

# BOROUGH OF HADDON HEIGHTS COUNCIL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, January 16, 2024 at 7:00 pm

Mayor Houck called the meeting to Order at 7:00 pm. He then read the following statement:

# SWEARING IN OF CAREER FIREFIGHTER Tyler Jackson

Mayor Houck invited the Directors of Public Safety, Councilmembers Philipps and Ottoson, Tyler Jackson and his family forward for administering the Oath of Office.

Chief Joseph Hales offered complimentary comments about Tyler Jackson and said he looks forward to a long time service career here. Mayor Houck said it is a pleasure to see a long-time resident and volunteer get the position. This is the direction Mayor and Council want to go in to foster relationships within the organization.

Mayor Houck asked for a two minute recess to allow for photos with the family and the Department.

Following the recess, Mayor Houck commenced the Business Meeting. He went on to thank the Fire Department for the volunteers who responded to the fire in town this past weekend which displaced a local family. He said the Department performed at their best and the response rendered to our residents is most appreciated by Mayor and Council.

### **COUNCILMEMBER REPORTS:**

Councilwoman Harron reported timeline for HHYA project of infield improvements at Fitzgerald Memorial Field. She went on to say Beginning plans for Memorial Day.

Councilwoman Russo thanked the Haddon Heights Fire Department for the quick response to the fire this past weekend – a tragedy that displaced a family. She said it has been nice to see the donations being made to the family. She went on to thank the Department of Public Works for their response to the storm and a downed tree in the snow event from yesterday.

Councilman Ottoson gave the Police Department report a copy of which is attached to these Minutes. Congratulations to Tyler Jackson and he has been a long-time volunteer. He thanked the Department of Public Works for the snow removal.

He went on to report the remediation at Devon Avenue has been delayed due to a last minute glitch with the questions from the state. He said we are working through that at present.

Council President Morgan had no report.

Councilwoman Philipps echoed congratulations to Tyler Jackson as well as the remarks about the Fire Department's response to the fire in town. She added that she and Council are grateful for our volunteers and our Department always. Philipps went on to thank the Department of Public Works for the recent snow clearing. She then gave the December Fire Department report as well as the 2023 year end statistics, copies of which are attached to these Minutes.

Philipps concluded by informing that Council is in the last stages of finalizing the extension of the Shared Services Agreement for Firefighter Services with the Borough of Barrington. Hoping to have on the next Agenda.

# Summary of new initiatives:

- **-Pizza with Police** (Brooklyn Pizza December 19<sup>th</sup> 6-8pm) Face painting, touch a truck, giveaways, special guest appearance and more!
- **-NATIONAL Night Out 2024** (August 6<sup>th</sup> at the Dell) All activities for kids including, face painting, touch a truck, popcorn, ice cream, pie eating contest, games, giveaways, and more!
- -Autism Spectrum Disorder/ and or all disabilities registry- The registry provides information to the Police Dept. in case of an emergency specifically about the registered person's emergency contacts, detailed physical descriptions, known routines, favorite attractions, and any other pertinent information that could help us if an emergency situation arises.
- **-GCPOP (Garnet Country Police Outreach Program)** is a program made up of Haddon Heights, Barrington, Lawnside, and Merchantville police officers, that meet/play sports/activities/etc., with students within our community to allow them to get to know us, answer any questions, and help them with any school or life event that they may need assistance with.

-PROJECT SAVE PROGRAM (Substance Abuse Visionary Effort) — is a strategy focused on not only arrest, but on practices and policies that involve prevention and intervention. This program also focuses on diverting defendants with a drug addiction disorder into treatment, and will ultimately reduce crime within the borough.

# **General Initiatives**

<u>Reminder</u> – HHPD would like to remind residents to please obey prohibited parking laws and ordinances around our schools, sports facilities, and recreational centers. Please obey all posted **NO PARKING** areas in order to allow for the safe passage of pedestrians and vehicular traffic.

## > Traffic -

- Pedestrian sign/signal upgrades in the area of the (Prospect/Glenview)
- KHY construction will be starting around Spring 2024 (County)
- Speed RADAR sign proposal in the area of (1600 block of Prospect Ridge Blvd. (completed)
- RADAR Enforcement increased / Radar sign deployed where potential speeding problems are reported. (Bellmawr and Maple)
- Officers have increased STOP intersection monitoring where potential violations have been reported.
- HHPD continues to work with the Department of Public Works and the County to identify intersections in need of yellow curbing and crosswalks to increase safety of students and pedestrians.

# > Haddon Heights Overnight Parking Request (ONLINE LINK)

- -Borough website online link <a href="https://haddonhts.com">https://haddonhts.com</a> (click on the overnight parking request and complete the requested information)
- -Overnight parking permission requests are valid for one night only.
- -The vehicle must be parked with the traffic flow.
- -The vehicle's gross weight must be less than 8,001 pounds.
- -The vehicle cannot be placed on the list if it is operable and there is room in the driveway.
- -You must give a valid reason why the vehicle is being left on the street.
- -Excessive requests, abuse, or not adhering to the policy may result in a summons.
- -In the event of snow or predicted snow, all on-street parking is prohibited.

# > Permit Parking

Residents who do not have room in their private driveway to park all their vehicles or tenants who do not have access to a parking area can apply for parking permits at the Borough Hall. After the application is completed, it is submitted for approval.

# **Permit Application Fees**

- \$25.00 per permit if there is no room on your property to construct or add onto your driveway according to current zoning laws
