

# BOROUGH OF HADDON HEIGHTS REORGANIZATION MEETING MINUTES

Thursday, January 6, 2022, 7:00 pm ZOOM

Mayor Zachary Houck called the Reorganization Meeting to Order at 7 p.m.

## PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND MOMENT OF SILENCE:

Mayor Houck asked all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance. He then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **INVOCATION:**

Mayor Zachary Houck welcomed Reverend Eliza C. Jaremko of First Presbyterian Church to open with the invocation. Reverend Jaremko delivered the Invocation, giving thanks for bringing the citizens of Haddon Heights together and asked for blessings. Mayor Houck thanked Reverend Jaremko.

# **OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT STATEMENT:**

Mayor Houck read the following statement, "In accordance with Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, 1975, notice of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board designed for that purpose and notice was transmitted to the official newspapers on December 29, 2021."

Mayor Houck began by welcoming peers from council alongside the dignitaries present: Mayor Houck acknowledged dignitaries present: Senator Nilsa Cruz-Perez, Assemblyman William Spearman from the 5<sup>th</sup> legislative district and Camden County Commissioner Jeffrey Nash. Mayor Houck welcomed everyone who joined the meeting virtually and said that under normal circumstances, Reorganization would have been held in Borough Hall. Mayor stated that he is hopeful that we will return to meeting again in person in 2022 and getting back to a sense of normalcy.

# ADMINISTERING OF THE OATH OF OFFICE TO COUNCIL MEMBERS-ELECT:

Mayor Houck invited Councilwoman-elect Kathryn Russo and her family as well as the Honorable Senator Nilsa Cruz-Perez for administering the Oath of Office. Senator Cruz-Perez administered the Oath of Office to Councilwoman-elect Russo. Senator Cruz-Perez then congratulated Councilwoman Russo. Councilwoman Russo thanked Senator Cruz-Perez. Mayor Houck congratulated Councilwoman Russo and thanked the Senator.

Mayor Houck invited Councilman-elect Christopher Morgan and his family as well as the Honorable Assemblyman William Spearman for administering the Oath of Office. Assemblyman Spearman administered the Oath of Office to Councilman-elect Morgan. Following the Oath, Assemblyman Spearman congratulated Councilman Morgan. Mayor Houck thanked Assemblyman Spearman and congratulated Councilman Morgan.

# **ROLL CALL:**

Mayor Houck asked Clerk Santosusso for the roll call.

Under roll call the following were present: Councilmembers Morgan, Ottoson, Egbert, Philipps, Russo and Mayor Houck.

Also present were Solicitor Chris Long and Borough Clerk Kelly Santosusso.

Resolution 2021:01- Resolution Fulfilling the Vacancy on Council Pursuant to NJS 40A:16-4 Municipal Vacancy Law: Motion nominating Scott Schreiber to fill the vacancy was made by Councilwoman Egbert, seconded by Councilman Morgan. Under a roll call vote, all members voted yes.

OATH of OFFICE Mayor Houck invited Honorable Camden County Commissioner Jeffrey L. Nash to administer the oath of office to Councilman Scott Schreiber. Commissioner Nash administered the Oath thereby swearing in Councilman Schreiber. Councilman Schreiber thanked Council and thanked Commissioner Jeffrey L. Nash; stating that it was a great honor to be sworn in by him. Commissioner Nash stated explained he enjoys working with Councilman Schreiber every day and that he does a great job leading the CCMUA. He continued his praises, saying that Residents of Camden County are lucky and the residents of Haddon Heights (including his grandson) are lucky to have him as a Councilman.

Borough Clerk Kelly Santosusso reminded Mayor Houck that a roll call of full Council was required. Mayor Houck requested Roll Call. Under roll call, all members were present.

Mayor Houck opened the floor to the dignitaries present. Gina Marie Espinoza of Congressman Norcross's office greeted all attendees and thanked Mayor Houck for recognizing her, stating that the Congressman requested that she attend the meeting to thank all for their continued public service. She highlighted infrastructure, community and smart growth combined and with continuing focus she believes Council will do a great job for this community. She is excited and thanks all of Council as well as former Councilwoman Kurtz for her service. Honored to work with everyone on Council and thanked Michael Madden and the people of Haddon Heights. She went on to thanked dignitaries, especially while they were canvassing during election time. She again thanked Senator Nilsa Cruz-Perez for swearing her in. She thanked her Pastor Eliza Jaremko and our first responders for their immeasurable service. She recognized our educators for serving and the Board of Education. She concluded by thanking her husband, son for their support and her extended family for being present this evening. She said although 2021 has been a difficult year she is optimistic for the year ahead.

He looks forward and appreciates that he has the opportunity to serve a second term. Thanked Councilwoman Russo for being his running mate. Thanked the Haddon Heights Democratic Club. Her friendship, support and contributions to the Democratic Club are very much missed. Morgan thanked Mayor Houck and all of his colleagues who volunteer so much of their time. Thanked professionals and Borough staff. He expressed his appreciation to his wife Heather and their children who are his inspiration. He then described setting the stage for more tangible progress over the next couple of years. Mayor Houck thanked Councilman Morgan.

Councilman Schreiber thanked his peers for being selected to fill the vacancy on Council. He appreciates the support he has been shown and thanked his colleagues for their confidence in him. He thanked Cruz-Perez, Assemblyman Spearman and Commissioner Nash for the extraordinary work they do. He said he is so pleased to see Kathryn Russo, whom was already active on committees and volunteer work, to be elected into a position on Council. Thanked the staff especially to Clerk Kelly Santosusso; he is pleased to work for another year with Clerk Santosusso saying she is an asset to the town.

Councilman Ottoson said he is happy to see Councilman Morgan is back. He said that Councilwoman Russo's roots in the community and impressive background bring a lot to the table, he is thrilled to work with her. Thanked Councilman Scott Schreiber for his fascinating contributions and his knowledge of the inner workings of the government. Thanked everyone who works at the Borough and wished everyone a happy New Year.

Councilwoman Egbert welcomed Councilwoman Russo as she is so excited to work with her. She believes it will be great to work with her. Councilwoman Egbert thanked the residents of Haddon Heights. She mentions she did not expect to be virtual and that it is important in this life to appreciate where we are even when it is not where we expected to be. She looks forward to a great New Year and all of the things to come.
