as Stanfill Manor. The first floor will serve as a gathering place for up to 30 persons; the second floor is being repurposed for volunteer offices for an outreach service to the senior citizens of Haddon Heights.

Long term experience in the operation of Stanfill Towers has demonstrated that a significant resident need is met by the presence of an on-site Social Service Coordinator who assists residents with many social, medical, billing issues, etc. which in turn promotes a less stressful, healthier lifestyle. However, for the senior population living in Heights but not residing in Stanfill Towers, there is no such central resource. HHSCHC feels that the presence of "ready assistance" for seniors can in fact be exported to the larger senior community in Heights through the creation of a senior center utilizing volunteers with specific expertise in areas most needed by seniors.

To that purpose, Stanfill Manor will be a dedicated resource center for all Haddon Heights seniors. A part-time coordinator will be hired to train and manage volunteers to provide informational and referral services to seniors, such as: choices and filing for Social Security, Medicare; medical billing and issues; tax preparation; phone and data plans; utility bills, transportation issues; reverse mortgages; estate planning; finding qualified home maintenance personnel; homeowner and downsizing issues, etc.

HHSCHC will start up and fund the Stanfill Manor Senior Center for the benefit of all seniors living in Haddon Heights. Stanfill Manor Senior Center is anticipated to open in the late fall.

Glover Mill Village and Park Update

Construction has begun! The State of N.J. required that the County fence and overgrowth be removed. So, the new construction stands out, just like Kings Run stood out when it was being built eight years ago; Guyer Drive and South Park stood out in the 1960's, etc. Here is a photo of the farmland that used to be Eighth Avenue in 1900.

Everyone knows me as a preservationist but I am someone who has always been concerned about moving Heights forward. The key to attracting new residents, young and old, the key to survival for an "older inner ring suburbs" is having good schools and community services, fine athletic fields, nice shops on our Main Street, etc. In 2008 we had the opportunity to buy the vacant NJ Water properties - their garages and offices on East Atlantic and laboratory on Lippincott

Lane. These buildings gave the Borough a vastly improved Service Operations Facility and new Community Center/Senior Room. Parking at these sites along with the renovated Log Cabin has eased the parking situation at Seventh Avenue School and HHYA fields. The "smart growth" homes at Glover Mill will bring new tax revenue and a choice for Heights' residents who want new modern housing. The one-acre Glover Fulling Mill Park, for which we received a \$50,000 grant from the New Jersey Historic Trust, will stabilize and protect the mill remains and celebrate our colonial, Revolutionary War and early industrial history for all residents.

Work will begin on the Glover Fulling Mill Park in June, after Bob Meyer's people create the nearby retention pond. I hope you can look at this privately-funded construction going on and picture a tree-lined street with a park at the end of it. We have the drawings from landscape architects Menke & Menke for an herb garden in the Glover Fulling Mill Park; if anyone is interested in volunteering for this, please give me a call.

SECOND LIEUTENANT JOHN P. SHAW JR. was born in 1918. His father was a sergeant in the Haddon Heights NJ Police Department, and the family lived at 1937 Sycamore Street in Haddon Heights. John Shaw had attended Haddon Heights High School, and appears to have resided in Bergen County NJ, from where he enlisted in the Army in January of 1942. John Shaw spent some time in the cavalry at Fort Riley KS before qualifying for flight duty. He trained at Santa Ana CA, and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant on November 2, 1943 at Morley TX. In December of 1943 he was reported as being stationed at Mountain Home ID.

The 850th Bombardment Squadron (H) was activated October 11, 1943 at the Army Air Base, Mountain Home, Idaho. With it, were activated the Headquarters Detachment, 490 Bombardment Group (H), the 848th Bombardment Squadron (H), and the 849th Bombardment Squadron (H); and together with the parent 851st Bombardment Squadron (H)---formerly designated the Seventh Anti-Submarine Squadron---all became the subordinate units of the newly activated 490th Bombardment Group (H) at the Army Air Base, Mountain Home, Idaho. Second Lieutenant Shaw went overseas with this unit

In May of 1944 the 850th Bomber Squadron was re-assigned to the 801st Provisional Bomb Group (H). This unit was tasked with supporting OSS operations in occupied Europe.

