**ORDINANCE 2024:1540**

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**BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE INSTALLATION AND IMPROVEMENTS OF VARIOUS SIDEWALKS IN THE BOROUGH OF HADDON HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$2,248,100 THEREFOR; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF HADDON HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$2,135,695; MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS AND COVENANTS; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING**

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**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Haddon Heights, County of Camden, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

**Section 1.** The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Haddon Heights, County of Camden, New Jersey ("Borough").

**Section 2.** It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the Borough from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$2,248,100;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$2,135,695; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$112,405 for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11*.

**Section 3.** The sum of \$2,135,695, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$112,405, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").

**Section 4.** The issuance of negotiable bonds of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$2,135,695 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.

**Section 5.** In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$2,135,695 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized

to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

**Section 6.** The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20*, shall not exceed the sum of \$612,000.

**Section 7.** The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the maximum amount obligations to be issued for each said purpose and the period of usefulness of each said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

**Section 8.** Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, including, but not limited to, a Safe Routes to School Program Grant heretofore approved from the New Jersey Department of Transportation in the amount of \$1,200,000, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance, the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

**Section 9.** The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10*, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43*, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$2,135,695 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

**Section 10.** The full faith and credit of the Borough are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the Borough shall levy *ad valorem* taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

**Section 11.** The applicable Capital Budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended applicable

Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and available for inspection.

**Section 12.** The Borough hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the Borough prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

**Section 13.** The Borough hereby covenants as follows:

(a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by the Bond Ordinance is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;

(b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;

(c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;

(d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and

(e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

**Section 14.** The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the Borough may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.


**Section 15.** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**Section 16.** In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

COUNCIL WORK SESSION MINUTES  
Tuesday, February 6, 2024, 7:00 pm

Mayor Houck called the meeting to Order at 7:00 pm. and then read the following statement:

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT STATEMENT:

“In accordance with Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, 1975, notice of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board designed for that purpose and notice was transmitted to the official newspapers provided by Resolution adopted January 6, 2024.” *Notice has also been posted on the Borough website.*

ROLL CALL:

Mayor Houck asked the Clerk for roll call.

Under roll call, Council President Morgan, Councilmembers Ottoson, Philipps, Russo and Pagan were present as well as Borough Solicitor Howard Long and Clerk Kelly Santosusso. Councilmember Harron was absent but excused.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Mayor Houck asked all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS ONLY:

Mayor Houck opened Public Comment on Caucus and Agenda items only.

Seeing no movement, Mayor Houck closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

CAUCUS WORK SESSION:

Animal Census

Clerk Santosusso advised Mayor and Council that our CFO has suggested the Borough conduct an animal census in the interest of public health and to increase animal licensing in the Borough which is required by state statute. Current education efforts a Free Rabies Clinic has not yielded the results we had hoped over the years. The Borough has engaged a new animal control company, New Jersey Animal Control who will conduct the census during the summer months. Uniformed animal control officers will go door to door, have I.D. as well as Borough issued I.D. Councilwoman Philipps inquired as to notification to residents. Santosusso responded that we will make notification in as many ways possible but definitely through the Borough website, the HEIGHTS REPORT, posting at the Library, Post Office, John’s Friendly Market and at Borough Hall. We will also announce on Caucus Agendas as we approach the start date.

Election Polling Locations

Clerk Santosusso addressed Council regarding two Polling Districts 6 & 7 which are currently at Glenview School. She mentioned she proposed several changes to come out of the schools on the East side of town several years back but were challenged on the West side of a town with ADA accessible locations or

options. Santosusso said after consulting with the Mayor and John Schmidt of the Camden County County Clerk's office, she is proposing the following: Move District 3, currently in the Community Center to the Cabin (*directly across the street from the Community Center*) and moving Districts 6 & 7 currently in Glenview School to the Community Center. The two districts would fit comfortably in the Community Center. She advised that this proposal would need to be approved by representatives of the Board of Elections. She further noted a meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 22<sup>nd</sup> for the locations to be assessed. Should the proposal be accepted, the decision would then go to the Board of Elections who meet monthly to officially approve. Councilman Pagan inquired as to why the proposal was being made. Santosusso said primarily for school safety and noted that several years back there was a push from the Camden County Board of Elections to do all possible to relocate polling locations out of the schools. Solicitor Howard Long reiterated that the Board of Elections seems to be in favor of coming out of the schools completely.

#### APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES of the January 6, 2024 Reorganization Meeting.

Mayor Houck asked for a motion to adopt the Minutes of the January 16, 2024 Business Meeting. Motion was moved by Councilmember Pagan, seconded by Councilmember Philipps. All members present were in favor.

#### APPROVAL OF EXECUTIVE SESSION MINUTES of the January 16, 2024 Business Meeting

Mayor Houck asked for a motion to approve the Executive Session Minutes of the January 16, 2024 Business Meeting. Motion was moved by Councilmember Philipps, seconded by Councilmember Russo. All members present were in favor.

#### BOROUGH ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Steve Bach, 304 White Horse Pike – submitted written report but will highlight the following: He noted we recently had a couple of very good successful Engineering meeting where much progress has been made. He thanked Councilmembers Russo and Morgan.

Local Recreation Improvement Grant – applications are due February 27<sup>th</sup>. We will be discussing the application later this meeting.

We have been successful in receiving a NJDOT \$260,000.00 grant for the continuation of St. Martins & Bryn Mawr Avenue to Prospect Ridge Blvd.

Camden County Open Space Grant for girls major and minor softball fields. Recreation meeting will be held to discuss exactly what the improvements are over the next week or so.

Devon Avenue sodding project will be taken off of subsequent reports as it has been completed.

Received 76,000 grant for all accessible equipment for Hoff's Park. Working with state contractors to try and maximize the grant and make it attractive – working with state contractors to maximize the grant.

Kings Highway Paving Project. Design complete looking for spring bid and award. Utility work will be completed. Camden County is looking to award this spring. Council President Morgan asked how long roads might be shut down. Bach said detour plans have not yet been established. He expects there will be detours as there will be significant excavations.

NJDOT project for St. Martins – we are expecting a spring bid on this project.

Community Development Block Grant – we are working with CFO for 2021 grant. ADA accessible improvements seem to be limited to additional handicapped ramps as we do not have qualified census tracts. Mayor asked can we use the grant for paving the cabin lot. Bach responded, no, handicapped parking spaces would be all that could be paid for, for such a small amount of paving, it would not be a good application to the County. Our best application will be for handicapped ramps.

Pedestrian improvements at Station and Atlantics will be removed for subsequent reports as project is substantially complete. County will be finishing up road markings.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

PUBLIC HEARING AND FINAL ADOPTION of Ordinance 2024:1538 – An Ordinance of the Borough of Haddon Heights, County of Camden, Adopting A Redevelopment Plan for Certain Property Within the Borough of Haddon Heights That Has Been Designated an Area In Need of Redevelopment – *St. Mary's*

Mayor Houck asked for a motion to open the Public Hearing on Ordinance 2024:1538. Motion was moved by Councilmember Philipps, seconded by Councilmember Pagan. Seeing no movement or comment, motion to close the Public Hearing was made by Councilmember Pagan and seconded by Councilmember Ottoson. All members present were in favor.

Councilmember Russo asked for the process following adoption of the Redevelopment Plan.

Mayor updated Council - after the Borough's plan for the site for a potential developer would enter into a redevelopment agreement for the site. Contract will mirror the redevelopment plan. Mayor advised we can negotiate certain terms in the Agreement. Redevelopment Agreement is like negotiating a contract. They must enter into an agreement. Without that, they cannot take advantage of the existing zoning.

Discussion ensued amongst Mayor Houck, Solicitor Long and Councilmembers Russo and Morgan. Council President Morgan asked for further clarification. Mayor explained that the current Memorandum of Understanding simply says we are negotiating in good faith with the current developer. He said any developer can take advantage of this. Morgan asked if the Planning Board, Historic Preservation Commission are restricted from making any requirement of the developer. Mayor responded no but that this governing body approves the plan and then they go through all regular processes of Planning Board or HPC. Engineer Steve Bach offered further insight.






