

FROM THE TAX OFFICE...

The Fourth Quarter taxes are due by 11/01/14. There is a ten-day grace period. It is also a violation to place these items at the curb earlier than the day before This makes the last day to pay without penalty Monday, November 10th prior to scheduled pickup. Or in the case of leaves, the week before that pickup is posted. 5:00 pm.

Don't forget, if you use the drop box and are paying on the last day, your payment must be dropped off before 5:00 pm. LEAF PICK-UP

Fall is just around the corner. As the leaves start changing that means they will soon start falling. Leaf collection will begin on October 15th and run until December 15th. During November and December signs will be posted on your street advising when leaf collection will occur in your area.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Lawn Service Contractors MUST remove leaves from your property.
- Rake your leaves to the CURB. Please DO NOT place leaves in the street. Leaf piles in the street cause flooding and drainage problems during rainstorms.
- Please DO NOT place leaves closer than 10 feet from any storm sewer inlet.
- Please DO NOT mix leaves and brush. Your can(s) will NOT be collected if it is mixed. When the trucks are taken to be dumped the dump can and will refuse our trucks if there is anything mixed in that is not allowed to be. We thank you in advance for your

His son Marshall was born in 1914 and daughter Marguerite in 1918. His widow eventually sold the property for demolition so that the Haddon Knoll Apartments could be built. In an interview with Marshall Warrington in 2009,

Haddon Knolls has recently completed an extensive renovation project with new roofing and Colonial Revival porch entries. Although the apartments are not yet

listed as "contributing" to the White Horse Pike Historic District on the State and National Register because they were built in the 1950's, the new owners worked with the Preservation Commission on this project. 



Install smoke alarms adjacent to each bedroom and sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home, including your basement

- 2. Test your alarms monthly
- 3. Replace all smoke alarms over 10 years old.
- 4. A smoke detector should be on your ceiling or high on a wall. stove to reduce false activations.