The 801st Bomb Group appears to have been subsequently merged into the 492nd Bomb Group. Nicknamed the Carpetbaggers, this unit for the most part did not fly traditional bombing missions, instead this unit served as the first Special Operations group of the United States Army Air Force. At the peak of operations, in July of 1944, this group of approximately 3000 personnel, operating out of Station 179, Harrington, in the UK, with a small detachment at Leuchars, Scotland cooperated to

fly "Spies and Supplies" into Western Europe on an almost nightly basis, bad weather excepted. Millions of propaganda leaflets, thousands of guns, tons of supplies of all kinds, and hundreds of individual personnel, the specially trained "Jedburgh" teams, the larger O.S.S. "Operational Groups", were all flown into Occupied Europe by the flyers of the Group on forays unprotected by fighters or any other air cover in specially prepared B-24 bombers. Additionally, a small number of C-47 flights were flown which took in supplies and brought out agents and evaders from Allied forces.

John P. Shaw was killed when his plane went down after colliding with an RAF plane in a drop zone over Europe on July 18, 1944. He was 26 years old, and was survived by his parents.

COURIER-POST CAMDEN SATURDAY MARCH 3, 1945 MEDAL AWARDED TO MISSING FLIER

An Air Medal was awarded posthumously to 2nd Lieutenant John P. Shaw Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. John P. Shaw, of 1937 Sycamore Street, Haddon Heights. Operating a bomber B-24, over France, Lieutenant Shaw has been missing since last July.



The medal, presented to his mother, Mrs. Mary E. Shaw, was sent from New Castle Army base, at Wilmington DE, by direction of President Roosevelt, for meritorious achievements in accomplishing with distinction numerous aerial operational missions over enemy occupied Europe.

"The courage" the letter adds, "coolness and skill displayed by this officer in the face of determined opposition, materially aided in the successful completion of these missions." "His actions reflect general credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States."


different.





This children's event is an interactive adventure geared towards children ages 2 – 10. The children will even be part of the story! Children will meet and get to know all of the story time friends.





Improper Mulching Can Kill Your Trees!

It's that time of year when everyone wants to clean-out and freshen-up their garden beds. They like the "pleasing" look of mulch without the presence of leaves. Rather than rake up the leaves and put them out for the town to compost, consider using a mulching mower and leave the clippings on the lawn as fertilizer. Or, catch the clippings and use as free, beneficial mulch in your garden beds. It is more "earth-friendly". Don't like the look of shredded leaves? Put a thin layer of more attractive mulch on top of them.

There are many "green" benefits to applying mulch. Less fertilizer is needed since the mulch slowly decomposes, improving soil fertility. It also helps maintain soil moisture, decreasing the need for extra watering. Weeds are prevented from germinating and growing, so herbicides are not needed. Mulch keeps the soils cooler in summer and warmer in winter. Mulch also makes maintenance easier and helps prevent damage from mowers or string trimmers.

Unfortunately, there is a practice that the general public now thinks is the proper way to mulch around a tree or large shrub. It is referred to as "volcano mulching". We all have seen it, especially in shopping centers, apartment complexes and even on public property. With this type of mulching, the mulch is applied directly next to the trunk of the tree, often extending a foot or

more up the trunk. This kind of mulching is very dangerous to the tree and can actually kill it. It is among the leading cause of mortality in freshly planted trees. It makes the tree more susceptible to fungus, insects and rodents, particularly voles which eat the bark and roots. It also prevents water from reaching the root system of the tree. You can see an example of "volcano mulching" in the photo. Even landscapers are guilty of doing this. They want to please their customers who insist on it because they think it is the right way to mulch.



Proper "Donut" Mulching!

The correct way of mulching is called "donut mulching". A ring of mulch, generally advised to be about 3 inches deep, is put around the tree extending out as far, when possible, as the branches extend. Minimal mulch, a thin coating at most, is placed within about 3-4 inches of the trunk. Therefore the mulch closest to the trunk is in the shape of a donut.

Sustainable Haddon Heights encourages you to mulch properly. Do not follow the lead of your neighbors, family or friends. Be a leader and an educator and tell others - even a professional if you hire one - about the proper way to apply mulch. Your trees will thank you!





